WHEREAS in pursuance of the Bishoprics Act, 1878, and the Bishoprics of Southwark and Birmingham Act, 1904, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England on the second day of March one thousand nine hundred and five, certified to His Majesty under their Common Seal, that the annual value of the Southwark Bishopric Endowment Fund, together with the annual sum which will ultimately be derived in pursuance of the above-mentioned Acts from the endowment or income of the Bishopric of Rochester (when calculated in the manner directed by the said Bishoprics Act, 1878, and the First Schedule to the said Bishoprics of Southwark and Birmingham Act, 1904) was not less than three thousand five hundred pounds a year.

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the abovementioned Acts His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Most Honourable Privy Council, to order and declare as follows:

(1.) The Bishopric of Southwark is hereby founded.

(2.) The diocese of the said Bishopric shall consist of the Rural Deaneries of Greenwich, Lewisham, Woolwich, Battersea, Camberwell, Clapham, Dulwich (except the parishes within the Urban District of Penge), Kennington, Lam-beth, Newington, Southwark, Barnes, Beddington, Caterham, Godstone, Kingston, Reigate, Richmond, Streatham, and Wandsworth, and of such other parishes as shall be transferred to the diocese in pursuance of the Bishoprics of Southwark and Birmingham Act, 1904.

(3.) The Parish Church of Saint Saviour Southwark in the county of London subject to the rights of the patron and incumbent of such church, shall be the Cathedral Church of the said

Bishopric.

(4.) The Bishop of Southwark is constituted a body corporate and is hereby invested with all such rights, privileges, and jurisdictions as are possessed by any other Bishop in England, and is subjected to the metropolitan jurisdiction of the Archbishop of Canterbury.

(5.) This Order shall come into operation on

the first day of May next.

THEREAS by section twenty-six of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, "chapelries, and other places or districts may be " separated from the parishes or mother churches "to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may in some " instances with advantage be annexed to parishes " or districts to which they are contiguous, or be "constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical

"That when with respect to his own diocese it " shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, "or when the Bishop of any diocese shall re-"present to the said Archbishop that any such "tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district "within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the "diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, "may be advantageously separated from any "parish or mother church, and either be con-"stituted a separate benefice by itself, or be united to any other parish to which it may be "more conveniently annexed, or to any other "adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial, or extra-parochial, so as to "form a separate parish or benefice, or that any "extra-parochial place may with advantage be " annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, " or be constituted a separate parish for eccle-" siastical purposes; and the said Archbishop or "Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing "(the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted "to the said Archbishop for his consideration) "describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and "how the changes consequent on such alteration "in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe "lands, tithes, rent charges, and other ecclesias-"tical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect "to patronage and rights to pews, may be made "with justice to all parties interested; and if "the patron or patrons of the benefice or bene-"fices to be affected by such alteration shall "consent in writing under his or their hands to "such scheme, or to such modification thereof "as the said Archbishop may approve, and the "said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and "inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or "modification thereof, and shall certify the same " and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to "His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for "His Majesty in Council to make an Order for "carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, " as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas the Right Reverend Francis, Lord Bishop of Oxford, hath, pursuant to the enactment aforesaid, made a representation in writing to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop

of Canterbury, as follows:

"I Francis by Divine permission Bishop of Oxford do in pursuance of the twenty-sixth section of the Pluralities Act 1838, hereby

represent to your Grace as follows:

'1. There is in the county of Oxford and my diocese of Oxford the vicarage of Swaldliffe the ecclesiastical parish whereof comprises the civil parish of Swalcliffe with a population of two hundred and fifty-five the civil parish of Epwell with a population of two hundred and seventeen the civil parish of West Shutford with a population of two hundred and seventy-one and the civil parish of East Shutford with a population of twelve the whole of such benefice of Swalcliffe containing a total population of seven hundred and fifty-five and has three churches all of which have to be served by the vicar of Swalcliffe. The net annual value of the said benefice is one hundred and twenty-one pounds four shillings and seven pence or thereabouts.

"2. There is also in the said county and diocese the perpetual curacy of Sibford Gower the ecclesiastical parish whereof contains a population of six hundred and forty-nine. The net annual value of this benefice is one hundred and eighty-seven pounds three shillings and four

pence or thereabouts.

"3. The portion or district of the said parish

Epwell the boundaries of which are well known and defined lies at a distance of about three miles from the parish church of Swalcliffe and about one and a half miles from the parish church of Sibford Gower and has a church with accommodation for two hundred and fifty.

"4. That upon the scheme hereinafter set forth taking effect the patrons have arranged to grant to the benefice of Swalcliffe an annual sum of fifty pounds charged upon the lands belonging to them in the said parish of Swalcliffe subject to a grant being made by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England to meet such benefaction such sum of fifty pounds being in lieu of part of a voluntary contribution of one hundred and fifty pounds hitherto made by the said patrons to the Vicar of Swalcliffe.

"5. It appears to me that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act. 1838, the said district or civil parish of Epwell may be advantageously separated from the said parish of Swalcliffe and united to the said parish of Sibford Gower to

which it is contiguous.

"6. The benefice of Swalcliffe and the benefice of Sibford Gower are both in the patronage of the Warden and Scholars of New College Oxford.

"7. The Reverend Canon Thomas Jordan Moulder is the present Incumbent of the benefice of Swalcliffe and the Reverend Archibald James Moxon is the present Incumbent of the benefice of Sibford Gower.

8. Pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the first-mentioned Act of Parliament I the said Bishop have therefore drawn up a scheme in writing annexed to this representation describing the mode in which it appears to me the proposed alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent thereon in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and I do hereby submit the same to your Grace together with the consents thereto in writing of the said patrons and Incumbents to the intent that if your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such scheme you may certify the same and such consents by your report to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the consents referred to in the

said representation are as follows:-

"SCHEME.

"That the district and civil parish of Epwell shall be separated from the said parish of Swalcliffe and united for ecclesiastical purposes

to the contiguous parish of Sibford Gower.
"That the Incumbent of the benefice of Sibford Gower shall have the sole and exclusive cure of souls within the said district of Epwell

so annexed to Sibford Gower.

"That the parishioners of such district of Epwell shall cease to be entitled to accommodation in the parish church of Swalcliffe except nevertheless any person or persons possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the said parish church of Swalcliffe and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

'That the inhabitants of Epwell shall have such and the same right (if any) to have marriages baptisms churchings and burials solemnized and performed in the parish church of Sibford Gower for the inhabitants of the said district as they now possess in the parish church of Swalcliffe.

"That all fees dues ecclesiastical offerings and of Swalcliffe comprising the said civil parish of lemoluments arising from the said district shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the benefice of Sibford Gower.

"That the glebe lands in Sibford Gower parish belonging to the benefice of Swalcliffe amounting to sixty-three acres three roods and twenty-four perches and now producing a rent of forty pounds shall be transferred from the benefice of Swalcliffe to the benefice of Sibford Gower with Epwell such transfer being in lieu of a voluntary payment of sixty pounds formerly made by the Vicar of Swalcliffe to the Vicar of Sibford Gower for undertaking the ecclesiastical duties

"That the annual stipend of twenty pounds now charged on and paid by the Vicar of Swal-cliffe to the Vicar of Sibford Gower with Epwell

shall be increased to thirty pounds.

"That the liability of the Vicar of Swalcliffe for the repair of the chancel of Epwell Church attaching to him as Rector of Epwell be transferred to the Vicar of Sibford Gower with Epwell.

"That no alteration shall be made in the patronage of the said benefices or either of them. " F. Oxon.

"CONSENTS.

"The Warden and Scholars of New College Oxford the patrons or persons entitled to present to the benefice of Swalcliffe and to the benefice of Sibford Gower both in the county and diocese of Oxford in case the same or either of them were now vacant, the Reverend Canon Thomas Jordan Moulder and the Reverend Archibald James Moxon the Incumbents respectively of the same benefices hereby respectively signify to your Grace our several consents to the scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained.

"In testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hands this twentieth day of December one

And whereas the said Archbishop, being satisfied with the said scheme, hath certified the same and the consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council by his report dated the eighteenth day of January one thousand nine hundred and five, which said report is in the words and

figures following:—
"We the undersigned Randall Thomas Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury do hereby

report to Your Majesty in Council
"That the Right Reverend Francis Bishop of Oxford has represented unto us (amongst other things)

"That there are in the county of Oxford and his diocese of Oxford the benefice (being a vicarage) of Swalcliffe and the benefice (being a

perpetual curacy) of Sibford Gower.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that a certain portion or district of the said parish of Swalcliffe comprising the civil parish of Epwell the boundaries whereof are well known and defined may be advantageously separated from the said parish of Swalcliffe and annexed to the said parish of Sibford Gower for ecclesiastical purposes only under the provisions of the Pluralities Act 1838.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the said Act the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent upon such alterations in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the Warden and Scholars of New College Oxford the patrons or persons entitled to present to the said benefice of Swalcliffe and to the said benefice of Sibford Gower in case the same or either of them were now vacant the Reverend Canon Thomas Jordan Moulder and the Reverend Archibald James Moxon the Incumbents respectively of the same benefices has been transmitted to us by the said Lord Bishop for our consideration.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents above referred to

are hereunto annexed.

"And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the said Pluralities Act 1838 certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue au Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.

following, that is to say:—
"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fiftyninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter sixty; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Andrew, Catford, situate in the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Laurence, Catford, in the county of Kent, and in the diocese of Rochester.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Andrew, Catford, situate as

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Stuart, Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said new parish of Saint Laurence, Catford, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Andrew, Catford, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Catford.

"And with the like consent of the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Andrew, Catford, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always that so long as the Reverend William John Salt, Clerk in Holy Orders, the present Vicar or Incumbent of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Laurence Catford shall continue to be such Vicar or Incumbent, all the fees which may be received in respect of such publication, solemnization or performance at the said church of Saint Andrew, Catford, situate as aforesaid shall be paid over by the minister thereof to the said William John Salt; and provided also that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Andrew,

Catford, being :-

"All that part of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Laurence, Catford, in the county of Kent, and in the diocese of Rochester, which is bounded upon the south partly by that isolated portion of the parish of Lewisham which includes Southend and partly by the district chapelry of Saint Augustine, Grove Park, Lee, upon the north-east by the new parish of Saint Mildred, Burnt Ash Hill, Lee, upon the north by the new parish of Saint Swithun, Hither Green, Lewisham, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Swithun, Hither Green, Lewisham, from the said new parish of Saint Laurence, Catford, at the junction of Brownhillroad with Saint Fillans-road, and extending thence

for a distance of seventeen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Sandhurst-road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Sandhurstroad for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to its junction with Muirkirk-road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Muirkirkroad for a distance of thirty-five chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Laurence, Catford, from the said isolated portion of the parish of Lewisham.

And whereas the said representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Rochester.

to say:—
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint James, Ealing, situate within the new parish (sometime consolidated chapelry) of Saint John, Ealing Dean, in the county of Middlesex, and in the diocese of London.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of Saint John, Ealing Dean, and of the parish of Hanwell, in the said county and diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such new parish and parish.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said new parish of Saint John, Ealing Dean, and of the said parish of Hauwell, should be formed southward along the middle of Saint Fillans-road | into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical

purposes and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint James, Ealing, situate

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley Bishop of London, as diocesan and also as the patron (in right of his See) as well of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint John, Ealing Dean, as of the rectory of the said parish of Hanwell (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of Saint John, Ealing Dean, and of the said parish of Hanwell which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint James, Ealing, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint James, Ealing

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint James,

Ealing, comprising:—
"All that portion of the new parish (sometime consolidated chapelry) of Saint John, Ealing Dean, in the county of Middlesex, and in the diocese of London, which is bounded upon the west by the parish of Hanwell, upon the north by the new parish of Saint Stephen, Castle Hill, Ealing, both in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the east and upon the south-east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Stephen. Castle Hill, Ealing, from the said new parish of Saint John, Ealing Dean, at the point in the middle of the main line of the Great Western Railway where such line is crossed by the footbridge connecting Drayton Green-lane with Williams-road, and extending thence southward along the middle of the said footbridge for a distance of eighty feet or thereabouts to the point where it meets Williams-road, and extending thence first westward to and then southward along the middle of Williams-road for a distance of fifteen chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with the high road from London to Uxbridge, and extending thence south-eastward and in a straight line across the said high road to the middle of the north-western end of the footpath which leads along the backs of the houses on the north-eastern side of the road called Melbourne-avenue, and extending thence southeastward along the middle of such footpath for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts to the point where it joins Regina-road, and extending thence first south-eastward to and then northeastward along the middle of Regina-road for a distance of one chain and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Westfield - road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Westfield-road for a distance of tifteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Leighton-road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Leighton-road for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footpath leading past the present south-western ends of Hesselroad and Northfield-road to Balfour-road, and

extending thence southward to and along the middle of the last-mentioned footpath for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets Balfour-road and the new road called Northcroft-road running from Balfour-road past the south-western sides of the houses known as Number 58 and Number 57 Salisbury-road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said new road for a distance of two chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Salisbury-road and extending thence south-west-ward along the middle of Salisbury-road for a distance of seven chains or thereahouts to its present south-western end and continuing thence south-westward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of sixteen chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint John, Ealing Dean, from the said parish of Hanwell.

And also all that contiguous portion of the said parish of Hanwell which is bounded upon the north-east by the above-described portion of the said new parish of Saint John, Ealing Dean, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north, upon the north-west, upon the south-west and upon the south-east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint John, Ealing Dean, from the said parish of Hanwell crosses the middle of the high road leading from London to Uxbridge, and extending thence westward along the middle of the said high road for a distance of one chain or thereabouts oits junction with Grosvenor road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Grosvenor-road for a distance of three chains and a half or thereabouts to a point opposite to the north-eastern end of the wall torming the north-western boundary of the house and premises known as Number 2, Grosvenorroad, and extending thence south-westward to and along the said wall for a distance of two chains and three-quarters or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall forming the northeastern boundary of Saint George, Hanoversquare Cemetery, and extending thence south-eastward along the last-mentioned wall for a distance of eleven chains and a half or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the house and premises known as Number 82, Grosvenor-road, and extending thence eastward along the last-mentioned wall or fence for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its eastern end on the western side of Grosvenorroad, and extending thence first eastward to and then southward along the middle of Grosvenorroad for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its junction with Oakland-road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Gakland-road for a distance of one chain and a half or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the boundary which divides the said parish of Hanwell from the said new parish of Saint John, Ealing Dean.'

And whereas the said representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a representation from the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council, dated the sixteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and five, and in the words following,

"The Lords of the Judicial Committee having taken into consideration the practice under which an Appeal to Your Majesty in Council cannot in the absence of a special Order in that behalf made by their Lordships be set down for hearing ex parte as against a Respondent to the Appeal who has failed to enter an Appearance thereto in the Registry of the Privy Council unless the Appellant shall have previously obtained from their Lordships two successive Orders commonly known as 'Appearance Orders' requiring the said Respondent to enter an Appearance to the Appeal within the periods by the said Orders respectively limited and shall have duly published the said Orders by affixing the same on the Royal Exchange and elsewhere in the usual manner and unless the said periods so limited by the said Orders as aforesaid shall have expired. And being of opinion that the said practice is inconvenient and ought in certain cases and subject to certain conditions to be dispensed with Their Lordships do this day agree humbly to recommend to Your Majesty to order as follows, that is to say:

"1. That where a Respondent to an Appeal to Your Majesty in Council whose name has been entered on the Record of the Appeal by the Court admitting the Appeal fails to enter an Appearance to the Appeal in the Registry of the Privy Council and it appears from the Transcript Record in the Appeal or from a Certificate of the Officer of the Court transmitting the said Transcript Record to the Registrar of the Privy Council that the said Respondent has received notice of the Order admitting the Appeal to Your Majesty in Council or of the Order of Your Majesty in Council giving the Appellant special leave to appeal to Your Majesty in Council (as the case may be) and has also received notice of the dispatch of the said Transcript Record to the Registrar of the Privy Council the Appellant shall not subject to any direction by their Lordships to the contrary be required to take out Appearance Orders calling upon the said Respondent to enter an Appearance in the Appeal and the Appeal may subject as aforesaid be set down for hearing ex parte as against the said Respondent at any time after the expiration of three calendar months from the date of the lodging of the Appellant's Petition of Appeal in like manner as if the said Appearance Orders had been taken out by the Appellant and the times thereby respectively limited for the said Respondent to enter an Appearance had expired.

"2. That where a Respondent to an Appeal to Your Majesty in Council whose name has been brought on the Record of the Appeal by an Order of Your Majesty in Council fails to enter an Appearance to the Appeal in the Registry of the Privy Council and it appears from the Transcript Record or from a Supplementary Record in the Appeal or from a Certificate of the Officer of the Court transmitting the said

Transcript Record or Supplementary Record to the Registrar of the Privy Council that the said Respondent has received due notice of any intended application to Your Majesty in Council to bring him on the Record as a Respondent to the Appeal the Appellant shall not subject to any direction by their Lordships to the contrary be required to take out Appearance Orders calling upon the said Respondent to enter an Appearance in the Appeal, and the Appeal may subject as aforesaid be set down for hearing ex parte as against the said Respondent at any time after the expiration of three calendar months from the date on which the said Respondent shall have been served with a copy of Your Majesty's Order in Council bringing him on the Record of the Appeal in like manner as if the said Appearance Orders had been taken out by the Appellant and the times thereby respectively limited for the said Respondent to enter an Appearance had expired.

"3. That nothing herein contained shall be deemed to affect the power of their Lordships to order the Appellant in an Appeal referred by Your Majesty to their Lordships to take out Appearance Orders or to be excused from taking out Appearance Orders in any case in which their Lordships shall think fit so to order and generally to give such directions as to the time at which and the conditions on which an Appeal so referred as aforesaid shall be set down as in the opinion of their Lordships the circumstances

of the case may require.
"4. That this Order shall apply to all Appeals in which the Petition of Appeal shall be lodged

after the date hereof."

His Majesty, having taken the said representation into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve thereof, and of what is therein recommended. Whereof all persons whom it may concern are to take notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

HEREAS it is expedient to amend certain provisions of the Southern Rhodesia Order in Council, 1898.

Now therefore His Majesty is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

I. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Southern Rhodesia Order in Council, 1898, the Secretary of State may appoint one and the same person to hold the respective offices of Resident Commissioner and Commandant-General constituted by the said Order.

II. The person so appointed shall be called the "Resident Commissioner and Commandant-General," and shall have all the powers and duties. and be subject to all the liabilities of the Resident Commissioner and of the Commandant-General respectively prescribed by the said Order

in Council.

III. As often and so long as the aforesaid offices of Resident Commissioner and Commandant-General are held by the same person, sub-sectious five and six of section forty-eight of the said Order shall cease to have effect, provided that in no case shall the Resident Commissioner and Commandant-General take action of the nature of a military operation without the authority of the High Commissioner.

IV. Judicial notice shall be taken of this Order and of the commencement thereof.

V. This Order shall come into operation forthwith and shall be published in the Gazette, and the High Commissioner shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places and in such manner and for such time or times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto.

VI. His Majesty may from time to time revoke, alter, add to, or amend this Order.

VII. This Order may be cited as the Southern Rhodesia Order in Council, 1905.

 - (1.) The term of office of the members of the Registration Council shall be continued for one year beyond the three years specified in paragraph 2 of the Principal Order.
 - (2.) The constitution of the Teachers' Registration Council shall continue to be that provided by paragraph 1 of the Principal Order for one year beyond the three years specified by paragraph 6 of that Order.
 - (3.) This Order shall be deemed to have come into force and have effect as from the sixth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and five.

1894" (which is a section in Part XI of that
Act and which re-enacts similar provisions by
the said Act repealed of the Merchant Shipping
Act, 1854), it is (among other things) enacted
that His Majesty may by Order in Council fix
the establishments to be maintained by each of
the General Lighthouse Authorities on account
of the services of lighthouses, buoys, and
beacons, or the annual or other sums to be paid
out of the Mercantile Marine Fund in respect
of these establishments, and that an increase of
any establishment or part of an establishment so
fixed shall not be made without the consent of
the Board of Trade.

And whereas by section one of the Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1898, it is (among other things) provided that references in Part XI of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, to the Mercantile Marine Fund shall be construed as references to the General Lighthouse Fund by the now reciting Act constituted.

And whereas Her late Majesty, by Orders in Council dated the twenty-eighth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, and the eighth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, was pleased to fix the establishment which might be maintained by the Commissioners of Irish Lights, and the amount of the salaries to be paid to the officers of the said establishment.

And whereas it is expedient that the establishment of the said Commissioners should be varied in manner hereinafter appearing.

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the Board of Trade have consented to such variation of the establishment.

Now, therefore, His Majestv. by virtue of the power vested in Him by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and of any other powers Him thereunto enabling, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to fix as follows, that is to say:—

The establishment of the Commissioners of Irish Lights shall, as from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and four, consist of the officers named in the schedule to this Order at the salaries of which the minimum, annual increase, and maximum are respectively mentioned in the same schedule, but the annual increase of such salaries shall (except in the case of the Secretary, the Engineers and the Inspector of Lights) be only granted on a certificate by the Commissioners of Irish Lights that the preceding period of the officer's service has been distinguished by zeal, industry, and regularity.

Provided that-

- (1) The salary of Mr. Owen Armstrong, the present Secretary, shall be eight hundred pounds per annum.
- (2) While Mr. G. N. McMurdo holds a clerkship on the said establishment, the class of clerks next above the Lower Grade Clerks in the schedule shall be three in number instead of two, and the number of Lower Grade Clerks shall be two instead of three.
- (3) Mr. E. A. Leggett, one of the present Lower Grade Clerks, shall be eligible for

promotion to a clerkship in the class of clerks next above the Lower Grade Clerks in the schedule as from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and four. And His Majesty, by virtue and in further exercise of the powers so vested in Him as

aforesaid, and by and with the advice aforesaid, is further pleased to fix, and doth hereby fix, that the salaries payable under the provisions of this Order shall be paid out of the General Lighthouse Fund.

WHEREAS by the Burial Act, 1857, it is, amongst other things, enacted, that in case it appears to His Majesty in Council, upon the petition of the Local Board of Health of any district established under the Public Health Act, or upon the petition of any Commissioners elected by the ratepayers, and acting under or by virtue of the powers of any Local Act of Parliament for the improvement of any town, parish, or borough, stating that the district of such Local Board of Health or of such Commissioners is coextensive with a district for which it is proposed to provide a burial-ground, and that no Burial Board has been appointed for such district, and that an Order in Council has been made for closing all or any of the burial-grounds within the said district, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, with the advice of His Privy Council, in case Ilis Majesty see fit so to do, to order that such Local Board shall be a Burial Board for the district of such Local Board, or that such Com-missioners shall be a Burial Board for the district of such Commissioners, and thereupon such Local Board or such Commissioners, as the case may be, shall be a Burial Board for such district accordingly, and the powers and provisions of the Acts thereinbefore mentioned (except the provisions relating to the constitution or appointment and resignation of members of Burial Boards), and the provisions therein contained, shall extend to the district of such Board and to such Board, or to the district of such Commissioners and to such Commissioners, and to any burial-ground and places for the reception of the bodies of the dead previously to interment which may be provided by such Board or by such Commissioners, in like manner as to any parish or parishes, and the Burial Board thereof and any burial-ground and any such places as aforesaid

provided by such last-mentioned Board; save that no approval, sanction, or authorization of any vestry shall be requisite; Provided always, that notice of such petition, and of the time when it shall please His Majesty to order the same to be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and in one of the newspapers usually circulating in the district of such Local Board or of such Commissioners, one month at least before such petition is so considered:

And whereas by the Local Government Act, 1894, Urban Sanitary Authorities became Urban District Councils, and their Districts Urban Districts:

And whereas the Urban District Council of Beaconsfield presented a petition to His Majesty in Council, stating that the district of the said Council is co-extensive with the district for which it is proposed to provide a burial-ground, that no Burial Board has been appointed for such district, and that an Order in Council was made on the seventh day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, for closing, for burials, the Parish Church of Beaconsfield and the old part of the churchyard, and the Congregational Chapel and chapelyard at Beaconsfield, and praying that His Majesty would order that the said Urban District Council should be a Burial Board for the Urban District of such Council:

And whereas notice of such petition, and of the time when His Majesty was pleased to order the same to be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, has been duly published as required by the said first recited Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said Urban District Council for the Urban District of Beaconsfield shall be a Burial Board for such Urban District, in accordance with the provisions of the Burial Act, 1857.

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Balliol College, Oxford, on the twentythird day of November, one thousand nine hundred and four (and sealed on eighth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and five), has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":

STATUTE to alter and amend the Statutes framed by the Commissioners appointed under "The Universities of Oxford and Caufbridge Act, 1877" (40 and 41 Vict., c. 48), and approved by Her late Majesty in Council on the third day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, in relation to Balliol College, in the

niversity of Oxford.

In the matter of a Statute concerning "The Scholars and Exhibitioners" such amending Statute being duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose, held on the twenty-third day of November, one thousand nine hundred and four, and passed by the unanimous vote of those present:-

In Statute IV, Clause 9, the words "two years" where they last occur shall be struck out and the words "one year" shall be substituted, and after the words "two years" where they

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 20th ! last occur the following words shall be inserted:-"At the end of this period if the Master and Fellows shall by resolution have declared themselves satisfied with the industry and good conduct of the Scholar or Exhibitioner the tenure of his Scholarship or Exhibition shall be renewed for a further term of one year."

In Clause 12 of the same Statute the words "The Blundell Scholarships and the Newte" shall be struck out and the word "The" shall be substituted; in the same clause after the word "regulations" the words "contained in Clauses 9, 10, and 11 of this Statute and also to the regulations" shall be inserted; and in the same clause the words "and that Schedule shall have effect as part of these Statutes" shall be struck

After Clause 12 the following two new clauses

shall be added:

"The Blundell Scholarships and the Newte Exhibition shall be subject to the regulations contained in Schedule B of these Statutes.

"Schedule B shall have effect as part of these

Statutes."

For Schedule B §§ 1 and 2 the following single clause shall be substituted :--

"1. Blundell Scholarships and Newte's Exhibition.

"(a) There shall be five Scholarships within the College, called Blundell Scholarships, to each of which shall be attached an annual stipend of not less than sixty pounds, and there shall be one exhibition called the Newte Exhibition to which shall be attached an annual stipend of forty-eight pounds ten shillings and six pence.

"(b) The Master and Fellows shall not be

bound to fill up more than one Blundell Scholar-

ship in any one year.

"(c) The elections to the Blundell Scholarships and to the Newte Exhibition shall be held at Mr. Peter Blundell's School at Tiverton in the county of Devon, on such day in each year between the fifteenth and thirty-first days of July, both inclusive, as the Master and Fellows appoint, after a competitive examination of the candidates in subjects connected with the studies of the School.

"(d) Notice of the day appointed for the election shall be given not less than thirty days reviously by the Master of the College to the

Head Master of the School.

"(e) The examination shall be conducted by three Examiners, one appointed by the Master and Fellows, another (not being a Master of the School) by the Governing Body of the School. and the third by the Master and Fellows of Sidney Sussex College in the University of Cambridge, or, in default of appointment by them, by the Master and Fellows of Balliol

"(f) The expenses of the Examiner or Examiners appointed by the Master and Fellows of Balliol College shall be defrayed out of the corporate

revenues of the College.
"(g) No person shall be admitted as a candidate (1) for a Blundell Scholarship who has not been educated at the School for the three years immediately preceding the election or who has attained the age of nineteen years; (2) for a Newte Exhibition who has not been educated at the School for the two years immediately pre-ceding the election; (3) for either a Scholarship or an Exhibition whom the said Governing Body do not deem to be a proper candidate, having regard to his moral character and pecuniary circumstances.

"(h) The Examiners shall elect that candidate who on the Examination appears to them to be of the greatest merit, and most fit to be a Scholar

of the College.

"(i) The Blundell Scholarships, and the Exhibition of the foundation of John Newte, shall be tenable until the beginning of the term following the expiration of two years from the day of the election of each Scholar and Exhibitioner, and shall then determine, unless the Master and Fellows have by resolution, declared themselves satisfied with the industry and good conduct of the Scholar or Exhibitioner, in which case the tenure of the Scholarship or Exhibition shall be renewed for a further term of three years, to be reckoned from the expiration of two years from the day of his election.

"(k) Before declaring themselves satisfied with the industry and good conduct of any Scholar or Exhibitioner the Master and Fellows shall receive and consider a Report concerning him laid before them by the Tutors and Lecturers of the College at or immediately before the stated meeting.

"(I) Nothing herein contained shall prevent the exercise at any time, for any sufficient cause, of the powers of deprivation, and of inflicting fines,

next hereinafter mentioned.

"(m) The holders of these Scholarships and Exhibitions shall be liable to deprivation, or fine by the loss of part of their emoluments, by the same authority, for the same causes and in the same manner, as the Scholars of the College."

In Schedule B, § 5 (Greaves Exhibition) the paragraph beginning with the words "The Exhibitions of the foundations of John Warner down to the end of the clause shall be struck out.

In Schedule B, § 5 (General) all the words from the beginning down to the word "College" where it secondly occurs shall be struck out; and at the end of this clause the following words shall be added:—" Any provisions heretofore in this Schedule or in the principal Statutes to the contrary notwithstanding."

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of University College, Oxford, on the eleventh day of March, one thousand nine hundred and five (and sealed on thirteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and five), has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—
Ex parte the Master and Fellows of the Great

Hall of the University commonly called University College in the University of

Oxford.

A STATUTE to amend the Ordinance in relation to the Travelling Fellowships of the Foundation of Dr. John Radcliffe, framed by the Com-missioners appointed under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 (40 and 41 Vic., c. 48), in relation to the College of the Great Hall of the University commonly called University College, in the University of Oxford, duly made at an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Master and Fellows, being the Governing Body of the said College, specially summoned for this purpose, held on the eleventh day of March, one thousand nine hundred and five, and passed at such meeting by the unanimous votes of those present and voting, and submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council.

Whereas the Ordinance regulating the Radcliffe Travelling Fellowships forms an integral part of the Statutes of University College, and the power of amending it rests with the College, as in the case of the other Statutes, and whereas the College has been informed by the Board of the Faculty of Medicine of the University that the restriction of the Fellowships to candidates who have won certain specified honours in the University excludes from the benefit of Dr. Radcliffe's foundation many men whose work for the advance of medical science it is highly desirable to recognize

We, therefore, the Master and Fellows of University College in the University of Oxford, desiring to carry out the wishes of the Medical Board, hereby, in exercise of the power given us by the 54th section of the said Act, and by Statute XI of the Statutes of the said College:

In the first place alter and amend paragraph 3 of the Ordinance relating to Dr. Radcliffe's Travelling Fellows, by substituting for all the words following the words "Batchelor of Medicine and" the words "shall not have exceeded four years from the time of passing the last Examination required for the above-named

Degree.'

And in the second place, whereas the surplus of the fund arising from vacancies and other sources, and allocated by the Ordinance to the increase of the stipends of the Fellows after meeting the expenses of Examination, is insufficient to allow of any substantial addition to those stipends, and might, in the opinion of the College, be much more usefully employed for the advancement of medical science in other ways, such as the establishment of a yearly prize or prize essay, or the assistance and remuneration of definite pieces of research among the

younger members of the profession.
