18. Application for Special Case.

No. 279.—INDIAN OCEAN—COMORO ISLANDS, MAYOTTA.

Bandeli Passage—Depths in.

The French Government has given notice, dated 10th March, 1906, that a recent survey shows that the depths in Bandéli Passage, Mayotta Island, are less than those shown on the chart. In the entrance three coral reefs exist, the northernmost of the three reefs is situated on the leading line, and has a depth of 3½ fathoms.

The middle reef has a depth of 4 fathoms over it, and the southern reef depths of from 2 to 2\frac{3}{4} fathoms over it, but the latter is well clear of the leading line.

The general shape of the reefs which form the sides of this passage, however, does not differ very much from that shown on the chart.

A note that there is a depth of 3\frac{3}{4} fathoms in the passage has been placed on the charts, but a new edition of Chart No. 2741 will be issued when the result of the new survey has been received.

Le Havre Approach, North-west Pass—Wreck
Marked by Buoys.

The Government of the State of Victoria has given notice, dated 31st January, 1906, that on 12th February Gellibrand Light-vessel, exhibiting a red fixed light and formerly situated at a distance of 8 cables south from the green light on the breakwater extending from Gellibrand Point, Hobson Bay, would be withdrawn, and the construction of a pile lighthouse commenced in that position.
