Sofia, le 17/29 Juillet, 1899.
Circulaire.

Le Ministère des Affaires Etrangères a l'honneur d'informer l'Agence diplomatique de Sa Majesté Britannique que, en base d'un avis du Conseil Médical Supérieur de la Principauté et en complément de l'ordonnance sub No. 179 du 22 Mai, a.c., le Département de l'Intérieur, par une ordonnance du 10 Juillet courant No. 274, a édicté les mesures sanitaires suivantes:—

1°. Les marchandises provenant de pays contaminés, transbordées sur des navires avec patente nette dans un port européen quelconque ou bien déchargées dans un port européen quelconque et chargées ensuite sur des navires ayant patente nette après avoir subi la quarantaine établi à Sulina, la désinfection par la vapeur et

recu libre entrée en Roumanie peuvent entrer aussi en Bulgarie par les ports du Danube.

2°. De pareilles marchandises devront être accompagnées de certificats de Sulina prouvant qu'elles ont subi la quarantaine établie et la désinfection. En outre, pour que ces marchandises puissent entrer dans la Principauté, elles devront être accompagnées de certificats prouvant qu'elles ont recu libre entrée dans toute la Roumanie; et

3°. Cette mesure concerne seulement ces sortes de marchandises qui peuvent être désinfectées par une désinfection à la vapeur.

Bye-Laws and Regulations under Sec. 46 of the Tramways Act 1870.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Corporation of West Hartlepool did, on the 1st day of August, 1899, make the following Bye-laws and Regulations.

Copy Bye-Laws.

1. For the purpose of these Bye-laws and Regulations, the term "car" shall mean any carriage using any tramway laid down within the said borough, and the terms "driver" and "conductor" shall respectively mean the driver and conductor or other person having charge of a car.

2. The driver of every car shall cause the same to be driven at a speed of not less than four miles an hour on the average, and not exceeding eight miles an hour.

3. The driver of every car shall so drive the same that it shall not follow a preceding car at a less distance than 100 yards.

4. Subject to the requirements of the Bye-laws Nos. 3 and 5, the driver or conductor of a car shall stop the same for the purpose of setting down or taking up passengers, at such points as shall from time to time be approved by the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses, such points to be indicated by notices affixed to the tramway posts along the line of route: Provided that nothing in this bye-law shall require a car to be stopped on any gradient steeper than 1 in 25.

5. Except at a passing place or terminus, no car shall be stopped at the intersection or junction of two or more streets or roads, nor within ten yards of a car on an adjoining line of rails.

6. The driver of a car, on coming in sight of a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road so as not to leave sufficient space for the car to pass, shall sound his bell or whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall, with reasonable despatch, cause such vehicle to be removed so as not to obstruct the car.

7. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on the tramways, nor shall any driver or conductor needlessly cause interruption to the ordinary road traffic.
