The Board of Trade have received a copy of the following Notice, dated December 19, issued by the Governor of Malta:—

Government Notice. No. 287.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by Ordinances No. V of 1866 and No. I of 1875, His Excellency the Governor—with a view to preventing the spread of glanders or farcy, which has lately appeared among animals of the equine species, and which, in the opinion of the Council of Health, is a disease communicable by contagion or infection—has been pleased to make the following regulations:—

1. In these regulations the word "horse" includes ponies, mules, asses, and all animals of the equine species.

2. The Government Veterinary Surgeon, or any person appointed by the Government for the purpose, shall, as frequently as he may deem it expedient, inspect any horse which is believed to be diseased and any place in which horses are kept, and it shall be lawful for any Police Officer not below the rank of Sub-Inspector to enforce any sanitary measure which the Government Veterinary Surgeon or any person appointed by the Government may deem it expedient to order.

3. No complaint against any order given under the provision of the preceding article shall be taken into consideration by the Head of the Government, unless it be forwarded through the Officer from whom that order emanated.

Unless the Government Veterinary Surgeon or other person on whose advice the order was given recommends its immediate execution, the Police shall refrain from taking any step for enforcing the order complained of, until the decision of the Head of the Government is communicated to them.

4. Every owner of horses shall, without delay, report at the nearest police station the death of any horse in his possession or the appearance of any disease or any symptoms of disease among horses in his possession.

The same duty lies upon any person who shall, in any way, come to know of the appearance of any disease among horses.

When a report to the above effect has been made by one person, the duty of all other persons to make such report with regard to the same animal shall cease. But no one shall be excused, if he fails to make such report, on the ground that he believed that the report had been made by another person.

5. It shall be lawful for any Police Officer not below the rank of Sub-Inspector who observes in any horse any symptom of disease, or to whom, on information received from trustworthy persons, it shall appear that there are reasons for suspecting that any horse is diseased, to order the removal of such horse and of any straw, hay, or other articles which may cause the propagation of the disease, as well as the fumigation of the stall or other place in which the animal was, or into which it may have passed, or to prohibit the removal from such place of such animal or of any of the things aforesaid, and to prohibit any communication with such place.

6. Any animal which, on a report from the Government Veterinary Surgeon, shall be declared by the chief Government Medical Officer and two Government Medical Officers to be suffering from glanders or farcy shall be, at once, destroyed by order of the Police.

7. Whenever any Police Officer shall have prohibited communication with any stall or other place under Art. 5, such prohibition shall imply that no person shall go out of such place and that no animal of any species or any other thing shall be taken therefrom, without permission from the Government Veterinary Surgeon.

8. Any animal which is conveyed out of any place referred to in the preceding Article without permission from the Government Veterinary Surgeon, or which goes out of such place, may be destroyed by any person, while out of such place.

Any person who goes out of such place without permission shall be forthwith arrested and placed in quarantine at the Lazaretto under such restrictions and for such period as the Chief Government Medical Officer may deem necessary.

9. No one shall bury any horse or part of a horse which has died from glanders or farcy, or remove it from the place in which it died, until it has been visited by the Government Veterinary Surgeon or other person appointed for the purpose, unless the burial be necessary to avoid the spreading of such disease, or a nuisance to the public.

10. No one shall remove from the place in which any horse has died, any straw, hay, or other things without permission from the Government Veterinary Surgeon.

11. If any order given under these regulations by any of the Officers mentioned in Article 2 be not fully carried out by the person to whom it was given, it shall be carried out by the police, who shall institute proceedings against the offender according to law.

12. Any order given by a person authorized under these regulations to give such order with a view to preventing the spreading of the disease referred to in the preamble of this Notice, shall be carried out as if it were given by the Head of the Government, even though the power to give such order be not included in any other provision of these regulations.

13. Any order given by any of the persons mentioned in Article 2 may be altered or revoked by such persons or by the Head of the Government; but no application for the alteration or revocation of any such order, shall suspend the execution of the same.

14. Until further notice, no horse shall be landed in either Gozo or Comino from Malta without a permit from the Chief Government Medical Officer.

And whereas the Board of Trade have deter-

mined, with the concurrence of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, that there shall in future be one Official Receiver only for the Bankruptcy Districts of the said Courts.

Now therefore the Board of Trade do hereby revoke the said Orders in so far as they direct that there shall be two Official Receivers for the Bankruptcy Districts of the County Courts holden at Brighton, Hastings, and Lewes and East-bourne, and in so far as they relate to the appointment of Mr. Alexander Mackintosh to be an Official Receiver for the said Districts; but without prejudice to anything done or suffered under the said Orders.

(SWINE -**NEWCASTLE - UPON - TYNE** FEVER) ORDER OF 1904 (No. 2).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) Order of 1996, the Newcastle-upon-Tyne (Swine-Fever) Order of 1904, or the Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland) Order of 1904, swine may be moved from any lair in the city of Newcastle-upon-Tyne licensed or authorised by the Local Authority under those Orders or any of them, to any market or saleyard in the city licensed or authorised by the Local Authority for this purpose; provided that the swine are marked in manner prescribed by the said Orders and accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority.

2. Swine exposed at a market or saleyard in the city licensed or authorised by the Local Authority under the said Orders or any of them shall be moved from the market or saleyard only if marked in the prescribed manner and if accompanied by a Licence of an Inspector of the Local

Authority authorising such movement and only to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse specified in the Licence.

3. Swine moved with a licence under the said Orders or any of them or under this Order from any premises in the city shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence, and shall be there detained until they are slaughtered, but they need not be slaughtered within the period specified in the said Orders or any of them.

4. Swine moved in accordance with the provisions of the Newcastle-upon-Tyne (Swine-Fever) Order of 1904, as modified by this Order, shall not, unless otherwise hereafter expressly provided by Order of the Board, be subject to any restriction on movement of swine imposed by any other Order of the Board or by regulations made by the Local Authority of any district.

5. The provisions of the Newcastle-upon-Tyne Swine-Fever) Order of 1904 specified in the Schedule to this Order are hereby revoked.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-third day of January, nineteen hundred and five.

7. This Order shall be read as one with the Newcastle-upon-Tyne (Swine-Fever) Order of 1904.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: altering General Consolidated Order: Outdoor Labour Test :-

ORSETT UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Orsett Union :-

To the Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised in the said Union ;-

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by a General Order dated the 21st day of December, 1844, the Poor Law Commissioners prescribed Regulations with respect to the administration of the relief of poor persons in certain Unions and Parishes including the **Orsett Union**:

And whereas by a further General Order of the said Commissioners, dated the 24th day of July, 1847, in force in the Orsett Union, the Guardians of the Poor of that Union were required to appoint a Superintendent of Outdoor Labour;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made with regard to the relief of . the Poor and with regard to the services of a Superintendent of Outdoor Labour in the said Union :

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows; that is to say :-

ARTICLE 1. Subject to the provisions of the said General Order dated the twenty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, every able-bodied male pauper who receives outdoor relief within the Union shall be relieved in the following manner; that is to say,

Half at least of the relief given to the pauper shall be given in food, clothing and other articles of necessity.

No such pauper shall receive relief from the Guardians, or any of their officers, or any Overseer of any Parish in the Union, while he is employed for wages or other hire or remuneration by any person; but every such pauper so relieved shall be set to work by the Guardians.

ARTICLE 2. The Guardians shall, within fourteen days after the date of this Order, and from time to time afterwards as the Local Government Board require, report to the Local Government

Board the place or places at which able-bodied male paupers are so set to work in the Union, the sort or sorts of work in which they or any of them are employed, the times and mode of work, and all such other matters relating to the employment of the said able-bodied paupers as the Guardians deem material to be communicated to the Local Government Board, or as the Local Government Board require.

ARTICLE 3. If the Guardians depart, in any particular instance, from any of the regulations hereinbefore contained, and within fifteen days after the said departure, report the same and the grounds thereof to the Local Government Board, and if the Local Government Board approve of that departure, then the relief granted in the particular instance shall, if otherwise lawful, not be deemed to be unlawful, or be subject to be disallowed.

ARTICLE 4. If at any time the number of ablebodied male paupers requiring relief is so small as to render the services of a Superintendent of Outdoor Labour unnecessary, the Guardians, notwithstanding anything in the said General Order dated the twenty-fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, may dispense with the services of such an officer.

Sir William Cospatrick Dunbar, Bart., C.B., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England, have, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, ordered and declared that, on and after the first day of January next, in view of the disso-lution of Barton Regis Poor Law Union and the alterations in Bristol Poor Law Parish and in Chipping Sodbury and Thornbury Poor Law Unions affected by the Bristol Corporation Act, 1904, and in order to make Bristol, Chipping Sodbury, and Thornbury Registration Districts respectively co-extensive with the Poor Law Parish and Unions of the same names as thus altered :--(1) That Barton Regis Registration District shall be dissolved, and its constituent Civil Parishes dealt with in the following manner, viz.:-(a) That the parts of Bristol Civil Parish and County Borough which, prior to the operation of the above-mentioned Act, formed the entire Civil Parishes of Shirehampton and Westbury-on-Trym and part of Henbury Civil Parish shall be together constituted a separate Sub-District of Bristol Registration District to be called and known as Westbury-on-Trym Sub-District; (b) that the part of Bristol Civil Parish and County Borough which, prior to the operation of the above-mentioned Act, formed the Civil Parish of Horfield shall be transferred to Ashley Sub-District of Bristol Registration District; (c) that Henbury Civil Parish (as diminished by the Act) shall be transferred to Almondsbury Sub-District of Thornbury Registration District; and (d) that Filton, Stoke Gifford, and Winterbourne Civil Parishes shall together be constituted a separate Sub-District of Chipping Sodbury Registration District to be called and known as Winterbourne Sub-District. (2) That the Avonmouth portion of Bristol Civil Parish and County Borough (formerly parts of Easton-in-Gordano, Shirehampton, and Henbury Civil Parishes) shall be transferred from Ashley Sub-District of Bristol Registration District to the hereby constituted Westbury-on-Trym Sub-District of the same Registration District.--Witness my hand this 28th day of December, one thousand nine hundred and four.
