Whereas We have deemed it expedient that a Commission should forthwith issue to inquire into and report upon

- (1) The character and extent of the evils which are attributed to the unrestricted immigration of Aliens, especially in the Metropolis;
- (2) The measures which have been adopted for the restriction and control of Alien immigration in Foreign Countries and in British Colonies;

and to advise what remedial or precautionary measures it is desirable to adopt in this Country, having regard to the above matters and to the absence of any Statutory power to exclude or expel any individual Alien or class of Aliens from its borders.

Now know ye, that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your knowledge and ability, have authorized and appointed, and do by these presents authorize and appoint, you the said Henry, Baron James of Hereford; Nathaniel Mayer, Baron Rothschild; Alfred Lyttelton; Sir Kenelm Edward Digby; William Eden Evans-Gordon; Henry Norman; and William Vallance to be Our Commissioners for the purposes of the said inquiry.

And for the better effecting the purposes of this Our Commission, We do by these presents give and grant unto you, or any three or more of you full power to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission; and also to call for, have access to and examine all such books, documents, registers, and records as may afford you the fullest information on the subject, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever.

And We do, by these presents, authorize and empower you, or any three or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid, and to employ such persons as you may think fit to assist you in conducting any inquiry which you may hold.

And We do by these presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And We do further ordain that you, or any three or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time if you shall judge it expedient so to do.

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any three or more of you, your opinion upon the matters herein submitted for your consideration.

(No. 5934.)

The Quarantine Ordinance, 1879. Order of His Excellency the High Commissioner. Whereas by an Order dated the 12th day of September, 1885, and published in the Official Gazette No. 178, His Excellency the High Commissioner in exercise of the powers vested in him by the above-named Ordinance was pleased to fix a scale of quarantine charges to be taken or the goods and merchandise therein specified.

And whereas it is expedient that the said scale should be amended so far as it relates to the disinfection of goods consigned to foreign ports.

Now therefore His Excellency the High Commissioner in exercise of the powers vested in him by "The Quarantine Ordinance, 1879," is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the date hereof whenever any one batch of goods or merchandise of the same description consigned to any foreign port is disinfected at the same time, and as one consignment, the total amount of charges to be taken in respect of such disinfection shall not exceed the sum of two pounds.

Constantinople, 6th March, 1902. Sir,—I have the honour to transmit herewith copies of telegrams received from the Sanitary Officer at Medina, reporting a serious outbreak of disease among the p lgrims there. The symptoms mentioned—vomiting, diarrhea, anuria, cold extremities, cramps, and sunken eyes—leave practically no room for doubt that the disease is cholera; and as seventy deaths are reported to have occurred in one caravan, while another caravan is also apparently contaminated, the

outbreak is already one of no little gravity. An extraordinary meeting of the Board of Health was held this afternoon in consequence of this report. No later details of the outbreak had been received. In reply to a telegraphic inquiry, the Vali of the Hedjaz telegraphed from Jeddah, under yesterday's date, that he had left Mecca five days previously, that there was no suspicious disease there when he left, and that he had received no information of the appearance of any such disease there since. It may therefore be assumed that Mecca is for the present not contaminated. The infected caravans must have left Mecca quite a fortnight ago (the journey from Mecca to Medina usually occupies thirteen days); and the disease seems to have developed at some place, unnamed, between the two cities. So far as may be gathered from the present information, the outbreak seems to be confined to two caravans at Medina and to a portion of the road between Mecca and Medina.

The Board of Health has decided to communicate with the Vali of the Hedjaz and the Grand Sherif of Mecca, who will be authorized to take whatever measures they may deem necessary to deal with the outbreak. Instructions have already been sent to the Sanitary Officer at Medina to form a local commission of medical men to inquire into and report upon the nature

of the disease and to co-operate in the local measures. All leave has been stopped for medical officers in the Red Sea. As soon as the pilgrims begin to disperse after completion of the Haj, all the medical officers who can be spared from Camaran will be sent to Jeddah, and those of them who are of the Moslem religion (there is, I believe, only one) will be sent on to Mecca or Medina, as required.

Recommendations will be made to the authorities named above, and also to the Porte, as to the urgent need of efforts to prevent the introduction of the disease into Mecca. As the return flow of pilgrims has now set in from Medina to that city, the risk of its contamination is exceedingly great. The Turkish section of the Board is unanimous in declaring that any attempt to stop the flow, and to break up the pilgrimage is not to be even thought of; and it seems clear that were such an attempt made it would only end in failure, and would perhaps lead to worse evils than those it was intended to prevent.

Instructions will therefore be sent to Mecca to arrange, if possible, for the inspection of each caravan as it arrives, for the immediate isolation of any suspected case, and for the medical surveillance, as far as practicable, of the pilgrims during their stay there. As the present Haj is one of the most numerously attended of recent years, any efficient surveillance will probably prove impracticable, even if, as suggested, the local medical staff is supplemented by the services of such medical practitioners as there may be in

It will also be recommended that military patrols should be stationed at the wells and pools on the road between Medina and Mecca, in order to prevent, as far as possible, their gross con-

tamination by the pilgrims.

The Sanitary Administration has promised to prepare a scheme of measures intended to deal with the dispersion of the pilgrims after the completion of the Haj. This scheme will be submitted to the Board for discussion at next Tuesday's meeting.
