EDWARD, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India.

To all whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Empress of India, of Blessed Memory, did by Warrant under Her Royal Sign Manual, bearing date the 10th April, 1900, in the sixty-third year of Her reign, institute and create a decoration designated "The Kaisar-i-Hind Medal for Public Service in India," and did make certain Rules and Ordinances for the Government of the same.

And whereas by the said Warrant power was reserved to Us of annulling and altering the said Rules and Ordinances or any part thereof by a notification under Our Royal Sign Manual.

And whereas We desire to make certain alterations and amendments in the said Rules and

Now We are graciously pleased to make the following alterations and amendments in the said Rules and Ordinances, that is to say:—

1. In the Fourth Rule the words "by Warrant under Our Royal Sign Manual, and countersigned by one of Our Principal Secretaries of State," shall be omitted.

2. For the Sixth Rule the following shall be ubstituted, "Sixthly—It is ordained that the

Medal shall consist of an oval-shaped Badge or Decoration in gold for the First Class, and in silver for the Second Class, with the Royal Cipher of Ourselves, Our Heirs and Successors in the centre on one side, and on the reverse the words 'Kaisar-i-Hind for Public Service in India,' and that it shall be suspended on the left breast by a dark blue ribbon."

Given at Our Court at Saint James's this eighth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and one, and in the first year of Our reign.

annually held on the 14th March, 14th April, and 11th December, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that such Fairs should in future be held on the 16th March and the 21st May, and if either of those dates happens to fall on a Sunday, on the Saturday preceding, respectively, and that the Fair now held on the 11th December should be held on the Thursday before the second Friday in December.

# ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 28TH AUGUST 1901.)

(SWINE-FEVER ORDER OF 1901.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Cleansing and Disinfection of Lairs, &c., used for Swine.

1.—(1.) Any building, shed, outhouse, yard, sty, or other place used for the temporary keeping or detention of swine prior or subsequent to their being exposed for sale in or at a market, fair, sale-yard, place of exhibition, or other place, public or private, where swine are commonly exposed for sale, shall be cleansed and disinfected in manner provided by this Article by and at the expense of the occupier thereof once at least in every seven days, if the place has been used for swine during such period, and also at any time forthwith upon the receipt of a Notice in writing signed by an Inspector of the Board of Agriculture or of the Local Authority requiring such cleansing and disinfection, provided that this Article shall only extend and apply to the parts of a building, shed, outhouse, yard, sty, or other place with which a pig or its droppings have come in contact.

(2.) Any part of a place required by this Article to be cleansed and disinfected shall be cleansed and disinfected in manner following:

- (i.) The part shall be scraped and, where necessary, swept, and the scrapings and sweepings and all dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter shall be effectually removed therefrom; then
- (ii.) The part shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water; then
- (iii.) A coating of limewash shall be applied thereto.
- (3.) The scrapings and sweepings, and the dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter removed under this Article shall forthwith be well mixed with quicklime and be effectually removed from contact with swine.

# Cleansing and Disinfection of Pig-Dealers' Premises,

2. The provisions of the preceding Article shall also apply to any building, shed, outhouse, yard, sty, or other place occupied by a pig-dealer, and used by him for the keeping or detention of swine in connection with his trade or business of a pig-dealer.

Cleansing and Disinfection of Vehicles used by Pig-Dealers for Swine.

3. The floor of any van, cart, or other vehicle used by a pig-dealer in connection with his trade of business of a pig-dealer for the conveyance of swine along any highway or thoroughfare and all other parts thereof with which any pig or its droppings have come in contact shall be cleansed and disinfected in manner provided by this Order by and at the expense of the person using the same for such purpose as soon as practicable after such use and before being again used for such purpose, and also at any time forthwith upon the receipt of a Notice in writing signed by an Inspector of the Board of Agriculture or of the Local Authority requiring such cleansing and disinfection.

Cleansing and Disinfection of Crates, &c., used by
Pia-Dealers for Conveyance of Swine.

Pig-Dealers for Conveyance of Swine.

4. Any crate, box, hamper, net, rope, or other thing used by a pig-dealer in connection with his trade or business of a pig-dealer for the conveyance of swine along any highway or thoroughfare or on a railway shall be cleansed and disinfected in manner provided by this Order by and at the expense of the person using the same for such purpose as soon as practicable after such use and before being again used for such purpose, and also at any time forthwith upon the receipt of a Notice in writing signed by an Inspector of the Board of Agriculture or of the Local Authority requiring such cleansing and disinfection.

Manner of Cleansing and Disinfection of Vehicles, Crutes, &c.

5.—(1.) Any part of a vehicle or other thing required by this Order to be cleansed and disinfected shall be cleansed and disinfected in manner following:

(i.) The vehicle, or thing shall, if the nature thereof so permit, be scraped and, where necessary, swept, and the scrapings and sweepings and all dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter shall be effectually removed therefrom; then

(ii.) The vehicle, or thing shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water;

(iii.) A coating of limewash, or of a solution of carbolic acid consisting of one part of carbolic acid and twenty parts of water, shall be applied thereto.

(2.) The scrapings and sweepings, and the dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter removed under this Article shall forthwith be well mixed with quicklime and be effectually removed from contact with swipe.

Powers of Local Authority in case of default.
6.—(1.) If any person fails to cleanse and disinfect any building, shed, outhouse, yard, sty, or other place, or any van, cart, or other vehicle, or any crate, box, hamper, net, rope, or other thing, in accordance with this Order, it shall be lawful for the Local Authority, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for such failure, to cause such building, shed, outhouse, yard, sty, or other place, or such van, cart, or other vehicle, or such crate, box, hamper, net, rope, or other thing to be cleansed and disinfected in the manner provided by this Order, and to recover summarily the expenses of such cleansing and disinfection from the person in default.

(2.) The owner and occupier and person in charge of any place, vehicle, or thing to which this Article applies, shall give all reasonable facilities to the Local Authority for the carrying out of the provisions of this Article.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

The provisions of this Order, except where.
 it is otherwise provided, shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

8. Any person failing to comply with the provisions of this Order shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Definition of "Pig-Dealer."

9. The expression "pig-dealer" in this Order means a person habitually engaged in the trade or business of selling swine (other than swine bred by him) but does not include a person who as auctioneer sells swine which are the property of another person.

Existing Regulations.

10. If the provisions of this Order conflict with the provisions of any Regulations as to cleansing and disinfection made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board of Agriculture the provisions of this Order shall prevail, but, except as aforesaid, this Order shall not affect any such Regulations.

Commencement.

11. This Order shall come into operation on the fourteenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and one.

Short Title.

12. This Order may be cited as the Swine-Fever Order of 1901.

The limits of the Swine-Fever Infected Area declared by Order of the Board, dated the twenty-seventh day of May, one thousand nine hundred and one, are hereby contracted so as to comprise only the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Area so described is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order declared to be an area infected with swine-fever for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the second day of September, one thousand nine hundred and one.

THE London County Council hereby gives notice, that it has, with the approval of the Board of Trade, made the following Bye-laws under section 214 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, relating to sermen's lodginghouses, and that such Bye-laws will come into force on 1st October, 1901.

London County Council. Merchant Shipping Act, 1894. Bye-laws as to Seamen's Lodging-Houses. WHEREAS, by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is enacted as follows:-

> PART II. Masters and Seamen. Protection of Seamen from Imposition. Section 214.

(1.) A local authority herein fter mentioned whose district includes a seaport may, with the approval of the Board of Trade, make Bye-laws relating to seamen's lodging-houses in their district, and those Bye-laws shall be binding upon all persons keeping houses in which seamen are lodged and upon the owners thereof and persons employed therein.

(2.) The Bye-laws shall, amongst other things, provide-

For the licensing, inspection, and sanitary conditions of seamen's lodging-houses;

For the publication of the fact of a house being licensed:

For the due execution of the Bye-laws;

For preventing the obstruction of persons engaged in securing that execution;

For the preventing of persons not duly licensed holding themselves out as keeping or purporting to keep licensed houses; and

For the exclusion from licensed houses of persons of improper character.

And shall impose sufficient fines not exceeding fifty pounds for the breach of any Bye-law.

(7.) In this section the expression "local authority" means in the administrative county of London the County Council . . . and the expression "district" means the area under the authority of such local authority.

The London County Council, being the local authority in and for the administrative county of London, do hereby, at meetings of the Council held on the 13th day of June and 23rd day of July, 1901, make the following Bye-laws relating to seamen's lodging-houses in the said county:-

Application of Bye-laws.

Note. - Thes: Bye-laws shall not apply to the lodging or boarding of seamen in any house or lodging; not ordinarily used as a seamen's lo lginghouse, or as a house in which scamen are ordinarily lodged.

Interpretation of Terms.

1. In the construction of the following Byelaws, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say-

"The Council" means the said London County

Council.

"The county" means the administrative county

"The district" means the district of the sani-

tary au hority.
"Seaman" means any male person other than the holder of a certificate of competency or service as master, mate, or engineer, in the Merchant Service who, within four weeks immediately preceding the date of any transaction or occurrence within the scope of these Bye-laws, has been employed in any capacity whatsoever on board a ship, whether British or foreign, but shall not include a person engaged upon a fishing boat or trawl boat.

"Licence" means a licence granted or which may be granted by the Council in pursuance of these Bye-laws to a person authorizing him to keep the house specified therein as a seamen's lodging-house.

"Licensed keeper" means a person to whom a licence has been granted in pursuance of these Bye-laws. "Keeper" means and includes both a licensed keeper and a person who keeps a seamen's lodging-house or a house in which seamen are lodged to whom a licence has not been granted in pursuance of these Bye-laws.

"Licensed house" means a seamen's lodginghouse in respect of which a licence has been granted in pursuance of these Bye-laws. "House" means and includes both a licensed house and a seamen's lodging-house or a house in which seamen are lolged in respect of which a licence has not been granted in pursuance of these Bye-laws.

Application for Licence. 2. A person who shall apply to the Council for a licence shall furnish, on the application form to

be supplied by the Council, a true statement of the particulars therein required to be specified.

Register of Licences.

3. The Council shall cause a register to be kept of all licences granted under these Bye-laws, and the suspension or revocation of any licence shall be noted in such register.

Penalty for False Statement.

4. A person who, not being entered in the Council's register as a licensed keeper, shall himself or by means of any agent or servant hold himself out as keeping or purporting to keep a licensed house, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds, and to a further penalty of £10 for every day during which he shall continue to do so after conviction for so doing.

Inspection and Approval before Licensing.

5. A licence shall not be granted in respect of a house or part of a house until it has been inspected and approved as fit for the purpose of a licensed house by the Medical Officer of Health, or by an Assistant Medical Officer of Health of the county, and any person who applies for a licence shall produce to the Council evilence to its satisfaction of his fitness to be licensed.

Licences not to be Transferred or Leut.

6. A licensed keeper shall not transfer or lend a licence to any other person.

Licence may be Conditional.

7. A licence shall be subject to such conditions specified therein or endorsed thereon, and not being inconsistent with the Laws, Bye-laws, or Regulations for the time being in force in the county, as the Council sees fit, and a licensed keeper, or any person employed in a licensed house, shall not commit a breach of, or fail to observe, such conditions.

Licence to be Annual.

8. A licence shall continue in force (subject to suspension or revocation as in these Bye-laws provided) for one year from 1st January. The Council may at its discretion refuse to renew any licence.

Public-houses or Beer-houses not to be Licensed,

9. A house or part of a house which is in connection with any public-house or beer-house shall not be licensed as a scamen's lodging-house.

Certain Persons not to be Licensed.

10. A licence shall not be granted to a person who holds a licence for the sale of intoxicating liquor, or who is engaged or interested in the business of a clothier, outfitter, or slop-dealer; nor shall a licence be granted in respect of any house or part of a house where intoxicating liquor is sold, nor in respect of any house or part of a house occupied or used for the purpose of the business of a clothier, outfitter, or slop-dealer; nor shall any licensed keeper sell or be engaged or interested in the sale of intoxicating liquor, nor be engaged or interested in the business of a clothier, outfitter, or slop-dealer.

Notice to be Affixed to Licensed House.

11. A licensed keeper shall affix and keep undefaced and legible a notice with the words "Licensed Seamen's Lodging-house" in the most conspicuous place on the outside of the main entrance from any street to the licensed house, an I also the full name and address of the licensed keeper.

Access to Seamen's Lodging-house and to Register of Lodgers.

12. A keeper and any person employed in a house shall at all times, by day or night, when required by an officer appointed by the Council for the inspection of seamen's lodging houses, or by an officer of the Board of Trade, or of the police, give him or them or any of them free

access to all parts of such house, and to the register of seamen lod gers hereinafter referred to.

Number of Lodgers.

13. A keeper shall not at any time receive, cause, or suffer to be received into a house, or permit to slivep in any room therein, any greater number of lodgers than shall be from time to time allowed by the certificate of the Clerk of the Council. Such certificate shall state the total number of lodgers allowed to sleep in each room of such house, as well as the total number such house may receive, and shall be supplied by the Council to the keeper; and he shall produce such certificate whenever required by any officer appointed by the Council for the inspection of seamen's lodging-houses.

14. A keeper shall fix and keep fixed in a conspicuous place in each room a ticket signed by the Clerk of the Council, stating the number of

lodgers allowed to sleep in such room.

15. A keeper and any person employed in a house shall not at any time conceal, deface, alter, or obliterate, or permit, or suffer to be concealed, defaced, altered, or obliterated, any such letters or

figures.

16. Notwithstanding that the maximum number of lodgers to be received in a house or in any room therein may not have been fixed by the Council as hereinbefore provided, a keeper shall not cause or suffer a greater number of persons than will admit of the provision of 400 cublic feet of free air space for each person to occupy at one time as a sleeping apartment a room which is used for that purpose.

17. Whenever the Council shall consider it necessary to reduce the number of lodgers to be received in any room in a house, the keeper shall, upon receiving notice in writing to that effect, under the hand of the Clerk of the Council, cease to permit such room to be occupied by any greater number of lodgers than that specified in such

notice.

Sleeping Apartments.

18. A keeper shall not at any time cause or suffer any room which may be appointed for use as a kitchen, scullery, or sitting room, or any underground room which does not comply with the provisions of sub-section 1 of section 96 of the Public Health Act (London), 1891, to be used as a sleeping apartment.

Ventilation.

- 19. A keeper shall cause all such means of ventilation as may be provided in or in connection with any room or passage in a house, and in, or in connection with, any water-closet belonging to a house to be maintained at all times in good order.
- 20. A keeper shall cause the windows of every room and of the passages and water-closets in a house to be kept fully open for such time on each day as may be necessary for the purposes of ventilation, and shall cause the windows of every room which may be appointed for use and occupation as a sleeping apartment to be kept fully open from 9 A.M. to 4 P.M. in winter and 9 A.M. to 6 P.M. in summer.

Provided that such keeper shall not be required in pursuance of this Bye-law to cause any window in any room to be opened or to be kept open at any time when the state of the weather is such as to render it necessary that the window shall be closed or when any bed in such room may be occupied by any lodger in consequence of sickness or of other sufficient cause.

Cleansing.

by an officer of the Board of Trade, or of the police, give him or them or any of them free month of April and, if required in writing by the

Council, in the first week in the month of October, in every year, cause every part of a house to be cleansed, and shall, at the same time, except in such cases as are hereinafter specified, cause every area, the interior surface of every ceiling and wall of every water-closet belonging to the premises, and the interior surface of every ceiling and wall of every room, staircase, and passage in the house, to be thoroughly stopped, cleaned, and lime-washed or distenpered. Provided that if any such interior surface is painted or covered with material which is such as to render the limewashing thereof unsuitable or inexpedient, this bye-law shall be deemed to be satisfied, so long as such surface is thoroughly cleansed and the paint or other covering thereon is renewed, if such cleansing or renewal be necessary for the purpose of keeping the house in a cleanly and wholesome

22. A keeper shall, as often as may be necessary to keep the same in a clean and wholesome state, cause all the rooms, passages, stairs, floors, windows, doors, and walls of a house to be thoroughly cleansed and freed from vermin, and shall also cause the floors of every room to be thoroughly swept daily before the hour of ten in the forenoon, and to be well and sufficiently washed on Friday in each week before the hour of twelve noon.

23. A keeper shall cause all bed clothes and bedding and every bedstead used in a house to be thoroughly cleansed as often as shall be required for the purpose of keeping such bed clothes, bedding, and bedsteads in a clean and wholesome condition and free from vermin.

Chamber Utensils and Washing Basins.

24. A keeper shall, for the use of the lodgers received into a house, cause to be provided a sufficient number of chamber utensils and a sufficient number of washing basins or other proper receptacles for water, of adequate capacity and suitably placed, and a sufficient supply of water, and a sufficient number of towels for use in connection with such washing basins and other receptacles, and shall cause such basins or receptacles to be kept clean and in good order, and the supply of towels to be renewed as often as may be requisite.

Removal of Refuse.

25. A keeper shall cause all solid or liquid filth or refuse to be removed once at least in every day before the hour of ten in the forenoon from every room in a house, and shall once at least in every day cause every vessel, utensil, or other receptacle for such filth or refuse to be thoroughly cleansed.

Infectious Disease.

26. In the event of any inmate of a house, whether a lodger or otherwise, being attacked by any infectious disorder, the keepεr shall forthwith give intimation of the same to the medical officer of health of the county and of the district.

27. A keeper, immediately after being informed or having ascertained that any inmate of a house, whether a lodger or otherwise, is ill of any infectious disease, shall adopt all such precautions as may be necessary to prevent the spread of such infectious disease. Such keeper shall not, at any time while such inmate is suffering from such infectious disease, cause or allow any other person, except a person voluntarily in attendance on such inmate, to use or occupy the same room as such inmate.

(a.) Where in pursuance of the statutory provision in that behalf, the sanitary authority may order the removal of such inmate to a hospital or other place for the reception of the sick, such keeper, on being informed of such order, shall

forthwith take all such steps as may be requisite on his part to secure the safe and prompt removal of such inmate in compliance with the order of the sanitary authority, and shall, in and about such removal, adopt all such precautions as, in accordance with any instructions which he may receive from the medical officer of health of the district, may be most suitable for the circumstances of the case.

(b.) Where, in consequence of the illness of such inmate, there may be reasonable grounds for apprehending the spread of infection through the admission of a lodger to any room or rooms in a house or through the admission to such room or rooms of the maximum number of lodgers authorized to be received therein, such keeper, after being furnished with the necessary instructions from the medical officer of health of the district, and until the grounds for apprehending the spread of infection shall have been removed, shall cease to receive any lodger into such room or rooms, or shall receive therein such number of lodgers, being less than the maximum number, as the exigencies of the case may require.

(c.) Such keeper shall, immediately after the death, removal, or recovery of any inmate who may have been ill of any infectious disease, give written notice thereof to the medical officer of

health of the district.

(d.) When a registered medical practitioner has certified that any inmate of a house is suffering from any dangerous infectious disorder, and can be safely removed to hospital, such inmate shall not obstruct the sanitary authority in effecting his removal to any hospital or infirmary with the consent of the authorities thereof.

(e.) When the medical officer of health of the district certifies that the cleansing and disinfecting of any house or part thereof, or of any articles therein likely to retain infection, or the destruction of such articles would tend to prevent or check any dangerous infectious disease, such keeper shall give the sanitary authority such facilities as may be necessary to enable such authority to carry out such works of cleansing, disinfection, or destruction as such medical officer of health may deem to be necessary.

(f.) Unless and until by such cleansing and disinfection the necessary precautions for preventing the spread of disease shall have been duly taken, such keeper shall not cause or suffer any other lodger to be received into the room or rooms which, in the case hereinbefore specified, may

have been exposed to infection.

Water-closets.

28. A keeper shall provide, in a suitable and convenient situation for the use of lodgers, properly-constructed water-closets in the proportion of one such water-closet for every twelve lodgers; and shall cause such water-closets and every part of the apparatus of such water-closets, to be kept clean, and shall cause the same and every drain or means of drainage with which they or either of them may communicate, to be maintained in good order and efficient condition.

# Maintenance of Premises.

29. A keeper shall cause every part of the structure of a house to be maintained at all times

in good order.

30. A keeper shall cause the yard, area, forecourt, or other open space within the curtilage of a house to be maintained at all times in good order and thoroughly clean and free from any accumulation of filth or other refuse.

No Female Lodgers.

31. A keeper and every person employed in a

house shall not receive any female lodger into such | house.

Exclusion of Persons of Improper Character.

32. A licensed keeper and every person employed in a licensed house shall not knowingly lodge, or knowingly harbour, any thief or reputed thief, any prostitute or reputed prostitute, or any other person of improper character.

Register of Lodgers, &c.

33. A keeper shall keep a register and shall enter therein the name, age, and nationality of every seaman lodger received into a house, the name of the last vessel from which such seaman lodger was discharged, and the port of discharge, with the name and port of registry of any vessel he may join while resident in such house, and his declared destination on leaving.

Scale of Charges.

34. A keeper shall put up or affix and keep up or affixed a copy of these Bye-laws in a suitable and conspicuous position in the common sitting-room of a house, in such a manner that the contents of such copy may be clearly and distinctly visible and legible, and shall enter upon the space left for the purpose at the foot of that copy, a scale of the charge per day for board, lodging, and necessaries, made in such house, and shall not make a higher charge than is provided by the scale on any pretence whatever.

Licence may be Suspended or Revoked.

35. Upon the Council being satisfied that any licensed keeper has been guilty of a breach of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, or the Acts amending the same, or that such keeper has kept, or is keeping, or is allowing to be kept, a house in which drunkenness, pambling, or immoral or fraudulent practices prevail, or is or has been a party to such proceedings, or neglects to remove from such house any person of improper or immoral character who may have entered therein, or has failed, or is failing, to comply with these Bye-laws or any of them, the Council may suspend or revoke all licences granted to such keeper.

Officers not to be obstructed.

36. No person shall obstruct any officer or person engaged in securing the execution of these

Bye-laws.

Penalty.

37. Every person offending against any of the foregoing Bye-laws, except where otherwise expressly provided, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds for every such offence, and in the case of a continuing offence to a penalty of £5 for every day during which the offence may be continued after conviction for the first offence.

Date when Bye-laws come into force.

8. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1901.

South Metropolitan Gas Company.

(Scheme for the Election of Employees' Directors made under the provisions of the South Metropolitan Gas Act, 1896, and the South Metropolitan Gas Act, 1897.)

W HEREAS provision was made by Section 19 of the South Metropolitan Gas Act, 1896, authorising the Directors to prepare a scheme for the election of one or more Directors by the shareholding employees of the Company as follows:—

Section 19.

(1) "At any time after the total investments
 "of the employees of the Company in the
 "ordinary stock of the Company dating
 "from the distribution of the first profit "sharing bonus in July one thousand eight
 "hundred and ninety shall exceed the
 "nominal amount of forty thousand pounds
 "of such stock the Directors of the Company
 "may as and when they deem expedient
 "prepare a scheme for the purpose of
 "enabling employees holding ordinary
 "stock of the Company to elect one or
 'more of their number but not exceeding
 "three to be a director or directors of the
 "Company."

(2) "The scheme shall be submitted to a "special general meeting of the Company duly called with notice of the business to be considered thereat and the meeting may adopt the scheme either without alteration or with such alterations (not being inconsistent with the provisions of this Act) as the directors may assent to."

(3) "The scheme so adopted shall be sub"mitted for the approval of the Board of
"Trade and that Board may consider the
"same and may either approve the same
"without alteration or may suggest any
"alterations therein or may disapprove the
"same and if the directors assent to the
"alterations (if any) so suggested the
"Board of Trade may approve the scheme
"as altered."

(4) "The scheme when approved shall be "published in the London Gazette and "(subject as hereinafter provided) shall for "the period of three years and no longer "from the date of such publication have "effect Provided that if at any time during "that period the amount of the investment "of the employees in the stock of the Company should fall below the nominal amount of forty thousand pounds the "scheme shall cease to be in force."

(5) "On the cesser of such scheme and sub"ject to the provisions of this Act and to
"the like submission adoption and approval
"a new scheme may at any time be adopted
"for any period that may be in that scheme
"prescribed and so from time to time."

(6) "The qualification of an employees'
"director shall be fixed by the scheme for
"the time being subject to the follow"ing limitations. The employees' director
"shall have been not less than seven years
"in the constant employ of the Company
"and shall have held for not less than
"twelve months prior to the date of elec"tion and shall continue to hold not less
"than two hundred and fifty pounds
"nominal value of the ordinary stock of
"the Company."

(7) "The fees to be paid to an employees'
"director for his attendance at the Board
"shall be fixed by the scheme. The fees
"shall bear some proportion to the amount
"of the qualification not being less than his

"ordinary day's pay nor more than four " times that amount.

(8) "The scale and method of voting for and "the mode of election of employees' direc-" tors shall be settled by the scheme and "may be varied by successive schemes from time to time."

And whereas by the South Metropolitan Gas Act, 1897, the qualification of an Employees' Director was reduced from the said sum of £250 to the sum of £100.

And whereas the total investments of the employees in the Ordinary Stock of the Company exceed the nominal amount of £40,000.

Now, therefore, the Directors of the Company, acting in pursuance of the powers conferred on them in that behalf by the said Acts, have prepared the following scheme, that is to say :-

#### Interpretation.

1. In this scheme "The Company" means the South Metro-

politan Gas Company.

"Employees" means persons in the employ of the Company and holding stock in the capital of the Company.

"Employees' Director" means a Director

elected by the employees.

Commencement of Scheme. 2. This scheme shall come into operation as soon as it has been adopted by the shareholders. of the Company in manner provided by the South Metropolitan Gas Act, 1896, and approved by the Board of Trade, and shall continue in force for nine years, subject to cesser, if the amount of the investment of the employees in the stock of the Company shall fall below the nominal amount of £40,000; or if the shareholders as herein provided shall determine that its continuance is not advantageous to the Company.

Trienuial Report.

3. At the August half-yearly General Meeting in 1904, and again in August, . 907, the directors shall specially report to the shareholders on the working of the scheme, and should the report, in the opinion of the shareholders, be unsatisfactory, and the system detrimental to the interest of the Company, the shareholders shall at the end of each three years have power to terminate the scheme by giving six months' notice. Such notice shall be given at the August meeting that at the half-yearly meeting in the following February a resolution will be submitted for that purpose. Notice of such proposed resolution shall be sent to every shareholder with the February report, and proxies shall be sent therewith. A majority of votes, in person or by proxy, shall determine the issue. Number of Employee Directors.

4. The number of employee directors shall not exceed three, of whom one shall be a salaried officer, and the other two employees in receipt

of weekly wages.

Scale of Voting.

5. Every employee shall have for this purpose one vote for every ten pounds of stock held in his own name, or jointly with that of his wife or child, up to £100 ... .. 10 Votes.

One vote for every £25 above the first £100 up to £300..

8 Additional Votes.

One vote for every £50 above the first £300 up to £1,000 ..14

Above £1,000, no more thus votes, giving .. 32 Votes. maximum of

Qualifications of Employees' Director.

The qualification of an Employees' Director shall be the having been not less than seven years in, and continuing in, the employ of the Company, and the having held for not less than twelve months prior to the date of election, and the continuing to. hold, not less than £100 in the Stock of the Company.

Nomination of Uandidates.

7. The Company shall, one calendar month at least prior to the date of election, make out an alphabetical list of all the employees possessing the necessary qualification to act as directors, giving the name of the station at which each is employed, his length of service, and his occupation. Such list shall be printed and posted up for seven days in conspicuous places at the various offices, works or stations of the Company, and shall be supplied to any shareholding employee on application at the head office or the office of his station. Any qualified employee not wishing to be a candidate can have his name withdrawn by writing to the Secretary to that effect within eight days from the posting up of the list, and his name shall, forthwith, be struck out of the posted lists.

Grouping three Smaller Stations.

8. For the purpose of this scheme, the three smaller stations shall be grouped together. Thus in the selection of candidates, the Bankside, Greenwich and Rotherbithe Stations shall be entitled between them to select one candidate, and Vauxhall, East Greenwich and Old Kent-road, and the salaried officers shall each be entitled to select one candidate, but no station shall at any time have more than one employee director on the Board.

election of One Candidate by each Station.

9. For the selection of candidates, every voter at each station, except the station or stations at which the director or directors remaining upon the Board are employed, shall be supplied with a voting paper in the form prescribed in the Schedule A attached hereto. Such voting paper shall be addressed personally to each voter and shall contain the names of all the employees at the station who are qualified and willing to act as directors. The salaried officers of the Company may, at the discretion of the Board, either make their selection and vote separately from the workmen, or officers and workmen may unite in the voting, but in accordance with the last sentence in Section 8 the officers cannot select a candidate from the employees of any station that at the time has a director remaining on the Board. If he desires to record his vote he shall place his full number of votes, as set out on the voting paper, against the name of any one candidate-or two candidates if there are two vacancies-whom he thinks best fitted to become a director, sign the paper and hand it to the persons, viz., one officer nominated by the Board, and the last elected workman member of the Profit-Sharing Committee, who shall be appointed to In the event of any candidate receive it. receiving a majority of the total number of votes polled at his station, he shall be the selected candidate for that station; but should this not be the case, new voting papers shall be issued containing the names of the two candidates who received the highest numbers of votes. A second vote, shall, in that event be taken, and the candidate who receives the highest number of votes shall then be the selected candidate for that station.

Final Voting for Employee Directors. 10. When this selection has been made. another voting paper (Schedule B), containing the names of the selected candidates of the several stations, shall, unless the directors decide that the officers shall vote separately, be supplied to every voter at all the stations. Voters must put the full number of their votes against the name of any candidate—or of two names, if two directors are to be elected—or their voting papers will be spoiled and their votes lost.

Retirement of Employee Directors.

11. One director elected under this or the preceding scheme shall retire after the first Board Meeting in the month of November every year. If duly qualified, the retiring director shall be eligible for re-election. The retirement shall be by rotation.

Time of Election.

12. All elections, except in the case of unexpected vacancies, shall take place between the 1st of September and the 1st of November in each year, on a date to be fixed by the Board. Employee Directors whose turn it is to retire shall continue to serve until their successors are appointed and take office. In the event of retirement at other than the usual time, by leaving the service of the Company, or the

death of au employee director, a successor shall be elected within two months, at a date to be fixed by the Board, who shall take the place, and retire in the turn of the late director.

Fees.

13. The employee directors shall have their ordinary duties and the pay attaching thereto suspended during the time that is found to be necessary for their duties as directors. The fees for their service as directors shall be the amount they would have earned if they had been at their ordinary employment, plus £1 1s. for each weekly attendance.
