The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated December 10, from His Majesty's Representative at Stockholm, intimating that the Royal Swedish Board of Trade have made the following alterations in the Plague and Cholera Regulations:-

The Russian province of Astrachan is declared

infected with plague.

The Brazilian ports of Rio Grande, Porto Alegre, Victoria, Aracajú, Maránhao, Pará and Manaos are declared free from plague.

The ports in the Persian Gulf are declared free

from both plague and cholera.

The places therefore still considered here to be infected are:

With Plague-

The Russian province of Astrachan, Egypt, Rio de Janeiro, in Brazil, Peru, Antofagasta and Pisagua in Chile, the provinces of the Hedjaz Yemen in Arabia, the Ural districts in Asia, the ports of the Shat-el-Arab, British East India, Rangoon in British Burma, the Island of Sumatra, Manila in the Philippines, the Islands of Formosa and Hougkong, Hanoi in Tongking, the ports of Newchwang, Foochow, and Amoy in China, Japan, Madagascar, Port Elizabeth, East London, and Durban in British South Africa.

With Cholera-

Russian Poland, Asiatic Turkey, ports of the Red Sea, ports of British East India, Cochin China, Tongking, China, Japan, Morocco.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Authorised Exhibition of Fat Swine.

- 1. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, and the Order of the Board dated the ninth day of December, 1905, an exhibition and sale of fat swine may be held at the premises and on the date mentioned in the Schedule hereto, on the following conditions :-
- (i.) The swine must be moved to the exhibition with a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, which Licence shall be delivered up at the entrance to the sale by the person in charge of the swine to a person appointed by the Local Authority to receive the same.
- ii.) The swine exposed at the exhibition may be moved from the exhibition along over or across a highway or thoroughfare in the county borough of Rotherham to any bacon factory or slaughter-house specified in the Licence if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement-in the Form set forth in the Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or to the like effect—granted by the Local Authority of the borough.

- (iii.) The swine shall before being moved from the exhibition be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting, with an indelible composition of red colour, of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine, thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.
- (iv.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days inclusive of the day of issue.
- (v.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.
- (vi.) The Licence under this Order for the movement of swine from the sale to a bacon factory or slaughter-house shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.
- (vii.) The swine shall be detained at the bacon factory or slaughter-house and there slaughtered within five days after their arrival at such cremises.

Attendance at Exhibition of Veterinary Inspector.

2. A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend at the exhibition authorised under this Order.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

- 3.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.
- (?.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or cons'able, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

4. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the London County Council intends, after the expiration of one calendar month from the date of the first publication of this notice, to apply to the Local Government Board for the confirmation of the following by-laws regulating the use of locomotives and of waggons drawn by locomotives on any highway.

1. Throughout these by-laws the expression "the Council" means the London County Council, and the expression "the County" means the Administrative County of London (exclusive of

the City of London).

2. A person in charge of a locomotive on any highway shall not use the locomotive to draw more than three unloaded waggons, with or without any waggon solely used for carrying water for such locomotive.

Provided that this prohibition shall not apply in any case, where, on application to the Council for permission to use a locomotive to draw more than three unloaded waggons, with or without any waggon solely used as aforesaid, such Council in writing grant such permission.

3. A person in charge of a locomotive shall not cause or suffer the locomotive to remain stationary on any part of a highway for more

than twenty minutes at any one time.

Provided that this by-law shall not be deemed to apply in any case where the stopping of the locomotive for a longer period than twenty minutes

(a) is necessary in order to enable the person using the locomotive to comply with the requirements of any statutory provision or by-law for the time being in force for the regulation of the use of locomotives; or

(b) is rendered necessary by accident, or

other unavoidable cause; or

(c) is necessary in case of a steam roller lawfully on any highway for the purpose of maintenance, repair, or construction of high-

- 4. Where for a continuous length exceeding fifty yards a highway comprises a carriageway or cartway of a width less than twenty-four feet, a person in charge of a locomotive shall not drive or suffer the locomotive to be driven upon the carriageway or cartway unless a person accompanying the locomotive shall precede the locomotive for a distance reasonably sufficient to warn the drivers of vehicles of the approach of the locomotive.
- 5. A person in charge of a locomotive shall not cause or suffer the locomotive to remain stationary on any highway so that any wheel of the locomotive rests on any bridge arch or

culvert or within ten feet from the face of the abutment of any bridge, arch or culvert.

Provided that this prohibition shall not be deemed to apply in any case

(a) where a steam roller is lawfully on any highway for the purpose of the construction,

repair, or maintenance of a highway; or
(b) where, in pursuance of the statutory
provision in that behalf, a locomotive may be
required to be instantly stopped; or

(c) where the stopping of a locomotive may be rendered necessary by accident, or other

unavoidable cause.

6. A person in charge of a locomotive on any highway who may be required by any officer of the Council or police constable, duly authorized in that behalf, to stop the locomotive, for the purpose of enabling the officer or constable to ascertain by examination whether any provision of any statute or by-law applicable to the locomotive has been or is duly complied with, shall forthwith cause the locomotive, if in motion, to stop, and shall not cause or suffer the locomotive to be again set in motion until such time shall have elapsed as may be reasonably necessary for the purpose of such examination.

The person in charge of the locomotive shall, in connection with such examination, give all reasonable assistance that may be demanded by the officer or constable requiring the locomotive

to be stopped.

7. A person in charge of a locomotive on any highway shall furnish his true name and address to any officer of the Council or police constable, duly authorized in that behalf, who shall demand the same.

8. A person in charge of a locomotive on any highway shall not cause or suffer the locomotive to be driven on the same track as another locomotive preceding it, at a less distance than two hundred yards, except where there is a reasonable necessity for so doing.

9. From and after the date of the confirmation of these by-laws the by-laws with respect to locomotives in force in the County of London,

shall be repealed.
