LIGHT RAILWAYS ACT, 1896.

Southwold Light Railway (Borrowing Powers)
Order.

The Light Railway Commissioners have submitted to the Board of Trade for confirmation, under the above-mentioned Act, an Order made by them amending the borrowing powers of the Southwold Railway Company.
