The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Treaty, grant, usage, suffer-
ance, and other lawful means, His
Majesty the King has power and jurisdiction
within the Somaliland Protectorate:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in
exercise of the powers on this behalf by "The
Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890," or otherwise in
His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the
advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is
hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Somali-
land Order in Council, 1903," and shall be
construed as one with "The Somaliland Order in
Council, 1899."

2. Where, under "The Merchant Shipping
Act, 1894," or any amending Act, anything is
authorized to be done by, to, or before a British
Consular officer, such thing may be done in any
place in the Protectorate at which there is no
Consular officer by, to, or before such officer of
the Protectorate as the Consul-General may
appoint.

3. The Consul-General may make King's
Regulations providing for the registration of
births and deaths in the Protectorate.
