In pursuance of an Act for better preserving the Navigation of the River Mersey (5 and 6

Victoria, chapter 110), and on behalf of the Manchester Ship Canal Company, I hereby give you notice that the Company propose to construct at the Tidal Opening (now closed) at the Weaver Mouth, in accordance with the plan and section deposited at the office of the Mersey Conservancy, an embankment of earth or clay 206 yards in length, 2 yards in average height, 18 yards in width at the base, and $16\frac{1}{2}$ yards in width at the top.

The object of the proposed embankment is to prevent the escape of water from the Manchester Ship Canal into the estuary of the River Mersey.

It is intended to commence the work after the expiration of one month from the date of this notice.

The proposed embankment will exclude about 7,300 cubic yards of tidal water on a tide of the height of 21 feet as measured from the sill of the old gates of the Dock in Liverpool.
