The following Address was presented to His Majesty on the occasion of Their Majesties' visit to the Incorporated Law Society's Hall in Chancery-lane, on Wednesday, the 23rd March, to inaugurate the new wing added to that

May it please Your Majesties,

We, Your most loyal subjects, the President, Vice-President, and Council of the Law Society, desire, on behalf of the members of our profession, to offer the assurance of our affection to Your Majesties, and of our loyalty and devotion to the Throne, and to tender our sincere thanks for Your having graciously consented to open the new wing of this Hall.

Our profession was, until the year 1831, unrepresented, save by a Society established in 1739, which was confined to London alone. That Society had no Hall of its own; but by Charter granted by Your Royal Predecessor, King William IV, the Law Society, as it practically now exists, including both London and the provinces, was formed for the purpose of promoting professional improvement and facilitating moting professional improvement and facilitating the acquisition of legal knowledge.

This Charter was surrendered in the year 1845 to Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, who was graciously pleased to grant a new Charter, which greatly improved the position of the Society's original constitution.

This Charter has been on two occasions supplemented by other Charters conferring further powers.

The Legislature has been pleased to confer upon the Law Society important duties with reference to the improvement of the profession, the acquisition of legal knowledge, the examination of students, the admission to the pro-fession, the keeping of the Roll of Solicitors, and aiding in maintaining honourable practice.

The Council has thus been enabled, amongst

question of legal education in London, in the great Provincial centres, and throughout the country, and the Council is now co-operating with the Inns of Court with the object of establishing a School of Law.

For the furtherance of these purposes it has recently become necessary for the Society to make large additions to their building, which will, it is trusted, enable the Society, comprising over 8,000 members, more effectually to carry out the important duties which have been entrusted to it.

As loyal servants of Your Majesties, and Solicitors of the Supreme Court, we shall be greatly encouraged by Your gracious visit to continue to discharge faithfully the important duties with which the Society has been entrusted, and to the utmost of our power to aid in maintaining and improving the administration of justice.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:-

"I thank you for your loyal and dutiful Address.

" It gives Me much pleasure to inaugurate this fine wing which the Law Society have added to their Hall to provide better accommodation for their various requirements; and I look upon the improvement as an assurance that the Society are determined to meet fully the responsibilities laid upon them by statute and by Royal Charters. The furtherance of a sound legal education among Solicitors, not only in this city, but throughout the country, is one of the most important duties entrusted to the Society. The increased facilities which this new building offers with its spacious halls for examinations and lectures, and its library, must do much to assist in promoting the objects which the Society have in view. I have the greatest interest in the advancement of your profession, knowing how much you contribute to other things, to give earnest attention to the | the proper administration of Our laws; and I am

glad to see that you have been able to find your additional accommodation in so central a position and so close to My Royal Courts of Justice.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of the following Quarantine Proclamation, dated March 5, which has been issued by the Governor of Louisiana:

Quarantine Proclamation for the year 1904. Published by the Louisiana State Board of Health. State of Louisiana, Executive Department.

At the request of the Board of Health of the State of Louisiana, embodied in a resolution adopted by that body at a regular meeting held March 1, 1904, and by virtue of the authority vested in me by law, I, William Wright Heard, Governor of the State of Louisiana, do hereby issue this, my proclamation, to take effect on and after the first day of April, 1904 (all vessels arriving at the mouth of the Mississippi River after six o'clock P.M., March 31, to be included).

That all vessels arriving at the several quarantine stations of Louisiana, together with their cargoes, crews, passengers and baggage, shall be subjected to inspection and sanitation according

to the following schedule:
First Class.—Vessels which are not included in the following classes shall be subjected to necessary maritime sanitation without detention of either vessels or persons longer than may be necessary to place such vessels in good sanitary condition.

Second Class.—Vessels arriving from suspected ports (Intertropical, American and West Indian and Brazilian ports) which, in the absence of satisfactory information to the contrary, are considered suspicious, and other ports which may be decided suspicious by the Board of Health, shall be subjected to full sanitation at the Mississippi River Quarantine Station, together with detention of the vessel and persons for such length of time as the Board of Health may determine.

Third Class.—Vessels arriving from ports known to be infected shall be subjected to full sanitation at the Mississippi River Quarantine Station, and shall be detained for observation, together with their crews, cargoes and passengers, for such length of time after completion of disinfection as

the Board of Health may determine.

Fourth Class.—Vessels which, without regard to Ports of Departure, are infected, that is to say, vessels which have yellow fever, cholera or other contagious or infectious diseases on board at the time of arrival, or have had same on voyage, shall proceed at once to the lazaretto to land their sick, and they shall proceed to the Mississippi River Quarantine Station there to undergo thorough disinfection and be detained, together with passengers, crews and cargoes, for such length of time as the Board of Health may determine.

All vessels arriving from ports known or suspected to be infected with cholera, or bubonic

plague, shall be subjected to maritime sanitation and such detention as the Board of Health may determine.

Vessels arriving from ports and places belonging to the second, third, and fourth classes, as set forth in the above schedules, shall not be allowed to pass the Rigolets, Lake Borgne Canal, Atchafalaya or Calcasieu Quarantine Stations, or other Quarantine Stations which may be hereafter established, without having undergone proper maritime sanitation at the Mississippi River Quarantine Station.

Vessels engaged in the Tropical Fruit Trade, whose sanitary condition and health record are satisfactory may be allowed to pass the Mississippi River Quarantine Station after inspection under such regulations and sanitary treatment as the

Board of Health may prescribe. Quarantine Officers at the several Stations of this State are especially charged and required to strictly enforce the articles of this proclamation.

The State Board of Health is requested to prosecute vigorously all violators of the same, as well as of the Quarantine Laws and Regulations of this State.

Resolution adopted April 24th, 1895, and still in force.

Hereafter full quarantine restrictions will be imposed on all vessels whose officers wilfully attempt deception in regard to any case of sickness, or material capable of carrying infection, or wilfully disregard the rules and regulations of the Board of Health; and such detention will be imposed thereafter on every vessel on which any officer who has previously attempted to practise deception is found in any official capacity.

Special Instructions to Owners, Agents, Masters of Vessels, and Passengers.

The Louisiana State Board of Health recommends the following suggestions to agents, owners, masters of vessels, and passengers, for the purpose of facilitating the work of quarantine officers and reducing the period of detention to a minimum.

- 1. That vessels should be stripped during the quarantine seasons of all woollen hangings, car-pets, curtains, and such like materials, and upholstered furniture as far as practicable. Hair or moss mattresses to be replaced by wire or
- 2. That, as far as possible, vessels trading with tropical ports should be manned with acclimated crews.
- 3. Drinking water for use on vessels should not be taken from rivers or streams in intertropical countries.
- 4. Masters of vessels, ship and consular agents, are earnestly requested to instruct passengers from quarantinable ports to dispense, as far as possible, with baggage which may be injured by wetting or heat (230° F.) while undergoing Such passengers are specially disinfection.

6. When practicable, cargoes should be loaded in such a manner as to allow access to the pumps, and also to enable the quarantine officers

to pump out and wash the bilge.

7. For the purpose of avoiding delay and expense at quarantine, owing to the necessity of shifting of cargo for the object of disinfection, it is recommended that there be constructed in all vessels from quarantined ports, an open framework shaft, fifteen inches in diameter, from the centre of each hatch, through which the fumigating pipe may be introduced down to the dunnage of the vessel.

8. Special attention should be given to cleanliness of vessels and persons, and provisions should be made for all possible ventilation of the Instructions for using disinfecentire vessel. tants can be obtained by application to the

Board of Health or Quarantine officers.

9. Masters should, before arrival, see that the bilge is thoroughly pumped out and cleansed, and that the entire vessel be put in such good sanitary condition as to permit of the least possible detention. Fruit vessels, particularly, should be kept thoroughly cleansed for the purpose of avoiding delay at the Quarantine Station.

10. Vessels observing the above recommendations will receive special consideration at the Quarantine Station, detention for the purpose of cleansing, disinfecting, etc., being materially lessened thereby.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated March 22, from His Majesty's Representative at Constantinople, stating that, owing to an outbreak of cholera at Bagdad and Basra, the Constantinople Board of Health, have decided that the following measures will be taken for the control of the Tigris and Shatt-ul-Arab:—The Quarantine Station at Garara will remain and will be under the sanitary authorities. Ships leaving Bagdad for the south will undergo medical visit and chemical disinfection (in the absence of a stove) at Garara; on arriving at Basra they will be subject to a second medical visit and steam disinfection in the lazaret of Salahie. Ships ascending the river from Basra will undergo the same measures in the reverse order, that is to say, they will be subject to a medical visit and steam disinfection at Salahie before leaving Basra, and to a second medical visit and, if necessary, chemical disinfection on arriving at Garara. The five days' quarantine at Kermet Ali for ships ascending the river will be discontinued, and the lazaret closed. Indian passengers for Bagdad will, therefore, do their ten days' quarantine, as before, at Salahie, instead of being transferrred to Kermet Ali.

Shemans Grund, a detached shoal, with a least depth of 12 feet over it, is situated in a position from which Enskar lighthouse bears S. 72° E., distant 5½ miles, and the western extremity of Wakkari N. 44° E.; this shoal is 180 yards long and 120 yards wide, and is marked on its south-eastern edge by a red and white spar buoy surmounted by an upturned and a down-turned red broom, moored in a depth of  $6\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms.
