ORDER of the Local Government Board: Regulations as to Cholera, Yellow Fever, and Plague: Amending Order:-

To all Port Sanitary Authorities ;-

To all other Sanitary Authorities as defined in Our Order dated the 9th day of November, 1896, hereinafter recited;

To the King's Harbour Masters of Dockyard Ports;

To all Officers of Customs;

To all Medical Officers of Health of the Sanitary Authorities aforesaid;—
To all Masters of Ships;—

To all Pilots:

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas We, the Local Government Board, by a General Order dated the 9th day of November, 1896, in the exercise of the powers conferred upon Us by the Public Health Act, 1875, the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, and the Public Health Act, 1896, and of every other power enabling Us in that behalf, made certain regulations (hereinafter referred to as "the Regulations"), with a view to the treatment of persons affected with cholera, yellow fever, or plague, and for the prevention of the spread of such diseases;

And whereas by Article 25 of the Regulations it is provided as follows:—

"ART. 25.—The Master of every ship infected with cholera, yellow fever, or plague shall, when within three miles of the coast of any part of England or Wales, cause to be hoisted at the masthead, or where best seen, a large flag of yellow and black, borne quarterly, and shall keep the same displayed during the whole of the time between surrise and sunset, and no person (other than an Officer of Customs or a person acting in the execution of this Order) shall leave such ship until after such visit of the Officer of Customs as is mentioned in Article 2, or until after the

visit of the Medical Officer of Health in pursuance of Article 8."

And whereas by an Order dated the 24th day of April, 1897 (hereinafter referred to as "the Gloucester Regulations"), and by another Order dated the 30th day of August, 1897 (hereinafter referred to as "the Manchester Regulations"), made by Us in the exercise of the powers before referred to, We rescinded the Regulations, so far as the same related to the Ports of Gloucester and Manchester, and to ships bound thereto as therein mentioned, and made regulations with regard to those ports respectively and to such ships, and by Article XIX of the Gloucester Regulations, and Article XVIII of the Manchester Regulations, with regard to the signal to be hoisted by ships bound to the Ports of Gloucester and Manchester respectively, and infected with cholera, yellow fever, or plague, made provision similar to that made by the above cited Article 25 of the Regulations;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision as hereinafter mentioned should be made with respect to the signals to be hoisted by the master of every ship infected with cholera, yellow fever, or plague, and the Board of Trade have signified their consent in the matter:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Us by the Acts aforesaid, and of every power enabling Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following regulations, and We declare that the same shall be duly enforced and executed:-

ARTICLE I.—The Regulations shall apply and have effect as if for Article 25 of the Regulations the following Article were substituted, that is to

"Arr. 25.—The Master of every ship infected with cholera, yellow fever, or plague shall, when the ship is within three miles of the coast of any part of England or Wales, or is within the limits of a Port, cause to be hoisted-

"(i.) At the masthead or where it can be best seen, during the whole of the time between sunrise and sunset, a day signal, consisting of a large firg of yellow and black borne

quarterly; or

"(ii.) At the peak or other conspicuous place where it can be best seen, and at a height of not less than twenty feet above the full of the ship, during the whole of the time between sunset and sunrise, a night signal, consisting of three lights, which shall be arranged, at a distance of not less than six feet apart, in the form of an equilateral triangle, and of which the light at the apex of the triangle shall be white, and the other lights at the ends of the base of the triangle shall be red in colour.

⁶ No person (other than an Officer of Customs or a person acting in the execution of this Order) shall leave the aforesaid ship until after such visit of the Officer of Customs as is mentioned in Article 2, or until after the visit of the Medical Officer of Health in pur-

suance of Article 8."

Articia II.—The Gloucester Regulations shall apply and have effect as if for Article XIX of the Gloucester Regulations the following Article were substituted, that is to say:-

"ARTICLE XIX.—The Master of every ship bound to the Port of Gloucester, and infected with cholera, yellow fever, or plague, shall, when the ship is within three miles of the coast of any part of England or Wales, or is within the limits of a Port, cause to be hoisted-

"(i.) At the masthead or where it can be best seen, during the whole of the time between sunrise and sunset, a day signal, consisting of a large flag of yellow and black borne

quarterly; or

"(ii.) At the peak or other conspicuous place where it can be best seen, and at a height of not less than twenty feet above the hull of the ship, during the whole of the time between sunset and sunrise, a night signal, consisting of three lights, which shall be arranged, at a distance of not less than six feet apart, in the form of an equilateral triangle, and of which the light at the apex of the triangle shall be white, and the other lights at the ends of the base of the triangle shall be red in colour.

"No person (other than an Officer of Customs or a person acting in the execution of this Order) shall leave the aforesaid ship until after such visit of the Officer of Customs as is mentioned in Article II, or in Article III, or until after the visit of the Medical Officer of Health of the Bristol Port Sanitary Authority, or of the Medical Officer of Health of the Gloucester Port Sanitary Authority, in pursuance of Article

ARTICLE III.—The Manchester Regulations shall apply and have effect as if for Article XVIII of the Manchester Regulations the following Article were substituted, that is to say:-

"ARTICLE XVIII.—The master of every ship bound to the Port of Manchester, and infected with cholera, yellow fever, or plague, shall, when the ship is within three miles of the coast of any part of England or Wales, or is within the limits of a Port, cause to be hoisted-

"(i.) At the masthead or where it can be best seen, during the whole of the time between sunrise and sunset, a day signal, consisting of a large flag of yellow and black borne

quarterly; or

- "(ii.) At the peak or other conspicuous place where it can be best seen, and at a height of not less than twenty feet above the hull of the ship, during the whole of the time between sunset and sunrise, a night signal, consisting of three lights, which shall be arranged, at a distance of not less than six feet apart, in the form of an equilateral triangle, and of which the light at the apex of the triangle shall be white, and the other lights at the ends of the base of the triangle shall be red in colour.
- "No person (other than an Officer of Customs or a person acting in the execution of this Order) shall leave the aforesaid ship until after such visit of the Officer of Customs as is mentioned in Article II, or until after the visit of the Medical Officer of Health of the Liverpool Port Sanitary Authority or of the Medical Officer of Health of the Manchester Port Sanitary Authority in pursuance of Article III.'

Notice.—The Public Health Act, 1896, provides by sub-section (3) of Section 1 that if any person wilfully neglects or refuses to obey or carry out, or obstructs the execution of, any regulation made under section one hundred and thirty of the Public Health Act, 1875, or in pursuance of that section as extended to London by the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, and as amended by the Public Health Act, 1896, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty not exceeding fifty pounds for every day during which the offence continues.

"Subject to the provisions of the Special Act authorizing any tramway, and this Act, the local authority of any district in which the same is laid down may from time to time make regulations as to the following matters (inter alia) the traffic on the road in which the tramway is laid and for better enforcing the observance of all or any of such regulations it shall be lawful for such local authority to make Bye-laws for all or any of the aforesaid purposes and from time to time to repeal or alter such Bye-laws and make new Bye-laws provided that such Bye-laws be not repugnant to the laws of that part of the United Kingdom where the same are to have effect.

For the purposes of these Bye-laws the term "car" shall mean any carriage using any tramway laid down within the borough of Huddersfield (hereinafter called the said borough), and the terms "driver" and "con-ductor" shall respectively mean the driver and conductor or other person having charge of a car, and the term "slow-going fraffic" shall include all vehicles proceeding at a walking pace and shall also include cattle, sheep, and other animals driven along any road in the said borough in which any tramway is laid.

1. Every person in charge of a horse standing or travelling in any road in the said borough in which a tramway is laid and whether such horse is attached to a vehicle or not shall at once signal any car meeting, overtaking, or running alongside or in front of him or her if such horse

becomes restless or alarmed.

2. In case of any horse or vehicle standing or travelling on any part of a road in the said borough in which a tramway is laid so as not to leave sufficient space for any car to pass, the person in charge of such horse or vehicle shall immediately on the approach of any car with all reasonable despatch cause such horse or vehicle to be removed so as not to obstruct the car.

3. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on any tramway

4. No person in charge of a horse or vehicle shall in any road in the said borough in which any tramway is laid, cross the tramway in front of an approaching car without giving sufficient warning to the driver or conductor of his intention so to do.

5. All slow-going traffic on any road in the said borough in which a tramway is laid shall be kept as near to the side of the said road as is practicable unless sufficient reason be shown to the contrary. Provided that nothing in this Bye-law contained shall be deemed to confer on the Corporation any preferential rights to the roadway between the rails.

6. At crossings of roads in the said borough in which any tramways are laid, slow-going traffic which may have to be brought to a stand shall keep to the side of the road. Any vehicle intending to go down a side street which shall necessitate such vehicle crossing the tram lines must keep its own side of the street until abreast of the side street down which such vehicle is to he taken or turned, and then cross over the tram lines direct.

7. When it is necessary that a vehicle shall stand on any road in the said borough in which Burgesses of the county borough of Hudders- a tramway is laid it shall be drawn close to the

side of the said road and shall be kept there no longer than can be reasonably avoided. Any police constable may order the person in charge of a standing vehicle which has been obstructing the traffic for an undue time to move it to some place where it will not obstruct the traffic, and such person shall thereupon move the said vehicle on accordingly.

8. In the event of any vehicle breaking down on any road in the said borough in which a tramway is laid or of any load falling from a vehicle in any such road, the person in charge of the vehicle shall immediately remove the vehicle or load from the road, and if he fails to do so any police constable may remove such vehicle or

load.

9. The driver of any vehicle who intends to turn out of the line of traffic in which he is then driving shall when practicable give a signal by holding up his hand to other drivers who may be following him.

Every person offending against any of these Bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceed-ing forty shillings for each offence, and not exceeding for any continuing offence ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues.
