The Wild Birds Protection (County of Surrey) Order, 1903.

Dated 18th March, 1903.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1902, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Surrey, I hereby make the following Order:-

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds

#### BIRDS.

#### Close Time extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880, shall be extended throughout the County of Surrey so as to be between the last day of January and the first day of September in any

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within so much of the County of Surrey as is within the Metropolitan Police District to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act:-

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

V. During the period between the 31st day of August in any year and the 1st day of February following, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Surrey:

All Birds protected on Sundays except in certain Parishes.

VI. During the period between the 31st day of August in any year and the 1st day of February following the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited throughout the County of

Surrey, except in the undermentioned parishes:—
Bookham Little, Burstow, Chessington, Chobham, Elstead, Farnham, Puttenham, Reigate,
Stoke-next-Guildford, Wallington, and Waltonon-Thames.

#### Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected in such part of the County as is within the Metropolitan Police District.
