HE King has been graciously pleased to approve and ordain the following Special Statute of the Most Eminent Order of the Indian

EDWARD THE SEVENTH, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, and Sovereign of the Most Eminent Order of the Indian Empire: To all to whom these pre-

sents shall come; Greeting!
Whereas, by virtue of the power in Us vested under certain Leiters Patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date respectively the second day of August, one thousand eight hundred. and eighty-six, and the tenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, and in the Statutes of the Order made for the Government of the Most Eminent Order of the Indian Empire, We deem it expedient, without permanently increasing the number of the Ordinary Members of the Order, to provide for the admission into the First, Second, and Third Classes of the Order of such persons as have rendered to us special and important Services: We, therefore, in pursuance and in exercise of the power so vested in Us, do make, ordain, and establish by these presents, sealed with the Seal of the said Order, the following Statute and Ordinances, namely :

It is ordained that the persons whom We may think fit to admit into the First, Second, and Third Classes of the said Most Eminent Order of the Indian Empire in consideration of their services rendered during the recent military operations in South Africa and China, shall be Additional Members of the said Classes, and shall not, now or hereafter, be included within the number of the. Ordinary Members allotted to such Classes.

It is ordained that the Additional Members so to be appointed shall have rank and precedence among the Ordinary Members of their respective Classes, according to the dates of their respective appointments, and that the Statutes of Our said Order shall in all matters and things apply in the same manner to the said Additional Members as to the Ordinary Members of Our said Most Eminent Order, any Statute, Decree or usage to the contrary notwithstanding.

And it is Our Will and Pleasure that this

Statute, sealed with the Seal of Our said Order, shall be taken and received as part and parcel of

the Statutes thereof.
