CORONATION OF THEIR MAJESTIES.

COURT OF CLAIMS.

THE Right Honourable the Commissioners appointed by His Majesty to hear and determine all Claims of Services to be performed at the time of the ensuing Coronation (except those dispensed with by His Majesty's Royal Proclamation of the 26th day of June last), and of fees to be received for the same, at their last meeting held at the Council Office, Whitehall, on the 17th day of July last, resolved as follows:—

1. All Claims must be made by Petition. Petitions may be sent under cover to the Clerks of the Court of Claims, Privy Council Office, Whitehall.
2. Petitioners are not required to appear in person before the Court, unless summoned.
3. Petitioners may appear by Solicitors, Agents, or Counsel.
4. If a Claim was admitted in 1838, the Court will forthwith admit such Claim, provided the Commissioners are satisfied that the present Petitioner represents the person whose Claim was admitted in 1838, and that there is no counter-claim.
5. Petitioners to be requested to present their Claims on or before the 31st day of October, 1901.

The Court stood adjourned till some day in the month of November next, of which notice will be given in the London Gazette.

The Commissioners are required by the Proclamation to exclude from their consideration such claims as may be submitted to them in respect of rights or services connected with the parts of the Ceremonial heretofore performed in Westminster Hall and with the Procession, the Ceremony being confined to Westminster Abbey.

THE Earl Marshal's Order concerning the Robes, Coronets, &c., which are to be worn by the Peers at the Coronation of Their Most Sacred Majesties King Edward the Seventh and Queen Alexandra.

These are to give notice to all Peers who attend at the Coronation of Their Majesties, that the robe or mantle of the Peers be of crimson velvet, edged with miniver, the cape furred with miniver pure, and powdered with bars or rows of ermine (i.e., narrow pieces of black fur), according to their degree, viz.:—

- Barons, two rows.
- Viscounts, two rows and a half.
- Earls, three rows.
- Marquesses, three rows and a half.
- Dukes, four rows.

The said mantles or robes to be worn over full Court dress, uniform, or regimentals.

The coronets to be of silver gilt; the caps of crimson velvet turned up with ermine, with a gold tassell on the top; and no jewels or precious stones are to be set or used in the coronets, or counterfeir pearls instead of silver balls.

The coronet of a Baron to have, on the circle or rim, six silver balls at equal distances.

The coronet of a Viscount to have, on the circle, sixteen silver balls.

The coronet of an Earl to have, on the circle, eight silver balls, raised upon points, with gold strawberry leaves between the points.

The coronet of a Marquess to have, on the circle, four gold strawberry leaves and four silver balls alternately, the latter a little raised on points above the rim.

The coronet of a Duke to have, on the circle, eight gold strawberry leaves.

THE Earl Marshal's Order concerning the Robes, Coronets, &c., which are to be worn by the Peeresses at the Coronation of Their Most Sacred Majesties King Edward the Seventh and Queen Alexandra.

These are to give notice to all Peeresses who attend at the Coronation of Their Majesties, that the robes or mantles appertaining to their respective ranks are to be worn over the usual full Court dress.

That the robe or mantle of a Baroness be of crimson velvet, the cape whereof to be furred with miniver pure, and powdered with two bars or rows of ermine (*i.e.*, narrow pieces of black fur); the said mantle to be edged round with miniver pure two inches in breadth, and the train to be three feet on the ground; the coronet to be according to her degree, *viz.*:—a rim or circle with six pearls (represented by silver balls) upon the same, not raised upon points.

That the robe or mantle of a Viscountess be like that of a Baroness, only the cape powdered with two rows and a half of ermine, the edging of the mantle two inches as before, and the train a yard and a quarter; the coronet to be according to her degree, *viz.*:—a rim or circle with pearls (represented by silver balls) thereon, sixteen in number, and not raised upon points.

That the robe or mantle of a Countess be as before, only the cape powdered, with three rows of ermine, the edging three inches in breadth, and the train a yard and a half; the coronet to be composed of eight pearls (represented by silver balls) raised upon points or rays, with small strawberry leaves between, above the rim.

That the robe or mantle of a Marchioness be as before, only the cape powdered with three rows and a half of ermine, the edging four inches in breadth, the train a yard and three quarters; the coronet to be composed of four strawberry leaves and four pearls (represented by silver balls) raised upon points of the same height as the leaves, alternately, above the rim.

That the robe or mantle of a Duchess be as before, only the cape powdered with four rows of ermine, the edging five inches broad, the train two yards; the coronet to be composed of eight strawberry leaves, all of equal height, above the rim.

And that the caps of all the said coronets be of crimson velvet, turned up with ermine, with a tassel of gold on the top.

NOTE.—Only those Peers and Peeresses who reply to the above intimation before the first day of January, 1902, will receive the Royal Command to attend the Ceremony of the Coronation.

It is to be understood that the above Orders refer to all English, Scottish, and Irish Peers (except Peers who are minors, and Irish Peers who have seats in the House of Commons), Peeresses in their own right, the widows of Peers, and the wives of living Peers, including the wives of Irish Peers who have seats in the House of Commons.

With respect to such widows of Peers who have remarried under the rank of the Peerage, they, according to former precedent, are considered as not entitled to such summons.

As to widows of Peers who have remarried with a Peer of lower degree, their precedence, according to precedent, is that of their last husband.

Peers and Peeresses in their own right whose highest dignity is in the Peerage of Scotland or Ireland will wear robes and coronet of such dignity, as also the wife or widow of such Peer.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 2nd instant, from His Majesty's Representative at The Hague, enclosing the following translation of a Royal Decree of the 12th ultimo with regard to measures for the prevention of plague and other infectious diseases:—

Laws, Decrees, Appointments, &c.
(Staatsblad No. 209.)

Decree of the 12th September, 1901, for applying the Law of 26th April, 1884 (Staatsblad No. 80), supplemented by the Law of 20th July, 1884 (Staatsblad No. 164), and amended by Article 19 of the Law of 15th April, 1886 (Staatsblad No. 64), for enacting extraordinary measures for averting certain infectious diseases, and for preventing the spreading and consequences of the same.

We, Wilhelmina, by the Grace of God, Queen of the Netherlands, Princess of Orange-Nassau, &c., &c., &c.:

Taking into consideration, that it is necessary to apply the Law of 26th April, 1884 (Staatsblad No. 80), supplemented by the Law of 20th July, 1884 (Staatsblad No. 164), and amended by Article 19 of the Law of 15th April, 1886 (Staatsblad No. 64), for enacting extraordinary measures for averting certain infectious diseases and for preventing the spreading and consequences of the same, on account of the appearance of the plague and of other of the aforesaid diseases at certain places in foreign countries;

On the proposal of Our Minister of the Interior of 8th August, 1901, No. 1998, section Medical Police, and of Our Minister of Finance of the 9th August, 1901, No. 62, Import and Excise Duties; Having regard to Our Decree of 15th September, 1900 (Staatsblad No. 160);

Having consulted the Council of State (advice of 27th August, 1901, No. 7);

Having regard to the further report of Our Minister of the Interior of 6th September, 1901, No. 2148, section Medical Police, and of Our Minister of Finance of 9th September, 1901, No. 28, Import and Excise Duties;

Have approved and sanctioned the following Articles:—

ART. 1. The importation, transport, and conveyance of rags, secondhand clothes, and soiled underclothing and bedding are prohibited from countries or places to be indicated by Our Ministers of the Interior and of Finance.

The countries and places indicated shall always be made generally known, at least one day before the indications come into force, by being inserted in the Netherlands Official Gazette.

Our Ministers aforesaid are authorized to alter those indications as often as the circumstances allow of it or make it necessary, as also to determine if and to what extent the luggage brought by travellers is included in the prohibition.

The decisions on these subjects shall also be inserted in the Netherlands Official Gazette.

ART. 2. If the prohibition is intended to avert Asiatic cholera, Our Ministers aforesaid shall act in issuing the instructions concerning the importation and transit from countries which are parties to the international treaty for averting cholera, concluded at Dresden on the 15th April, 1893, and approved by the Law of 9th July, 1894 (Staatsblad No. 94), according to the provisions of that treaty.

If the prohibition is intended to avert the plague, Our aforesaid Minister shall act in issuing the instructions concerning the importation and transport from countries which are parties to the international sanitary convention concluded at Venice on the 19th March, 1897, and approved by the Law of 14th July, 1898 (Staatsblad No. 175), according to the provisions of that convention.

ART. 3. The present decree, which will remain in force for one year, shall come into operation upon the second day after the date of the Staatsblad and of the Official Gazette in which it has been inserted.

Our Ministers of the Interior and of Finance are charged with the carrying out of this decree, which shall be inserted simultaneously in the Staatsblad and in the Official Gazette, and a copy of it shall be sent to the Council of State.

Board of Trade (Fisheries and Harbour Department), London, October 10, 1901.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 2nd instant, from His Majesty's Representative at The Hague, enclosing translation of an Official Notice of the 21st ultimo, declaring that, beginning with the 23rd ultimo, the importation and transport of rags, second-hand clothes, and soiled underclothing and bedding from Bombay, Calcutta, Cape Town, and Port Elizabeth (Cape Colony), are prohibited.

Luggage brought by travellers is included in this prohibition, so far as soiled underclothing and bedding are concerned.

This prohibition does not apply:—

(1.) As regards the importation and transport, to goods, as to which, although brought from Bombay, Calcutta, Cape Town or Port Elizabeth (Cape Colony), there is sufficient proof that they come originally from elsewhere, and have been packed and conveyed in such a manner that they cannot have been in contact with infected articles.

(2.) As regards the transport, to goods which have been packed in such a manner that they cannot undergo any kind of treatment or handling on the way.
