WHEREAS His Most Gracious Majesty King Edward the Seventh has by Royal Proclamation appointed Thursday the twenty-sixth day of June next, being the occasion of the Solemnity of His Majesty's Royal Coronation, and Friday the twenty-seventh day of that month, as special days

to be observed as public holidays throughout the United Kingdom, and it is expedient that provision should be made as hereinafter mentioned;

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby sanction any reasonable expenses which may be incurred by any of the undermentioned Local Authorities in England and Wales, that is to say, the County Councils of the several Administrative Counties, the Council of the Isles of Scilly, the Councils of the several Metropolitan Boroughs, the Councils of Municipal Boroughs and Urban Districts whose accounts are subject to audit by a District Auditor, the Councils of the several Rural Districts, and the Parish Councils of the several Rural Parishes having Parish Councils and of the several areas comprising groups of Rural Parishes, in connection with any loyal address to His Majesty on the occasion of the said Solemnity, or otherwise in connection with any public local celebration of that occasion.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board.

CELEBRATION of the Coronation of His Majesty
The King.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions and of the several Out-Relief Unions in England and Wales;—

To the Boards of Management of the several School Districts formed under the Poor Law Amendment Act, 1844, and Acts amending the same;—

To the Boards of Management of the several Asylum Districts formed under the Metropolitan Poor Act, 1867;—

And to all others whom it may concern,

WHEREAS His Most Gracious Majesty King Edward the Seventh has by Royal Proclamation appointed Thursday the twenty-sixth day of June next, being the occasion of the Solemnity of His Majesty's Royal Coronation, and Friday the twenty-seventh day of that month, as special days to be observed as public holidays throughout the United Kingdom;

And whereas it is expedient and proper that any regulations prescribed by the Poor Law Commissioners, the Poor Law Board, or by Us, the Local Government Board, and now in force in Workhouses, Workhouse Schools, Workhouse Infirmaries, District Schools, and District Asylums, should, so far as may be necessary, be temporarily altered so as to empower the Boards of Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions in England and Wales, the Joint Committees of two or more of such Boards of Guardians, and the Boards of Management of the several District Schools and Asylums, to relax the discipline or vary the diet in such Workhouses and other Establishments in such reasonable manner as the said Boards of Guardians, Joint Committees, and Boards of Management may determine, and that such provision should be made as regards out-door relief as is hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order and Declare as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—The said Boards of Guardians, Joint Committees, and Boards of Management may upon the days appointed as public holidays as aforesaid, or upon such other day or days not exceeding two in number as may in any particular case be determined by the Board of Guardians, Joint Committee, or Board of Management, make such reasonable modifications in the regulations in force with regard to the discipline and diet of the poor persons in the said Workhouses and other Establishments and incur such reasonable expense in the celebration therein of the occasion of the Solemnity of His Majesty's Royal Coronation as the said Boards of Guardians, Joint Committees, and Boards of Management may deem suitable.

ARTICLE II.—We hereby sanction the expenses which may be incurred by the said Boards of Guardians, including the Boards of Guardians of the several Out-Relief Unions, in granting to persons in receipt of out-door relief such reasonable additions to the relief as the said Boards of Guardians may, by general or special Resolution, direct to be given in respect of the week which includes the Twenty-sixth day of

June next.
