IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1896, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Cardigan, I hereby make the following Order:-

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Cardigan) Order, 1901."
