In consequence of Hull having been proclaimed infected with the plague, all vessels coming from Hull, or which, during their voyage, have touched at that place, must in Netherlands India remain without communication with the shore and with other vessels, until ten days have elapsed since leaving Hull, or if the plague has appeared on board since leaving Hull until ten days after the termination of the last case of illness on board has elapsed.

Furthermore, for a time, in Netherlands India, the importation of carpets and used embroidery, unless they are conveyed as luggage, or in consequence of change of domicile, of rags, raw wool and hair, of sacks which have been used, brushes and human hair, of untanned hides (including those which have been salted or treated with arsenicum), of fresh animal offal, of hoofs of oxen, &c., and hoofs and manes of horses, coming from Hull or transhipped at that place, is prohibited.

Notice regarding Sanitary Regulations concerning the Plague at Smyrna.

According to information received, Smyrna must be considered to be infected with the plague. Consequently the regulations in sections 26-35, concerning plague, in the Notice from the Ministry of Justice, No. 104, of the 14th of May of last year, come into force with regard to the above-mentioned place.

The further import from Smyrna of the articles mentioned in the aforesaid notice, section 38, is prohibited (subject to the exceptions therein mentioned), and in accordance with section 39 of the said notice disinfection of used clothing and bedding arriving from Smyrna, the import of which is not forbidden by section 38, is obligatory.

a. The regulations in sections 13-21 and 24 concerning Asiatic cholera in the above-mentioned notice of the 14th of May of last year apply to the following places :—

1. Red Sea ports.
2. Egyptian ports.
3. Ports in Tonquin and Cochin China as well

as East India, including the Dutch East Indian Colonies.

b. The regulations in sections 26-35 and 38 concerning the plague in the above-mentioned notice of the 14th of May last apply to Smyrna.

Used clothing and bedding of which the import, in conformity with the above-mentioned regulations in sections 24 and 38 of the circular of the 14th May last, is not forbidden, may, however, only be imported from the above-mentioned place after being properly disinfected under public control.

This notice comes into force forthwith.

KENT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER
OF 1901.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

Movement into out of or within Scheduled District.

1. No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be landed in, or moved into or out of, the District described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along over or across a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked or rebooked within such District.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

2. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

3.—(1.) If an animal is landed in contravention of this Order, the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which it is landed, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the landing, and the person landing the same, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been landed in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) If any person with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows a head of cattle or a sheep or goat or pig to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the KENT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1901.

No vessel will be permitted to anchor in the Channel south of the Ryde Middle, and northward of a line drawn from Old Castle Point Buoy, through the red conical buoys marking the edges of the Peel and Mother Banks, to the West Buoy of the Sturbridge Shoal, or between the lines of the British and Foreign war ships.

3. No vessel will be allowed to be under way within the above limits, or within the seaward boundary of the harbour of Portsmouth (as defined by the Order in Council of 26th February, 1897), after the Procession has left Trinity Pier, Cowes, and during the passage to Portsmouth.

4. On the Royal Yacht passing the Spit Buoy, all traffic in the harbour of Portsmouth will be suspended until the yacht is berthed.

5. In order to reduce as far as possible the chances of collision, directors of steamship companies, owners of steam vessels, yachts, &c., are earnestly requested to give directions to the masters of their ships to follow closely the instructions herein laid down, and to pay implicit attention to the requests of the Officers of the patrol tugs and boats who will be specially charged with the duty of keeping clear the ground.

In the crowded condition of Spithead navigation must be conducted with the greatest caution, and sailing-vessels and small craft must remember that large steamers will not always be able to give way to them.

6. While the fleet is at Spithead all vessels within the limits of the port when altering course or stopping, are to make use of the sound signals mentioned in clause 28 of the Regulations for the Prevention of Collisions, viz. :—

When altering course to starboard, one short blast.

When altering course to port, two short blasts.

When engines are going astern, three short blasts.

7. All vessels over 150 feet in length, anchored at Spithead, are to exhibit a white light from the stern at a height of not less than 15 feet lower than the ordinary anchor light forward.

8. Masters of vessels under way after sunset are reminded of the necessity of having in readiness a lantern to wave at the stern to an overtaking ship.

9. During the time the fleet is moored in the above-named positions, large steamers passing through Spithead should pass north of the Ryde Middle and of the ships of war in line and proceed at a moderate speed.
