And whereas the Council of the Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain did, on the fifth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and five, resolve and declare, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in the Council of the Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain, that each of the following articles, namely:—

Cocaine and its salts,

Picrotoxin,

Preparations of Cocaine,

Digitalis and its preparations,

Mercuric Iodide,

Mercuric Sulphocyanide,

Strophanthus and its preparations,

ought to be deemed a poison within the meaning of the Pharmacy Act, 1868; and also that of the same, each of the following articles, namely:

Cocaine and its salts,

Picrotoxin,

ought to be deemed a poison in the first part of Schedule A to the said Pharmacy Act, 1868:

**ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.**

(DATED 17TH JULY 1905.)

**ST. CLEARS AND LLANFIHANGEL-ABERCOWIN (MARKETS AND SALES) ORDER OF 1905.**

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Regulation of Exposure of Animals for sale within certain parishes.*

1. From and after the commencement of this Order—

(i.) No animal shall be exposed for sale in or upon any road or street within the parishes of St. Clears and Llanfihangel-Abercowin, in the administrative county of Carmarthen; and

(ii.) No market, fair, or sale of animals shall be held in or upon any market place, fair ground, saleyard or other premises within the said parishes unless the premises, or a part thereof sufficient to accommodate the number of animals usually exposed at such market, fair, or sale, are so paved with cement, concrete, asphalt, or other hard material impervious to water, as to permit of the same being effectually cleansed by washing.

*Local Authority to enforce Order.*

2. The provisions of this Order, except where it is otherwise provided, shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Offences.*

3. If any animal is exposed for sale, or any market, fair, or sale of animals is held, in contravention of this Order, the person exposing the animal or holding the market, fair, or sale, and the

owner or consignee of each animal exposed thereat, and the person exposing the same thereat, and the purchaser thereof of any animal, such last-mentioned person or such purchaser knowing the market, fair, or sale to be held in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

*Interpretation.*

4. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Animals” means cattle, sheep, and goats, and all other ruminating animals, and swine:

“Person” includes any body of persons corporate or unincorporate:

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

*Commencement.*

5. This Order shall come into operation on the seventeenth day of July, nineteen hundred and six.

*Short Title.*

6. This Order may be cited as the ST. CLEARS AND LLANFIHANGEL-ABERCOWIN (MARKETS AND SALES) ORDER OF 1905.
