

from a point on the borough boundary in the centre of the road at the eastern end of Maidenhead Bridge and proceeding thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Maidenhead Bridge, Bridge-road, Bridge-street and High-street to the junction of the latter street with King-street and proceeding from thence in a southerly direction along the centre of King-street and Braywick-road to a point at which the latter road is crossed by the borough boundary and following in an easterly direction the line of the said borough boundary to the point on the eastern side of Maidenhead Bridge from which the line commenced.

Belmont Ward.

The Belmont Ward shall comprise so much of the borough of Maidenhead as is contained within a line drawn from a point in the centre of High-street opposite the Town Hall in a line with the centre of Market-street and proceeding in a northerly direction along the centre of the said Market-street and Cookham-road to the junction of the latter road with Norfolk-road and turning in a westerly direction along the centre of Norfolk-road to its junction with Marlow-road and from thence following the centre of the said Marlow-road to a point at which the latter road is crossed by the borough boundary at Linden-avenue and from thence following in a westerly direction the line of the said borough boundary to a point at which it crosses the centre of the Bath-road and from thence in an easterly direction along the centre of the said Bath-road, Castle Hill and High-street to the point from which the line commenced. And I the said Commissioner in further pursuance of the terms of the said warrant and for the purposes aforesaid do hereby assign and apportion all the existing Councillors of the said borough of Maidenhead among the wards as hereinbefore determined of the said borough as follows namely:—

1. To Saint Mary's Ward three Councillors namely:—Sydney Reeve Langton, Charles Rockley, and William Fergusson Good.
2. To Boyn Hill Ward three Councillors namely:—David Wilton, Percy Matthew Lever and William Grierson.
3. To Oldfield Ward three Councillors namely:—Benjamin Hobbis, Edwin Hewitt and Arthur Upson.
4. To Belmont Ward three Councillors namely:—Andrew Millar Inglis, John Wesley Walker, and Philip Disney Thompson.
