CLERGY DISCIPLINE ACT.

The following draft Rules are published pursuant to the Rules Publication Act, 1893:—

Additional Rules, dated the day of 1906, under the Clergy Discipline Act, 1892.

1. The Schedule to the Clergy Discipline Rules, 1892, shall, be read as if the following additions were made in the appropriate places

under the Province of Canterbury in that Schedule:—

Birmingham .. | Warwick;

Worcester; Stafford;

Southwark .. | London;

Surrey;

and as if the county of Surrey were omitted opposite the diocese of Rochester in that Schedule.

2. The first triennial election of the assessors to be elected from the justices of the county for the dioceses of Birmingham and Southwark respectively, shall be held at the quarter sessions next after the date of this Rule, and another triennial election shall be held at the same sessions in every third year thereafter.

The additional Rule, dated March, 1893, amending Rule 22 of the Clergy Discipline Rules, 1892, shall have effect with reference to any failure to hold an election under this Rule.
