- (6.) The several other Authorities for the time

being whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being wholly situated within one or more of the said Unions, and whose Accounts are not subject to Audit by any other District Auditor.

- (7.) Such of the other Authorities whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be so audited, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being partly situated within one or more of the said Unions, as We may by Order under Seal hereafter prescribe.

ARTICLE II.—The said District Auditor shall audit the said Accounts according to the provisions of the several Statutes and of the Orders issued by competent authority, in force for the time being in that behalf, and shall perform all such duties and exercise all such powers in connection with the audit of such Accounts as are prescribed and conferred by the said Statutes and Orders.

ARTICLE III.—The District in which the said District Auditor shall, from and after the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred, act as Auditor, and which We hereby assign to him, in lieu of to the said Alfred Walker Dolby, for the performance of his duties under this Order, shall be termed "The Herefordshire and Monmouthshire Audit District," and shall, until We otherwise prescribe, comprise the area for the time being included in the several Poor Law Unions and Districts named in the Schedules to this Order, the District mentioned in paragraph (4) of Article I of this Order, the District or the area of jurisdiction of the Joint Committee referred to in paragraph (5) of that Article, and the Districts or areas subject to the jurisdiction of any such Authority as is mentioned in paragraph (7) of that Article.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Animals from the Argentine Republic or Uruguay Prohibited.*

1. Unless and until the Board otherwise order, it shall not be lawful to land any animal brought from the country of the Argentine Republic or from Uruguay, and the First Schedule (*Prohibited Countries and Parts of Countries*) to the Foreign Animals Order of 1896 shall be read and have effect as if those countries were included in the list of prohibited countries and parts of countries mentioned in that Schedule.

*Interpretation.*

2. In this Order terms have the same meaning as in the Foreign Animals Order of 1896.


