Whereas by Warrants under Our Royal Sign Manual, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and six, and the twenty-fifth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and seven, We were pleased to authorize and appoint certain persons therein respectively named, or any five or more of them, to be Our Commissioners to inquire into the operation of Shipping "Rings" or Conferences generally, and more especially into the system of deferred rebates, and to report whether such operations have caused, or are likely to cause injury to British or Colonial trade, and, if so, what remedial action, if any, should be taken by legislation or otherwise:

And whereas We have deemed it expedient that any two or more of Our said Commissioners when visiting places outside Our United Kingdom should be authorized to exercise the powers and privileges conferred as aforesaid on any five or

more of Our said Commissioners:

Now know ye that We, being advised that a new Commission should issue for this purpose, have revoked and determined, and do by these Presents revoke and determine, the said Warrants, and every matter and thing therein contained:

And We do by these Presents authorize and

appoint you, the said Arthur Cohen (Chairman); James Cleland, Baron Inverciyde; Charles Napier Lawrence; Sir Hugh Bell; Sir William Thomas Lewis; Sir David Miller Barbour; Sir Alfred Edmund Bateman; Sir John Macdonell; Robert Henry Muirhead Collins; Henry Birchenough; William Pember Reeves; John Barry; Edward Carter Kersey Gonner; Fred Maddison; Isaac Hendry Mathers; William Henry Mitchell; Owen Cosby Philipps; Oswald Sanderson, and Austin Taylor to be Our Commissioners to inquire into the operation of Shipping "Rings" or Conferences generally, and more especially into the system of deferred rebates, and to report whether such operations have caused, or are likely to cause injury to British or Colonial trade, and, if so, what remedial action, if any, should be taken by legislation or otherwise.

And for the better effecting the purposes of this Our Commission, We do by these Presents give and grant unto you, or any five or more of you, full power to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission; and also to call for, have access to and examine all such books, documents, registers and records as may afford you the fullest information on the subject, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever.

And We do by these Presents authorize and empower you, or any five or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid.

Provided that should you deem it expedient, in the execution of this Our Commission, to visit places outside Our United Kingdom, then the powers and privileges hereby conferred on any five or more of you shall belong to, and be exercised by, any two or more of you.

And We do by these Presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any five or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And We do further ordain that you, or any five or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time if you shall judge it expedient so to do.

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us, under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any five or more of you, your opinion upon the matters herein submitted for your consideration.

And for the purpose of aiding you in your inquiries We hereby appoint Our trusty and well-beloved James Alexander Webster, Esquire, of the Board of Trade, to be Secretary to this Our Commission.

The following summary account relating to the operations in connection with the native disturbances in Natal last year, which formed the subject of despatches already presented to Parliament(cd.2905,3027,3247), has been received from the Governor of Natal by the Secretary of State for the Colonies:—

Government House, Pietermaritzburg, Natal, 4th May, 1907.

MY LORD,

Whilst the native rebellion was in progress last year I sent a despatch to Your Lordship every week narrating in detail the different events which had occurred and which I considered would be of interest to His Majesty's Government. These are to be found in the pages of the different Blue Books which have been laid before Parliament at Westminster.

Its outbreak was premature. A party of Natal Police was attacked at Byrnetown, near Richmond, by a body of "amakolwa," or Christianised natives, belonging to Mveli's tribe, a Sub-Inspector and a trooper being killed. Rumours had for some time been current that a general rebellion of natives was in contemplation. My Ministers therefore determined to make a demonstration in force in order to show the malcontents that the Government were ready to suppress any insurrection by force of arms. A column was mobilized consisting of the Natal Carabineers, two sections of the Natal Field Artillery, a company of the Natal Royal Regiment, and half the Border Mounted Rifles, under the command of Colonel Duncan McKenzie, C.B., C.M.G., V.D., and Martial Law was proclaimed throughout the Colony.

The demonstration had the desired effect. Tribes which had armed and were defiant to the magistrates were cowed by the presence of the Colonial troops, who marched through very difficult country to the coast, punishing tribes who had defied the law and imposing fines of cattle. These operations under Colonel McKenzie lasted seven weeks, and orders were then given

for the demobilization of the column.

The anticipations which had been formed that the rebellion had been quelled were unfortunately not realised.

It was, therefore, determined to mobilize practically the whole of the active Colonial forces and also to call out the Reserves to maintain order and quiet in districts which were still removed from the actual scenes of the outbreaks. In all some 7,000 men were called out, and although civil business was by this proceeding much hampered, the difficulties were cheerfully faced, as it was considered that under the conditions upon which Responsible Government had been given to the Colony, it was their duty to do everything in their power to cope with this rebellion without the intervention and assistance of Imperial troops.

In a true South African spirit which has been gratefully acknowledged by the Colony, help was given to us by the Government of the Transvaal, who sent to our assistance two separate contingents—the Transvaal Mounted Rifles, 450 strong, under Colonel Barker, and the Lancashire and Yorkshire contingent raised

by Mr. Abe Bailey for the purpose.

The Cape Government also furnished muchneeded assistance by providing a maxim detach-

ment of the Cape Mounted Rifles.

A supply of Rexer guns was also purchased in England by friends of the Colony and sent out with equipment complete under the direction of Major-General Sir John Dartnell, K.C.B., C.M.G., who formerly occupied the positions of Com-mandant of Volunteers and Chief Commissioner of Police in this Colony.

The forces were finally demobilized on September 4th, after a series of operations extending

over seven months.

I have much pleasure in submitting to your Lordship a list of officers whose good services have been brought to my notice by the Commandant, Colonel H. T. Bru-de-Wold, C.M.G. I am proud to submit these recommendations to the favourable notice of His Majesty, and enclose detailed statements explaining the gallant nature of the conduct shown by Inspector Dimmick and Lieutenant Blamey for which their names have been included.

Colonel McKenzie, who has since succeeded Colonel Bru-de-Wold in the command of the Colonial Forces, also presses for mention of Lieutenant William Henry London, who served under him. The services rendered by this officer were of a particularly valuable character as may be seen from the statement which I enclose

herewith.

Colonel Bru-de-Wold, C.M.G., Commandant of the local forces, remained at headquarters during the rebellion and did yeoman service. pressure which devolved upon him in connection with administrative work was immense, and culminated in a temporary break-down, whereupon Major-General Sir John Dartnell, K.C.B., C.M.G., who was on a visit to the Colony, acted for him. Colonel Bru-de-Wold was ably and indefatigably assisted by his Staff, particularly by his Chief Staff Officer, Major Thomas Harry Blew.

As regards civilians I have much pleasure in referring in the first place to the splendid work done by the Prime Minister, the Honourable Charles John Smythe. For the whole seven months I was closely in contact with him, attending as I did every day a meeting of the Cabinet as a Council of War. I was much struck with his clear level-headed conception of the true position of affairs during the different phases of the campaign, with his cool determination, quiet resolution, and absence of fuss. I consider that the Colony was most fortunate in having as a Premier at such a critical time a statesman of the calibre and character of Mr. Smythe.

Of his colleagues, the Honourable Thomas Watt, who was Minister of Defence, has already received a mark of His Majesty's favour. The Minister for Native Affairs, the Honourable Henry Daniel Winter, occupied a position of peculiar responsibility, and gave me valuable assistance. His cool physical courage during the early stages of the rebellion, in entering unarmed a veritable hornets' nest of rebels, was referred

to by me in one of my early despatches.

I desire also to bring to your Lordship's notice the services rendered by Mr. George Thomas Plowman, Secretary to the Prime Minister, and by Mr. Arthur John Hedgeland, my own Private Secretary. The work which they put through was immense; night after night they had to sit up until the early hours of the morning to meet the abnormal pressure which fell to their lot, and right well did they do it.

Commandant at Eshowe during early stages of operations in N'Kandhla Forest, exercising considerable tact in allaying unrest amongst the residents of that district. Later, in command of his regiment, did particularly good service,

especially during the operations in Zululand.

Lieutenant-Colonel J. Hyslop, D.S.O., V.D.,

Principal Medical Officer, Natal Militia; Officer

Commanding, Natal Medical Corps.

As head of the Medical Department, the organization of which was carefully planned and successfully carried out, resulting in the very unusual low death rate of four men from sickness, these only dying from disease out of a force of over 6,000 men in the field.

Brevet Lieutenant-Colonel John Robinson Royston, C.M.G., D.S.O., Border Mounted Rifles.

Raised and commanded an irregular corps known as "Royston's Horse." Did conspicuously good service throughout the rebellion, parti-cularly in the N'Kandhla Forest.

Colonel Sir Aubrey Woolls-Sampson, K.C.B.

Acted as Chief Staff Officer, Zululand Field Force, during the operations in Zululand. Afterwards commanded a column with considerable success during the operations in the Mapumulo and Stanger Districts.

Lieutenant-Colonel William Frank Barker, D.S.O., Officer Commanding, South African Light

Commanded Composite Regiment of Transvaal Volunteers known as "Transvaal Mounted Rifles" during the operations in Zululand and later in the Mapumulo and N'Dwedwe Districts. Displayed conspicuous tact in the attack upon his column at Insuzi.

Lieutenant-Colonel T. McCubbin, C.M.G.

Acted as Commandant at Durban throughout the rebellion, exercising considerable tact and coolness in the discharge of his duties.

Chief Leader John Albert Nel, Umvoti District Reserves.

Rendered valuable assistance to Colonel Leuchars during the operations in Umvoti County by the prompt manner in which he turned out his reserves.

Major W. Murray Smith, Natal Mounted Rifles. Did magnificent service when in temporary command of the Helpmakaar Field Force and later at the head of his regiment in the Mapumulo

Major R. A. Buntine, Natal Medical Corps.

As Senior Medical Officer, during the operations in Zululand and later in the Mapumulo-Commanded the expedition which resulted in | Stanger District, did excellent service.

Major S. B. Woollatt, Officer Commanding,

Natal Veterinary Corps.

Acted as Officer Commanding Remounts during the rebellion, and was responsible for the supply of remounts for the forces in the field, achieving considerable success notwithstanding the scarcity of horses in the Colony.

Major W. H. Smith, Natal Mounted Rifles.
Rendered excellent service throughout the campaign, and for his dash and pluck in leading a small detachment against the rebel chief Ndhlovu ka Timuni, on the 19th June, at Otimati, inflicting heavy loss on the enemy.

Major W. A. Vanderplank, Officer Command-

ing, Zululand Mounted Rifles.
Performed particularly good service during the rebellion in Zululand, especially by the prompt manner in which he mobilized his regiment. Within 20 hours after the receipt of orders to mobilize he was 30 miles on his way to N'Kandhla from Eshowe.

Major S. Carter, Umvoti Mounted Rifles. As Chief Staff Officer, Umvoti Field Force, and later as Chief Staff Officer to Colonel Leuchars, when commanding troops in Natal, did particularly

Major S. G. Campbell, Durban Light Infantry. For conspicuous gallantry on several occasions, particularly at the fight near Nkomo Hill in Zululand, and when in charge of a convoy from Bond's Drift to Thring's Post, was attacked at McRae's Store, driving off the enemy and bringing convoy through.

Captain G. A. Labistour, Natal Royal Regiment. Attached to the Militia Staff during the rebellion, rendered excellent service in his professional capacity as a lawyer.

Inspector Oliver Dimmick, Natal Police. For his gallantry in the attack on the police at Impanza, rescuing Trumpeter Milton, who was wounded.

Captain M. G. Pearson, Natal Medical Corps. Did excellent work in the field throughout the campaign and rendered good service in assisting in the organization of medical arrangements,

especially in sanitary matters.

Lieutenant Alfred Harry Garnet Blamey,

Natal Mounted Rifles.

For conspicuous gallantry and dash at the Nkomo Hill Fight, in Zululand, on which occa-sion he was mainly instrumental in the escape of Corporal Acutt, who had lost his horse.

H. T. BRU-DE-WOLD, Colonel, Commandant of Militia.

Particulars of Services in respect of which the name of Inspector Oliver Dimmick, Natal Police, was brought to the notice of the Commandant of Militia.

During the night attack on the Natal Police at the Impanza River on the night of the 4th April, 1906, Inspector Oliver Dimmick, Natal Police, displayed great gallantry in rescuing. Trumpeter Milton of the same Corps from falling

into the enemy's hands.

Trumpeter Milton was wounded and surrounded by the enemy, but was eventually conveyed to a place of safety by means of Inspector Dimmick's action in proceeding to his rescue and keeping the enemy at bay. H. T. BRU-DE-WOLD, Colonel,

Particulars in respect of which the name of Lieutenant A. H. G. Blamey, Natal Mounted Rifles, was brought to the notice of the Commandant of Militia.

Lieutenant A. H. G. Blamey, Natal Mounted Rifles, in the action at Nkomo Hill on the 5th

May, 1906, at the risk of his own life rescued Corporal Acutt, Natal Mounted Rifles, from a perilous situation.

The latter had become detached from his troop, and having lost his horse, would certainly have fallen into the hands of the enemy but for Lieutenant Blamey's timely assistance. The enemy were pressing close, and Lieutenant Blamey had considerable difficulty owing to the nature of the ground in effecting the rescue of the non-commissioned officer mentioned, but eventually succeeded in keeping the enemy off, and bringing Corporal Acutt within our own

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

#### Modification of Wiltshire (Swine-Fever) Order of 1906.

1. Part II (Restriction on Movement of Swine within Scheduled Area) of the Wiltshire (Swine-Fever) Order of 1906, hereinafter referred to as the "principal Order," is hereby modified in the manner hereinafter contained.

Declaration for Movement of Swine for Breeding Purposes.

2. In the case of swine moved for breeding purposes from any premises in the Scheduled Area to which the principal Order applies, a period of fourteen days may be inserted in the declaration required by the principal Order instead of twenty-eight days.

#### Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-eighth day of June, nineteen hundred and seven.

Short Title and Construction.

4. This Order may be cited as the WILTSHIRE (Swine-Feven) Order of 1907, and shall be read as one with the principal Order.

- 3. The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to any place of destination specified in the Licence and not elsewhere, and while being so moved shall not be subject to Regulations made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board relating to Swine-Fever.

They are also warned that the removal of shell, as well as any meddling with the fuse, is attended with the greatest danger. Live shell may be recognised by having black points, which are fitted with an

exploding apparatus having a coating of red lead on each of its iron parts.

Contravention of the above regulations or of the orders of the captains of the police boats will be punished according to law, by a fine not exceeding 150 marks, or by imprisonment.
