Foreign Office, May 15, 1905.

His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received a Telegram from His Majesty's Minister at Tokio reporting that, by an Imperial Ordinance No. 160 promulgated on May 12th, and published in the Official Gazette of May 13th, it is declared that the whole of Formosa except the Pescadores and the surrounding sea are determined to be a war zone, and that a state of siege exists from the date of promulgation of the Ordinance.

The Governor-General of Formosa or, in his absence, the Officer commanding the troops is appointed Officer commanding the area in question.
