Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Levée, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be very distinctly written on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levée, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Rooms are requested to bring with them to the Drawing Room two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Ladies to be presented be very distinctly written on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

The number of Presentations at each Drawing

Room is limited to 200.

By the QUEEN. A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R. HEREAS certain portions of the territory known as the Crange Free State are in the occupation of Our Military Forces, and whereas it is necessary and desirable that the supply of goods, wares, and merchandise from Our Colonies of the Cape of Good Hope and Natal, to such portions of the Orange Free State should be permitted, now, therefore, We do hereby proclaim and direct that from and after the date hereof, and until further Proclamation, goods, wares, and merchandise may be supplied from Our Colonies of the Cape of Good Hope and Natal, or any part of such Colonies, to such portions of the territory known as the Orange Free State as may from time to time be defined, and under such Regulations as may from time to time be made by Proclamation or Government Notice issued by the Governor of each of Our said Colonies respectively.

Given at Our Court at Windsor, this lifteenth day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred, and in the sixtythird year of Our reign.

HE following Statutes, made on the sixteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred, by the Governing Body of Exeter College, Oxford, have been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of their baving been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

Amendments to the Statutes of Exeter College, Oxford, passed by a majority of two-thirds of the Governing Body of the College, at a meeting

specially summoned for the purpose.

That in Statute II § three line two of the passage beginning "The College Accounts shall be and ending "shall not include the Rector' shall be struck out, and the following words substituted :-

"He shall supervise the domestic management of the College, and the administration of the College Estates, and shall be responsible for the collection of all rents, tithes, fines, and other payments due to the College. The Rector shall from time to time visit all the College Estates, and shall report on them to the College at least once in every two years at one of the stated general meetings of the Rector and Fellows."

That in Statute V § four line ten after the words "If any Scholar" shall be inserted the

words "shall marry or shall."

That in the same Statute, in the subdivision entitled "King Charles the First's Trust" the following amendments shall be made, viz.:-

In clause two the words from "and the value" down to the end of the clause shall be struck out, and the words "always maintained" shall be substituted for them.

In clause three line two for "persons" shall be substituted "British Subjects."

In clause four at the end of the clause shall be inserted the words:-

"Subject to the provisions for a combined examination specified above, it shall be lawful for the Rector and Fellows, if the income from the endowment allow, to award further Exhibitions on this Foundation on such conditions as they shall from time to time determine."

After clause four, as amended, shall be inserted a new clause five :-

"The annual value of each Scholarship that shall be awarded after an examination held in combination with Jesus and Pembroke Colleges shall be one hundred pounds, and the annual value of each Exhibition that shall be similarly awarded shall be not less than fifty pounds. Exhibitions that shall be awarded without holding an examination in combination with Jesus and Pembroke Colleges shall be of such annual value not exceeding one hundred pounds as the Rector and Fellows shall from time to time determine. But in every case it shall be lawful for the Rector and Fellows to increase the annual value of a Scholarship or Exhibition beyond the sum of one hundred pounds, or to make a special grant to a Scholar or Exhibitioner in addition to the annual stipend of his Scholarship or Exhibition, if, after election, he shall be proved to their satisfaction to require and deserve further assistance at the University."

In clause five (which now becomes clause six)

ships on this Foundation shall not be limited in respect of age. With this exception"

In the same clause line three shall be omitted

the word "age."

In clause six (now clause seven) line one after the word "Scholarship" shall be inserted the words "or Exhibition."

In the same clause line three after "present himself" the words "the Scholarship shall be declared" shall be struck out, and there shall be substituted the words "or if such candidates present themselves, and the electors shall not judge any one to be of sufficient merit for election as Scholar or Exhibitioner, it shall be lawful for the Rector and Fellows to declare the Scholarship or Exhibition."

In the same clause line four the words from "But if such" down to the words "open for that turn" shall be struck out. and there shall be substituted the words "A King Charles the First's Scholarship when thrown open shall be subject to the same regulations in respect of value as the Foundation Scholarships."

In the same clause line twelve the words "If there be no candidate of sufficient merit for an Exhibition, the Rector and Fellows shall suspend such Exhibition and" shall be struck out, and there shall be substituted the words "If at any time the Rector and Fellows shall suspend a Scholarship or Exhibition, they shall."

After clause six (now clause seven) shall be inserted a new clause:—

"8. Provided that a sum of not less than two hundred and fifty pounds annually be reserved for the above-mentioned Scholarships and Exhibitions, it shall be lawful for the Rector and Fellows from time to time to establish and award Senior Scholarships on King Charles the First's Foundation. Such Senior Scholarships shall be limited to unmarried British Subjects born in Jersey or Guernsey, or in one of the islands adjacent to them, or educated either at Victoria College in Jersey, or at Elizabeth College in Guernsey for at least two years between the ages of fifteen and nine een, who have passed all the examinations required for the degree of Bachelor of Arts in the University of Oxford, or are Students reading for the degree of Bachelor of Civil Law or of Science or of Letters in the University of Oxford.

"Such Senior Scholarships shall not exceed one hundred and fifty pounds in annual value, and shall be tenable for not more than two years in the first instance. But it shall be lawful for the Rector and Fellows, if they think fit, to re-elect a Senior Scholar annually, provided that the whole period of the tenure of his Scholarship shall not exceed five years from the date of his first The Rector and Fellows shall at the election. time of the election or re-election of a Senior Scholar prescribe the conditions under which his Scholarship shall be held. If a Senior Scholar shall marry, or be elected to another Scholarship, or to a Fellowship, in any College of the University, or shall be guilty of grave misconduct, or shall fail to conform to the conditions under which his Scholarship is held, the Rector and Fellows shall have the power of depriving him of his Scholarship without any right of appeal."

That at the end of Statute V another subdivision shall be added as follows:—

"The Senior Scholars.

"It shall be lawful for the Rector and Fellows from time to time, if the state of the revenues permit, to establish Senior Scholarships, which shall be open to members of the University under twenty-five years of age who have taken or are qualified to take the degree of Bachelor of Arts, and produce satisfactory testimonials of moral character, and are unmarried, and have been, or shall within three months of their election be, accepted by the University as candidates for a research degree, and who shall conform to any other conditions which the Rector and Fellows may deem fit at the time of their election to prescribe. Notice of such Scholarships shall be given by the Rector or, in his absence, by the Sub-Rector in the way which in his judgment will best secure publicity. The election may be made with or without examination of the candidates as the Rector and Fellows shall from time to time determine. Senior Scholarships shall be of the annual value of one hundred pounds, and shall be tenable for two years from the date of election and shall then determine. A S-nior Scholar shall not be re-eligible. If a Senior Scholar shall be elected to another Scholarship or to a Fellowship in any College of the University, or shall marry, or shall be guilty of grave misconduct, or if the Rector and Fellows shall be dissatisfied with his diligence and progress in study, or if he shall fail to comply with any special conditions prescribed for the tenure of his Scholarship, the College shall have the power of depriving him of his Scholarship without any right of appeal."

The College Seal was ordered to be affixed to the above amendments at a meeting of the Rector and Fellows being the Governing Body of the College held on the sixteenth day of March, 1900.

THE following Statute, made on the twenty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred, by the Governing Body of New College, Oxford, and sealed on the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand nine hundred, has been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

STATUTE to alter and amend the Statutes framed by the Commissioners appointed under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, 40 and 41, Vict. cap. 48, and approved by the Queen in Council on the third day of May one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two in relation to New College in the University of Oxford, in the matter of Residence of Probationer Fellows, such amending Statute being duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose, held on the twenty-first day of March one thousand nine hundred and passed by the unanimous votes of those present and voting.

For Statute III, clause 18, to substitute the following:—"18. Subject to the exceptions here inafter mentioned, every person elected to an Ordinary Fellowship shall remain a Probationer Fellow for one year from the day of his election, and until he shall have been resident in the University for three Terms after his election; Easter and Trinity Terms being counted for this purpose as one Term.

"Residence in each Term shall for the purposes of this clause mean pernoctation during forty-two nights of Full Term: and the whole of the residence required shall be completed in the first

year after election unless the Warden and Fellows shall give leave to the contrary. Such leave shall not extend the period within which the residence of a Probationer Fellow is to be completed beyond two years from the date of election; and at the expiration of one year, or such extended period as the Warden and Fellows have sanctioned, if his residence be not completed, his Fellowship shall ipso facto become vacant.

"Provided always that the Warden and Fellows at a stated General Meeting may, if they shall think fit, dispense with any part of such residence upon such conditions as may be laid down in the

Bye-laws.

"A Probationer Fellow shall not be entitled to take any part in the government of the College, or the administration of its property, but shall receive the same emoluments as if he were an Actual Fellow.

"As soon as possible after both his residence is completed and his year of probation is expired, he shall if found fit in the judgment of the Warden and Fellows, be admitted an Actual Fellow of the College. If he shall be found unfit, his Fellowship shall thereupon become vacant."

THE following Statute, made on the twelfth day of March, one thousand nine hundred, by the Governing Body of Pembroke College, Oxford, has been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

A STATUTE made by the Master and Fellows of Pembroke College, Oxford, in amendment of the Statutes made under the Universities of

Oxford and Cambridge Act of 1877.

Whereas by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act of 1877, 40 and 41 Victoria, c. 48, sections 54 and 55, it is enacted that a Statute made by the Commissioners for a College shall be subject to alteration from time to time by Statute made by the College under this Act, the same being passed at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the College, specially summoned for this purpose, by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting; and further that every such alteration of Statute shall be submitted to the Queen in Council, and be proceeded on and have effect as if it were a Statute made by the Commissioners.

Now therefore, we, the Master and Fellows of Pembroke College, in the University of Oxford, being the Governing Body of the said College, and being this day assembled in a General Meeting specially summoned for the purpose, after due notice given of the business to be transacted thereat, do, by the votes of all the persons present and voting, enact as follows, that is to say:—

In the Schedule, clause 2, after the words "two Exhibitions" we strike out the remaining words of the clause.

And in clause 3, after the word "Foundation" we strike out the remaining words of the clause.

And in clause 4 we strike out the word

"persons" and in lieu thereof we substitute the words "British subjects."

And at the end of clause 5 we add these words:—"Subject to the above provisions for a combined examination, it shall be lawful for the Master and Fellows, if the income from the endowment allow, to award further Exhibitions on King Charles the First's Foundation without such combined examination, and on such conditions as they shall from time to time determine."

And instead of clause 7, which we strike out, we substitute the three following clauses:—

7. The annual value of a King Charles the First's Scholarship shall be one hundred pounds, and of an Exhibition not less than fifty pounds.

But the Master and Fellows may increase the value of any Scholarship or Exhibition beyond the sum of one hundred pounds annually, in cases where the Scholarship or Exhibition has not been thrown open and where the recipient satisfies them that he requires and deserves further assistance at the University.

Such increase may be for one year or more and

may in special cases be retrospective.

The annual value of Bishop Morley's Scholarship shall be not less than eighty pounds as the income of the Foundation shall allow and as the Master and Fellows shall from time to time determine.

8. When a King Charles the First's Scholarship, not being a Graduate Scholarship, or when an Exhibition or a Bishop Morley's Scholarship shall be vacant and no candidate shall offer himself qualified under clause 4 and deemed after examination by the Electors of sufficient merit for election, such Scholarship or Exhibition shall be thrown open for that turn.

9. Provided that a sum of two hundred and fifty pounds annually be reserved for the above-mentioned King Charles the First's Scholarships and Exhibitions, the Master and Fellows may award Graduate Scholarships on King Charles the First's Foundation to unmarried male British subjects born in Jersey or Guernsey, or in one of the Islands adjacent to them, or educated at Victoria College, Jersey, or at Elizabeth College, Guernsey, for two out of the three years last preceding their matriculation, who have either passed all examinations for the B.A. degree at Oxford or who have graduated in any University of the British Empire.

Such Scholars may be elected with or without examination, and upon such conditions as to work or research, or willingness to take work as a Lecturer or an officer of the College as the Master and Fellows may prescribe.

Such Graduate Scholarship shall not exceed one hundred and fifty pounds in annual value and shall be tenable in the first instance for two years.

But the Master and Fellows may re-elect such Scholar annually so that the whole of his tenure shall not last beyond five years.

Such Graduate Scholarship shall be vacated on marriage, or on acceptance of a similar Scholarship or a Fellowship at another College, or upon grave misconduct, or upon a resolution by the Master and Fellows that the conditions of tenure have not been complied with; and from their decision there shall be no appeal.

THE following Statutes, made on the sixteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred, by the Governing Body of Jesus College, Oxford, have been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":-

Statutes to alter and amend the Statutes framed by the Commissioners appointed under "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, 40 and 41 Victoria cap. 48, and approved by the Queen in Council on the third day of May one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two in relation to Jesus College in the University of Oxford, in particular the schedule relating to King Charles the First's Trust, such amending Statutes being duly made at a general meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose held on the sixteenth day of March one thousand nine hundred, and passed by the unanimous vote of those present and voting, in accordance with section 54 of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877.

Clause 2, line 5. For £80 read £100.

Add to clause 2. "In the case of any Scholar or Exhibitioner who after entering the College shall be proved to require and deserve further assistance at the University, the Principal and Fellows shall have power to increase the value of his Scholarship or Exhibition beyond the sums hereinbefore mentioned.

"If at the expiration of two years from the day of admission of a King Charles the First's Scholar or Exhibitioner, the Principal and Fellows are not sufficiently satisfied with the industry and good conduct of such Scholar or Exhibitioner to renew the tenure of his Scholarship or Exhibiti n for a further term of two years, they shall have power to make for him such provision as they shall see fit out of the amount receivable by the College on account of the Foundation of King Charles the First, and applied to the maintenance of King Charles the First's Scholarships and Exhibitions.

Clause 4, line 18. Omit "but they shall employ the emoluments of any vacant or suspended Scholarship, &c." to the end of clause 4.

Clause 5. Omit the existing clause, and read :-"Whenever a King Charles the First's Scholarship or Exhibition shall be vacant, if no candidate shall offer himself duly qualified according to clause 3, or if such candidates shall offer themselves, and the electors shall not consider any one of them to be of sufficient merit for election as Scholar or Exhibitioner, the Scholarship or Exhibition shall be thrown open for that turn under the same regulations as apply to the Open Foundation Scholarships and Exhibitions, provided that the value of a Scholarship when so thrown open shall not exceed £80 per annum."

Clause 8. Add a new clause, and read:—
"The Principal and Fellows may out of the amount receivable by the College on account of - the Foundation of King Charles the First, and applied to the maintenance of King Charles the First's Scholarships and Exhibitions, elect to a Graduate or Senior Scholarship, not exceeding in value £150 per annum, any person who was born in Jersey or Guernsey or in one of the islands adjacent to them or was educated either at Victoria College in Jersey or at Elizabeth College in Guernsey for at least two out of the three years next preceding his matriculation or who at the time of his leaving school was eligible for a King Charles the First's Scholarship, and who

s also qualified for the degree of Bachelor of Arts in the University of Oxford, or is a student reading for the degree of Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Letters in the University of Oxford. Such Scholarship shall be tenable in the first instance for two years, but the Principal and Fellows shall have power to renew the same for further periods, provided that the tenure of such Scholarship shall in no case exceed five years in all from the day of election. But no such Scholarship shall be awarded unless the amount devoted to Scholarships and Exhibitions tenable by Undergraduates as provided in clause 2 shall reach the sum of at least £250 per annum. The Principal and Fellows shall prescribe the conditions under which such Scholarship shall be held, and if a person holding such Scholarship shall be guilty of grave misconduct or shall fail to conform to the conditions under which his Scholarship is held, the Principal and Fellows shall have power to deprive him of such Scholarship without any right of appeal. In all cases such Scholar-ship shall be vacated on marriage."
