The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty chapter ninety-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme or representation bearing date the ninth day of March, in the year one thousand nine hundred and five, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Low Town, Tynemouth, and of the new parish of Western Town, Tynemouth, both in the county of Northumberland, and in the diocese of Newcastle.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-sixth day of October in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty and published in the London Gazette on the thirtieth day of the same month, three separate districts for spiritual purposes were formed out of the parish of Tynemouth, in the said county of North-umberland, and at that time in the diocese of Durham, but now in the said diocese of Newcastle, and one of the said districts was named 'The District of Low Town, Tynemouth.'

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the sixteenth day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one and published in the London Gazette on the same day, part of the said parish of Tynemouth was assigned as a district chapelry to the consecrated Church of the Holy Trinity, situate in the said parish of Tynemouth, and the said district chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Western Town, Tynemouth.'

"And whereas the said district of Low Town, Tynemouth, and the said district chapelry of Western Town, Tynemouth, have become new parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, by the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Low Town, Tynemouth, and of the said new parish of Western Town, Tynemouth, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Arthur Thomas Bishop of the said diocese of Newcastle (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said new parish of Low Town, Tynemouth, and of the said new parish of Western Town, Tynemouth, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said new parish of Western Town, Tynemouth, which is described

in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such new parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Low Town, Tynemouth.

"And we further represent recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be dissevered from the new parish of Western Town, Tynemouth, in the county of Northumberland, and in the diocese of Newcastle, and to be annexed to the new parish of Low Town, Tynemouth, in the said county and diocese, being:—

"All that portion of the said new parish of Western Town, Tynemouth, which is bounded upon the south-east by the said new parish of Low Town, Tynemouth, upon the north-east by the parish of Tynemouth, in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-west and upon the southwest, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Tynemouth from the said new parish of Western Town, Tynemouth, at the junction of Bedford-street with the road known as Railway-terrace, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Railway-terrace for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to its junction with Borough-road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Borough-road for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to its junction with William-street and William-street West, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of William-street West for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road running along the back of the house and premises known as Saint Peter's vicarage and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to its junction with Stanley-street West, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Stanley-street West for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its junction with Borough-road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Borough-road for a distance of fifteen chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Western Town, Tynemouth, from the said new parish of Low Town, Tynemouth."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the patron and to the Incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such patron and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have

been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Newcastle.

WHEREAS the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the churchwardens of the parish of All Saints, Allhallows, in the county of Kent, ten days' previous notice of their intention to make such representation, have, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground should be opened in the civil parish of Allhallows, without the previous approval of the Local Government Board, and that burials should be discontinued therein, as follows, viz.:—

ALLHALLOWS.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of All Saints, Allhallows, in the county of Kent; and in the church-yard, except as follows:—

In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said churchyard burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, on the eighth day of May next:

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parish affected by such representation one month before the said eighth day of May.
