Goh Tapaunoi Light—Amended Particulars of.

Information, dated 7th November, 1904, has been received through His Britannic Majesty's Consul, Bangkok, that the light established on Goh Tapaunoi, Puket or Tongka Harbour, is a white flashing light every twenty seconds, and not every two minutes as given in the Admiralty publications; it is elevated 187 feet above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 15 miles.
