W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the eleventh day of June, in the year one thousand nine hundred and three, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

and figures following, that is to say:—
"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter one hundred and thirteen of the

Act of the sixth and seventh years or Her said ! late Majesty chapter thirty-seven and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the parish of Finchley and partly out of the new parish (sometime consolidated chapelry) of Saint Paul Long-lane Finchley both in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said parish of Finchley and the said new parish of Saint Paul Long-lane Finchley are cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said parish of Finchley and of the said new parish of Saint Paul Long-lane Finchley which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the

purpose of Divine worship.

"And whereas under the provisions of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the twentieth day of May in the year one thousand nine hundred and three and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-second day of the same month a sum of three thousand three hundred and thirty-three pounds six shillings and eight pence India Three pounds per centum stock (being part of a sum of fifteen thousand two hundred and thirty-six pounds eleven shilings and two pence India Three pounds per centum stock formerly held by us for the benefit of the rector or Incumbent of the parish of Hornsey in the said county of Middlesex and in the said diocese of London) has been transferred to our common fund created by the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act to the intent that the said sum of three thousand three hundred and thirtythree pounds six shillings and eight pence India. Three pounds per centum stock shall be applied by us for the benefit of the minister or Incumbent of the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted and when such district shall have become a new parish then of such new district.

"And whereas the said sum of three thousand three hundred and thirty-three pounds six shillings and eight pence India Three pounds per centum stock will produce an income of one hundred pounds per annum for the minister or Incumbent of the said proposed district or new

"And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England (firstly) a sum of five thousand pounds sterling towards providing a permanent church within and for the said proposed separate district and (secondly) a sum of two thousand pounds towards providing a further endowment for such proposed separate district and (thirdly) a sum of one thousand pounds towards providing a parsonage house for the same proposed separate district, and we have in respect of the said sum of two thousand pounds sterling agreed and have undertaken to pay by equal quarterly payments on the first day of February the first day of May the first day of August and the first day of November in each and every year to the minister of the said proposed district and to his successors and when the said proposed i

district shall become a new parish under the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act then to the vicar or Incumbent of such new parish and to his successors the sum of sixty pounds per annum so long as the said capital sum of two thousand pounds shall remain in our hands.

"And whereas the contributor of the said sums of five thousand pounds two thousand pounds and one thousand pounds has nominated Francis Augustus Bevan of number 54 Lombardstreet in the city of London Banker, the Very Reverend William Hagger Barlow Doctor of Divinity Dean of the Cathedral Church of Peter-borough, the Reverend Sir John Robert Laurie Emilius Laurie, Baronet, Clerk in Holy Orders of number 14 Hyde Park-street in the metropolitan borough of Paddington, the Reverend Henry Elliott Fox Clerk in Holy Orders one of the Prebendaries of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London, and John Francis William Deacon of number 20 Birchin-lane in the city of London Banker, as the persons in whom the said contributor of the said sums of five thousand pounds two thousand pounds and one thousand pounds desires that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district or new parish (as the case may be) shall be vested.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Arthur Foley Bishop of London testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said parish of Finchley and of the said new parish of Saint Paul Long-lane Finchley which are described in the schedule hereunder written all which portions together boundaries thereof are delineated with the and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named The District of Saint Luke Finchley.'

"And we further recommend and propose that without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district and when the said district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of the said new parish and of the nomination of the minister or Incumbent thereto shall be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Francis Augustus Bevan, William Hagger Barlow, John Robert Laurie Emilius Laurie, Henry Elliott Fox, and John Francis William Deacon and their heirs and assigns for ever.

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the feregoing ' Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Luke Finchley com-

prising:—
"All those contiguous portions of the parish of Finchley and of the new parish (sometime consolidated chapelry) of Saint Paul Long-lane Finchley both in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London which taken together are

bounded upon the south partly by the parish of Hendon and partly by the new parish of the Holy Trinity Finchley both in the said county and diocese upon the south-east by the lastnamed new parish and upon the remaining sides that is to say upon the north-east and upon the west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Finchley from the said new parish of Saint Paul Long-lane Finchley at the centre of the bridge which carries Green-lane over the Edgware Highgate and London Branch Line of the Great Northern Railway and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said branch line of railway for a distance of fifty-five chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Regent's Park-road over the said branch line of railway upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Paul Long-lane Finchley from the said parish of Finchley and extending thence first south-westward and then southward along the middle of Regent's Park-road for a distance of seventy-three chains or thereabouts (thereby in part following the last-mentioned boundary) to the centre of the bridge or culvert which carries Regent's Park-road over Mutton Brook upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Finchley from the parish of Hendon aforesaid."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the Incumbents of the cures out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patrons have respectively signified their assent to such scheme:

And whereas the Incumbents of such cures have offered certain objections to the said

scheme:

And whereas notwithstanding such objections the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

WHEREAS by the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, was enacted that, in case it appeared to His Majesty in Council, upon the representation of the Local Government Board, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial-ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial-grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or consideration it should be leavent for His Majesty. qualification, it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that no new burial-ground should be

opened in any city or town, or within such limits. without such previous approval, or (as the case might require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial-grounds or places of burial, should be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications men-tioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances might require; provided always, that notice of such representation, and of the time when it should please His Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, should be published in the London Gazette, and should be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation was so considered; provided also that no such representation should be made in relation to the burial-ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation should have been given to the Incumbent and vestry clerk or churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the church-wardens of the parish of Saint Thomas, Elson, of the parish of Saint John (Cornwall), and of the parish of Saint John the Baptist, Southendon-Sea, ten days' previous notice of their intention to make such representations, made representations stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-grounds should be opened in the civil parishes of Alverstoke, and Saint John (Cornwall), or in the borough of Southendon-Sea, without the previous approval of the Local Government Board, and that burials should be discontinued in the said parishes as hereinafter

directed:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the twentieth day of May last, to give notice of such representations, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and three, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that no new burial grounds shall be opened in the said civil parishes or borough of Southend-on-Sea without the previous approval of the Local Government Board, and that burials in the said parishes and borough shall be discontinued as follows: viz.:-

ALVERSTOKE.—Forthwith and entirely in the Church of Saint Thomas, Elson, in the civil parish of Alverstoke, in the county of Southampton; and in the churchyard except as follows:

(a.) In any walled grave now existing in the said churchyard burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b.) In any earthen grave now existing in the said churchyard the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of any member of the family of the person

SAINT JOHN.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Saint John, in the civil parish of Saint John, in the county of Cornwall, and in the churchyard.

or persons heretofore buried in such grave.

SOUTHEND-ON-SEA. -Forthwith and entirely in the Church of Saint John the Baptist, Southend-on-Sea; and in so much of the churchyard as is not reserved for the exclusive interment of the late John Rumble and of members of his family, except as

(a.) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said portion of the churchyard burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework

or brickwork properly cemented:

(b.) In any earthen grave now existing in the said portion of the churchyard the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave:

(c.) In the said portion of the churchyard in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place with the exclusive right of burial

WHEREAS by the Burial Act, 1853, as VV amended by the Burial Act, 1900, it was enacted that, in case it appeared to His Majesty in Council, upon the representation of the Local Government Board, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial-ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial-grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that no new burial-ground should be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case might require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial-grounds or places of burial, should be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances might require; provided always, that notice of such representation, and of the time when it should please His Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, should be published in the London Gazette, and should be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation was so considered: provided also, that no , such representation should be made in relation to the burial-ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation should have been given to the

Incumbent and vestry clerk or churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas by the Burial Act, 1855, it was, amongst other things, enacted that it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, should or should not have arrived), as to His Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, might seem fit:

And whereas the Local Government Board after giving to the Incumbent and the churchwardens of the parish of Saint Mary, Minster, near Ramsgate, in the county of Kent, ten days' previous notice of their intention to make such representation, made a representation stating that they were of opinion that so much of the Order in Council of the twelfth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, as relates to burials in the said parish, should be varied

as hereinafter set forth:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the twentieth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and three, to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and three, and copies thereof have been affixed as required by the said first recited Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that so much of the Order in Council of the twelfth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, as relates to the said parish be varied by substituting for the directions contained in the said Order with regard to Minster the following directions, viz. :-

MINSTER.—That, except as hereinafter provided, burials be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Saint Mary, Minster, near Ramsgate, in the county of Kent; and, after the thirty-first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and three. in the churchyard;

Provided that in any vault or walled grave now existing in the said churchyard, burial may be allowed, subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brick-

work properly cemented.

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Oriel College, Oxford, on the twenty-fourth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and three (and sealed on the twenty-first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and three), has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":

A STATUTE to amend a Statute made by the University of Oxford Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 (40 and 41 Vict., c. 48), and approved by Her Majesty Queen Victoria in Council on the third day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, in relation to Oriel College, in the University of Oxford, duly made at a General Meeting of the Provost and Fellows of the said College, specially summoned for this purpose, held on the twenty-fourth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and three, and passed at such meeting by the votes of two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, and submitted to His Majesty the King in Council.

Whereas by Statute IV, 7, made by the University of Oxford Commissioners, under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and approved by Her Majesty Queen Victoria in Council on the third day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, in relation to Oriel College, in the University of Oxford, and amended by a Statute approved by Her Majesty Queen Victoria in Council on the twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, and further amended by a Statute approved by Her Majesty Queen Victoria in Council on the sixth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, it was enacted as follows:—

7. "Two Exhibitions at least shall always be maintained within the College, to be called the Exhibitions of Adam de Brome, and to be filled up by the election of deserving persons whom the Provost and Fellows shall have ascertained to be in need of support at the University. Each Exhibitioner shall receive such sum not exceeding £80 per annum from the Exhibition Fund, as the Provost and Fellows shall from time to time determine.

The Exhibitioners shall be elected by the Provost and Fellows, with or without examination, and with or without public notice, as the electors shall think fit.

The conditions of tenure of these Exhibitions shall be the same in all respects as those of Scholarships: save that, in the event of any one of the Exhibitioners being elected to a Scholarship within the College, or ceasing, in the judgment of the Provost and Fellows, to be in need of support at the University, he shall thereupon vacate his Exhibition.

It shall be lawful for the Provost and Fellows, at or upon the election after examination and with public notice of any such Exhibitioner or under and in pursuance of regulations made by them from time to time respecting the election after examination and with public notice of such Exhibitioners, to assign to any Exhibitioner or Exhibitioners so elected the title of Scholar, and to the Exhibition or Exhibitions so filled up the name of Scholarship; provided that no exercise by the Provost and Fellows of the power hereby given shall affect the conditions of tenure hereinbefore expressed with respect to such Exhibitions."

And whereas under the said Statutes the emoluments of Adam de Brome Exhibitioners are the same as those of Scholars of the College, and the conditions of tenure, other than that of the Exhibitioners being in need of support at the University, of Adam de Brome Exhibitions, are the same in all respects as those of Scholarships within the College.

And whereas it appears to us the Provost and Fellows of the said College that the abilities and attainments of the persons qualified for election to Exhibitions of Adam de Brome and offering themselves as candidates for such Exhibitions at elections held after examination and with public

notice are equal or not inferior to those of candidates for Scholarships within the College, and that it is desirable that they should not be placed in respect of rank or title in a position inferior to that which they would hold if elected to Scholarships within the College.

We, the said Provost and Fellows of the said College, being the Governing Body thereof, do hereby in exercise of the power given to us by the fifty-fourth section of the said Act, alter Statute IV, 7, by substituting for the clauses as hereinbefore set out the following clauses:—

7. "Two Scholarships or Exhibitions at least shall always be maintained within the College, to be called the Scholarships or Exhibitions of Adam de Brome, and to be filled up by the election of deserving persons whom the Provost and Fellows shall have ascertained to be in need of support at the University. Each Scholar or Exhibitioner shall receive such sum not exceeding £80 per annum from the Exhibition Fund as the Provost and Fellows shall from time to time determine.

The Scholars or Exhibitioners of Adam de Brome shall be elected by the Provost and Fellows, with or without examination, and with or without public notice, as the electors shall think fit.

The conditions of tenure of these Scholarships or Exhibitions shall be the same in all respects as those of Open Scholarships: save that in the event of any one of the Scholars or Exhibitioners being elected to an Open Scholarship within the College, or ceasing, in the judgment of the Provost and Fellows, to be in need of support at the University, he shall thereupon vacate his Scholarship or Exhibition.

It shall be lawful for the Provost and Fellows at or upon the election of any Adam de Brome Exhibitioner, or under and in pursuance of regulations made by them from time to time respecting the election of such Exhibitioners, to assign to any Exhibitioner or Exhibitioners so elected the title of Scholar and to the Exhibition or Exhibitions so filled up the name of Scholarship: and the Provost and Fellows shall exercise the power hereby given in favour of every person who shall be elected after examination and with public notice."

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Saint John's College, Oxford, on the fifteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and three (and sealed on twentieth May, one thousand nine hundred and three), has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

Ex parte the President and Fellows of Saint John's College in the University of Oxford.

A STATUTE made to amend a Statute framed by the Commissioners appointed under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 (40 and 41 Victoria, cap. 48), in relation to Saint John's College in the University of Oxford duly passed at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose on the fifteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and three by the votes of the whole number of persons present and voting and

submitted to His Majesty the King in Council.
Whereas in Statute XV, 1, of the Statutes of Saint John's College in the University of

Oxford it is enacted (inter alia):

"The President and Fellows may from time to time pay out of the Corporate revenues a sum not exceeding five hundred pounds in any year to a Pension Fund and may add to it a sum deducted from the Tuition Fund such deduction not to exceed ten pounds per centum in any year. The proceeds of any Advovsons which may be sold by the College may if the President and Fellows think fit be added to the Capital of this Fund."

And whereas it appears to us the President and Fellows of the said College that it is desirable that the said Statute shall be altered and amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now we the President and Fellows of the said College in exercise of the powers vested in us under and by virtue, of the fifty-fourth section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, do by this present instrument under the Corporate Seal of our said College alter and amend Statute XV 1 of the College alter and amend Statute XV, 1, of the Statutes of the College as bereinbefore set out by inserting after the words "the proceeds of any advowsons which may be sold by the College" the words "and any property which the President and Fellows hold in trust for the purchase of advowsons."

STATUTE made by the Governing Body of Magdalene College Cambridge at a General Meeting specially summoned for the purpose by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting on Monday the twenty-second day of June one thousand nine hundred and three in substitution for Statute XXV of the existing Statutes of the College.

Statute XXV.

Emoluments of the Master and Fellows. After deduction of all stipends and allowances to the Officers of the College and of the payments: to the General Fund for Open Scholarships the Living and Building Fund and all other needful and reasonable general expenses and of such payments as may be required to defray the expenses of the management of the College property and to keep in sound repair the College buildings and the buildings of the College estates and otherwise to permanently improve the College property and also of such payment as may become due to the University the surplus

revenues arising from the Peckard Fund and from the proceeds of the sale of the advowson of Ellingham) shall be divided into nine equal parts of which the Master shall receive two and each of the Fellows one. Provided that when such surplus annual revenue exceeds two thousand two hundred and fifty pounds (£2,250) the excess shall be applied in such proportion as the Governing Body thinks fit either to the increase of the number of Fellowships or to the increase of the number or emoluments of the Scholars or to such other purposes as are considered by the Governing Body most advantageous to the College.

The annual revenue arising from the Peckard Fund shall be divided into six equal parts of which the Master shall receive two and the four remaining parts shall be divided equally amongst the four Fellows who have first completed a twelve years' tenure of office as Tutor Lecturer or Dean in the College: Provided that, if at any time there are fewer than four Fellows qualified as above, then the remaining part or parts shall be given to the Fellow or Fellows who shall have first completed a three years' tenure of office as Tutor Lecturer or Dean in the College and who continue to hold one or other-of such offices and in the event of two or more of the Fellows being equally qualified as above to receive any such part it shall be equally divided between or among them provided that if at any time there are fewer than four such Fellows each such Fellow shall then receive one part and the remaining part or parts shall be carried to the capital of the Peckard

... Every resident Fellow shall be entitled to rooms in College free of charge and to such daily allowance for commons during residence as the Governing Body from time to time determines provided that such allowance, does not in all exceed fifty pounds (£50) a year.

The Master shall occupy the lodge free of rent rates taxes and the cost of external and structural repairs and shall receive the annual income arising from the proceeds of the sale of the advowson of Ellingham, together with an allowance at the rate of one hundred pounds (£100) a year. Such allowance shall be in lieu of all payments hitherto made to the Master in respect of salary commons chamber rents poundages and rents of cottages.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the County of Devon to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the said Act :-

Snow Bunting, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Hobby, Kestrel, Merlin, Nutcracker, Nuthatch, Osprey, Richard's Pipit, Water Pipit, Lesser Redpoll, Mealy Redpoll, Bearded Titmouse.

The Shag and Cormorant deprived of protection in certain Districts.

IV. Those parts of the Administrative County of Devon which are comprised within the limits of the Axe, Exe, Dart, and Teign Fishery Districts, respectively, shall be exempted from the operation of the Act of 1880 as to the following Birds :-

BOROUGH OF READING.

Bye-laws and Regulations Under Section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870.

Borough of Reading in the county of Berks, acting by the Council of the said borough (hereinafter called "the Corporation") as the Local Authority of the District of the said borough for the purposes of the Tramways Act, 1870, and as Promoters and Owners of the tramways and portions of tramways constructed in the said borough in pursuance of the Reading Corporation Tramways Order, 1899, confirmed by the Tramways Orders Confirmation (No. 1) Act, 1899, and the Reading Corporation (Tramways) Act, 1900, hereby give notice that they have made Bye-laws and Regulations under Section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, with respect to the said tramways and portions of tramways, and that a true copy of the said Bye-laws and Regulations has been sent to the Board of Trade as required by the said Act.

The following is a copy of the Bye-laws and Regulations above referred to:—

Repeal of former Bye-laws and Regulations.

1. From and after the date of the coming into force of these Bye-laws and Regulations, all Bye-laws and Regulations made by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Reading or otherwise and now in force with respect to the tramways within the said borough or with respect to any part of such tramways shall be and the same are hereby repealed, but any proceedings pending at the time of such repeal may be continued and prosecuted as if such repeal had not taken effect.

Interpretation.

2. Throughout these Bye-laws and Regulations the word "Corporation" means the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Reading, and shall include any lessees or persons for the time being working the tramways as hereinafter defined; the expression "the tramways" means the tramways in the said borough for the time being belonging to the Corporation and every part of such tramways; the word "car" means any carriage or car run by the Corporation upon the tramways for the conveyance of passengers; the word "conductor" means any officer or servant of the Corporation having the charge of a car; the word "driver" and the word "motor-man" mean any officer or servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive a car; the term "slow going traffic" means and includes all vehicles proceeding at a walking pace, and also cattle, sheep, and other animals driven along any road in the said borough in which the tramways are laid; and words importing the masculine gender include females.

Entering and Leaving Cars.

- 3. Every person shall mount or alight from a car by the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise, unless so directed by the conductor.
- 4. All persons desiring to alight from any car shall (if ready when the car stops) do so before any person mounts the car for the purpose of travelling thereon, and all persons desiring to mount the car shall allow such persons to alight as aforesaid.

Full Cars.

5. When any car contains the full number of passengers which it is constructed to carry and which number is posted in or on the car, no additional person shall mount, enter, or remain in or upon any such car. The conductor shall have power to prevent any person beyond such number of passengers from mounting, entering, or remaining in or upon any part of a car. All such persons shall leave the car immediately upon the request of the conductor.

Unauthorized Travelling.

6. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, or an officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty, shall mount or enter a car, and no person, or passenger, except such officer or servant as aforesaid, shall hold or hang on by or to the dashboard or steps or any other part of a car, except straps or other appliances provided inside or on the roof of the car for the convenience of passengers. No person or passenger shall sit on the outside rails on the roof of any car. No person or passenger shall stand or sit on any platform or stairs of any car. And no person or passenger shall, except with the permission of the conductor, stand inside any car when sitting accommodation is available either inside the car or on the roof.

7. No person, except an officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty, shall mount or attempt to mount, or shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any water carriage or other carriage used upon the tramways for any purpose other than the conveyance of passengers.

Entering or leaving a Car when in motion.

8. No person (except an officer of the Tramway Department of the Corporation) shall mount, enter, or leave or alight from, or attempt to mount, enter, or leave or alight from any car whilst in motion.

Persons suffering from Disease not to travel on Cars.

9. No person afflicted with any infectious or contagious disease shall mount, enter, or travel in or upon any car, or attempt so to do. And no driver or conductor shall knowingly suffer or permit any such person so to do.

Disabled Cars.

10. If at any time a car becomes disabled, or damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, all passengers shall, upon the request of the conductor, leave the car, and if such passengers have paid their fares, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but shall be entitled to continue their journey by the next available car. No person shall, except with the permission of the conductor, mount or enter a disabled or damaged car.

Cars proceeding to Sheds.

11. No person shall travel in or upon a car which is proceeding to a shed and is not on its usual route unless permitted so to do by the conductor, and where such person is so permitted, he shall pay the usual fare payable on such route.

Smoking.

12. No person shall smoke or carry lighted pipes, eigars, or eigarettes inside any car, except in a compartment (if any) specially set apart for the purpose.

Dogs.

13. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or upon any car. Any dog or other animal taken into or upon any car in breach of this Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the car immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request, any such dog or other animal may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

Firearms.

14. No person shall travel in or upon any car with loaded firearms or dangerous articles or things, or with any article, instrument or implement which may be dangerous or offensive to any person.

Objectionable Persons.

15. Any person who is in a state of intoxication shall not mount or enter upon any car, and may be prevented from doing so by the conductor or other officer or servant of the Corporation. Any person offending against or committing a breach of this Bye-law shall, in addition to being liable to a penalty, be liable to be immediately removed from the car, and if such person fail to leave the car when requested to do so by the conductor, it shall be lawful for the conductor or any other officer or servant of the Corporation, or any police constable to icn.ove such person from the car.

16. A person whose dress or clothing might. in the opinion of the conductor of a car, soil or injure the seats, cushions, curtains or linings of the car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, is by reason of vermin, disease, dress or want of cleanliness, offensive to passengers, or unfit to be a passenger, shall not be entitled to mount or enter or remain in or upon any car, and may be prevented by the conductor or other officer or servant of the Corporation from mounting or entering any car, and shall not mount or enter any car, after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and if found in or upon any car, shall, on request of the conductor, and upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned, leave the car, failing which it shall be lawful for the conductor or any other officer or servant of the Corporation, or any police constable to remove such person from the car.

Offensive Language or Conduct.

17. No person shall swear or use obscene, abusive or offensive language, or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any car, or spit or expectorate or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any car or tramway station, or waiting room, or other premises used in connection with the tramway system, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger. No person shall play or perform upon any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements, or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms, or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble, or deposit remnants of food or fruit in or upon any car.

Luggage and Parcels.

- 18. No person shall without the consent of the conductor take upon any car any personal luggage exceeding twenty-eight pounds in weight, or any parcel (not being personal luggage of not more than twenty-eight pounds in weight accompanied by a passenger) or any luggage (including the tools of artizans, mechanics and daily labourers) which from its size or otherwise is in the opinion of the conductor unsuitable for conveyance in or upon the car.
- 19. Any personal luggage conveyed in or upon any car shall be placed in such positions and in such parts of the car as shall be directed by the conductor.

Damaging Cars.

20. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the seats, cushions, curtains or linings, or any other part of any car, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice in or on any car, or any advertisement which may be in or on any car, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage, any car. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws, to pay the amount of any damage so done.

Payment of Fares.

21. Each passenger shall, either on demand or before leaving the car (whichever first happens), pay to the conductor, or other duly authorized officer of the Corporation the fare for his journey, and shall obtain a ticket therefor. Any person leaving a car shall be deemed to have completed his journey. Any person travelling beyond the destination to which his ticket was available shall pay a fresh fare from the point to which such ticket was available and shall obtain another

ticket for such fresh fare. No child under three years of age who is sitting on the lap of a passenger shall be liable to pay a fare, provided that this exemption shall apply only to one such child accompanying any one passenger; any additional child, irrespective of age, accompanying such passenger shall pay the ordinary fare.

Tickets.

- 22. Each passenger shall immediately upon demand show his ticket to the conductor or any duly authorized officer or servant of the Corporation, and shall also, when required so to do, deliver up his ticket. Any passenger unable to produce his ticket shall pay the fare for the distance travelled over by such passenger.
- 23. Tickets shall not be transferable from person to person, and (except special tickets for transfer to another car) shall only be available on the car and for the journey for which they are issued.
- 24. Special tickets for transfer to another car shall only be used upon the first of such other cars which is available.
- 25. A passenger, not being an artizan mechanic or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Corporation, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artizans mechanics or daily labourers.

Traffic on Roads.

- 26. Every person in charge of a horse standing or travelling in any road in the said borough in which the tramways are laid, and whether such horse is attached to a vehicle or not, shall at once signal any car meeting, overtaking, or running alongside or in front of him if such horse becomes restless or alarmed.
- 27. In case of any horse or vehicle standing or travelling on any part of a road in the said borough in which the Tramways are laid so as not to leave sufficient space for any car on the Tramways to pass, the person in charge of such horse or vehicle shall immediately on the approach of any car, with all reasonable despatch, cause such horse or vehicle to be removed so as not to obstruct the car.
- 28. No person shall in any way impede or interfere with the traffic on the tramways.
- 29. No person in charge of a horse or vehicle shall, in any road in the said borough in which the tramways are laid, cross the tramways in front of an approaching car without giving sufficient warning to the driver or conductor of his intention so to do.
- 30. All slow-going traffic on any road in the said borough in which the tramways are laid shall be kept as near to the side of the said road as is practicable unless sufficient reason be shown to the centrary. Provided that nothing in this Bye-law contained shall be deemed to confer on the Corporation any preferential rights to the use of the roadway between the rails.
- 31. At crossings of roads in the said borough in which the tramways are laid, slow-going traffic which may have to be brought to a stand shall keep to the side of the road. Any vehicle intending to go down a side street which shall necessitate such vehicle crossing the tramways, shall keep its own side of the street until abreast of the side street down which such vehicle is to be taken or turned and then cross over the tramways direct.

- 32. When it is necessary that a vehicle shall stand on any road in the said borough in which the tramways are laid, it shall be drawn close to the side of the said road and shall be kept there no longer than can be reasonably avoided. Any police constable may order the person in charge of a standing vehicle which has been obstructing the traffic for an undue time to move it to some place where it will not obstruct the traffic, and such person shall thereupon move the said vehicle accordingly.
- 33. In the event of any vehicle breaking down on any road in the said borough in which the tramways are laid, or of any load falling from a vehicle in any such road, the person in charge of the vehicle shall immediately remove the vehicle or load from the road, and if he fails to do so any police constable may remove such vehicle or load.
- 34. The driver of any vehicle who intends to turn out of the line of traffic in which he is then driving shall, when practicable, give a signal by holding up his hand or whip to other drivers who may be following him.

Interference with the duties of the Conductor, or Driver, or Motor-man.

35. No person other than the conductor, or driver, or motor-man shall change or remove the route indicators, or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, switches, ventilators, trolley cord, or any part of a car or its equipment, or signal a car to start.

Conductors and Drivers, or Motor-men to enforce Bye-laws.

36. Every conductor, driver, and motor-man shall, to the best of his ability, enforce these Bye-laws and Regulations and prevent the breach thereof.

Obstructing Officials in execution of duty.

37. No passenger or other person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty, upon or in connection with any car or the tramways.

Power to remove Passengers committing offence.

38. Any person who shall commit whilst in or upon any car any offence against or any breach of any of the foregoing Bye-laws or Regulations, numbered respectively, 5, 6, 9, 10, 11, 12, 14, 17, 18, 20, 21, 22, 35 and 37, shall in addition to being liable to a penalty be liable to be immediately removed from the car, and if such person shall have paid his fare shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of his fare so paid, and if such person fail to leave the car when requested to do so by the conductor it shall be lawful for the conductor or any other officer or servant of the Corporation or any police constable to remove such person from the car.

Penalties.

Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of the foregoing Bye-laws and Regulations, shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding forty shillings.

These Bye-laws and Regulations shall come into force on the first day of October, 1903.
