## THE FAIRS ACT, 1873.

### LEEK FAIRS.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that by Resolution dated the 1st September, 1903, a representation has been duly made to him by the Leek Urban District Council that Fairs have been annually held on the 3rd and 28th July, at Leek, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that such Fairs should in future be held on the first and last Wednesdays in the said month of July.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, a copy of the following Notices relating to quarantine, issued by the Governor of Malta:—

Government Notice. No. 197.

His Excellency the Governor, acting on the advice of the Council of Health, has been pleased to direct that Government Notice No. 178 of the 17th August, 1903, shall be cancelled, and that the following regulations shall henceforth be observed, viz.:—

1. All animals of the species mentioned below intended for importation into these Islands, must be accompanied by certificate from the British Consular Authority, or, where there is no such authority, from the local Government Authority, stating that no infectious or contagious disease affecting such animals has been officially reported at the places of origin and embarkation, during the three months immediately preceding the date of embarkation.

2. No animals of the species mentioned below shall be allowed to be landed, unless the consignee shall have applied for, and obtained, before shipment, the necessary permission for their importation. Such application shall imply that the consignee has bound himself to abide by any regulations which may be in force on the day of importation, or which may thereafter be issued, and also to pay all fees and expenses usually levied on each animal at the Lazaretto.

3. Vessels arriving at this Island, having on board more than 250 head of cattle (bovine) are to go into the quarantine harbour, and the cattle are to be inspected in the cattle enclosures of the Lazaretto.

4. Vessels which have, or have had, on board animals suffering from any contagious or infectious disease shall be disinfected in such manner as the Superintendent of the Public Health Department may direct. Should such

disinfection be objected to, the vessels will be subject to quarantine, pending disinfection, on their return to Malta.

### I. Cattle.

#### [A] Bovine.

5. The importation of bovines from Continental Italy, and from Mersina, and the other Ports in the Vilayet of Adana is prohibited.

#### [B] Ovine.

7. The importation of ovines from Continental Italy, and from Mersina, and the other Ports in the Vilayet of Adana is prohibited.

8. Ovines imported from the countries mentioned below will be subjected to the restrictions hereunder stated:

### II. Equines.

9. Horses, mules, and asses from all countries will be landed in quarantine, and will be subjected to the mallein test, if it is considered necessary. Such animals will not be released from quarantine before the Veterinary Surgeon declares them healthy.

### III. Swine.

10. The importation of swine from Sicily, and from Mersina, and the other Ports in the Vilayet of Adana is prohibited.

11. Swine imported from the countries hereunder mentioned is subjected to the following restrictions:

The importation is also forbidden of:

12. Animal of the species mentioned in this Notice arriving from any place, if affected with any disease, in view of which, in the opinion of the Chief Government Medical Officer, their importation might prove detrimental to other animals already in the Island.

13. Wool, hides, skins, horns, bones, and hoofs from Continental Italy, Sicily, and from countries where epidemic diseases are reported.

### Government Notice. No. 198.

His Excellency the Governor, acting on the advice of the Council of Health, has been pleased to repeal Government Notice No. 157 of the 31st July, 1903, and to direct that the

following regulations be observed as regards vessels and passengers, viz. :—

#### Infected Places.

1. The following countries and ports are declared to be infected:—

- (a.) Arabia (excepting Perim and Aden);
- (b.) China;
- (c.) India;
- (d.) Egypt (except Suez and Port Said);
- (e.) Syria;
- (f.) All ports in the Persian Gulf.

#### Infected Vessels.

2. Infected vessels are vessels which have, or have had, on board, during the voyage or the preceding 20 days, cases of cholera, yellow fever, plague, or any disease with symptoms which, in the opinion of the Chief Government Medical Officer, resemble the symptoms of the said diseases.

Vessels which are not allowed to enter the Harbour, but are allowed to communicate with Quarantine Establishments.

#### 3. Infected vessels.

4. Vessels with pilgrims from the East, which do not carry a recognized Medical Officer.

5. Vessels from infected places, which do not carry a recognized Medical Officer.

#### Vessels allowed to load in Quarantine.

6. Infected vessels carrying a recognized Medical Officer, and not having on board an actual case of any of the diseases mentioned in clause 2 on board.

7. Vessels with pilgrims from the East which carry a recognized Medical Officer.

8. Vessels from infected places not having on board an actual case of any of the diseases mentioned in clause 2, when arriving within 10 days from date of departure.

9. Vessels arriving at Malta without a clean bill of health.

#### Vessels from Infected Places admitted to Pratique.

10. Vessels without a clean bill of health, or from infected places, will be admitted to pratique after 10 days from date of departure.

N.B.—Vessels arriving from Port Said and Suez will not be subjected to the 10 days' restriction.

#### Pilots allowed to board Vessels.

11. Pilots will be allowed to board the vessels referred to in clauses 6, 7, 8, and 9 for the purpose of taking them into the Quarantine Harbour, subject to the following conditions:—

(a) The pilot shall go direct from his boat to the bridge, without holding communication with any person except the Officers and crew of the vessel, and after the vessel is moored, shall be taken in one of her boats to the Lazaretto, where his clothes and person shall be disinfected.

(b) To prevent communication or contact with passengers, the Master of the vessel shall cause the portion of the deck over which the pilot has to pass to be roped off, and shall exclude from such space and from the bridge all persons except the Officers and crew of the vessel so long as the pilot is on board.

#### Medical Inspection.

12. All vessels and passengers are subject to medical inspection on arrival.

#### Passengers.

13. Passengers, before landing, must declare on oath before a Marine Police Officer that they have not been in, or have not communicated with, an infected place within the last 10 days. Otherwise they shall remain in quarantine till the expiration of 10 days from the date of departure.

14. Passengers arriving on board vessels without a clean bill of health, and the Officers of such vessels, will be permitted to land after medical inspection, but will not be permitted to land any of their luggage or effects until the same shall have been thoroughly disinfected. This clause does not apply to deck passengers.

15. Passengers arriving from infected places, after 10 days from date of departure will be admitted to free pratique after strict medical inspection and thorough disinfection of their persons, effects, and luggage, if the inspecting Medical Officer is satisfied that they are in good health; but, in the case of vessels carrying a doctor, disinfection of the person will not be required.

16. Passengers not otherwise provided for are subjected to the restrictions applicable to the vessels on which they arrive.

17. When 20 days have elapsed from the last case of plague, cholera, or other disease against which restrictions have been in force with regard to a country or place declared to be an infected place, a notice will be issued by the Collector of Customs to the effect that the place or port is no longer to be dealt with as infected.

N.B.—Vessels passing through the Suez Canal without taking on board either cargo or passengers, will not be considered infected by contact with Canal Pilots taken on board from a disinfection station or by coaling and provisioning at Suez or Port Said, provided that the quarantine restrictions at those ports are considered satisfactory by the Chief Government Medical Officer.

The word "passengers," as used in this notice, except in clause 14, includes the officers and crew of vessels.
