ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

NORTHAMPTONSHIRE (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1905.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

PART I.

Application of Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903.

1. From and after the commencement of this Order the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903 shall apply to the Area described in the First Schedule to this Order.

Revocation of Existing Regulations.

2. The powers of the Local Authorities of any district comprised in the First Schedule hereto to make regulations under the Swine-Fever Order of 1894, as to movement, exposure, or sale of swine, shall be suspended during the operation of this Order, and all such regulations in force at the commencement of this Order shall thereupon cease to operate.

PART II.

Restriction on movement of Swine within certain

Area.

3. Swine shall not be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare in the Area

described in the Second Schedule to this Order unless they are accompanied by a licence as required by this Article.

- (i.) In the case of movement from premises in any part of the administrative county of Northampton outside the Area described in the Second Schedule hereto, the licence shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the swine are when the licence is granted. In such case no declaration is required.
- (ii.) In the case of movement from premises within the Area described in the Second Schedule hereto, the licence shall be granted in accordance with the provisions of Articles 3, 4, and 6 of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902.
- (iii.) In the case of movement from premises outside the Area described in the First Schedule hereto the licence shall be the licence required by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903.

Commencement.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the eighth day of January, nineteen hundred and six.

Short Title.

5. This Order may be cited as the North-AMPTONSHIRE (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1905.
