The KING has been pleased to allow Miss Margaret Jane Lamb, of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, to receive the Edward Medal of the First Class in recognition of the gallant action of her brother, the late George Huddleston Lamb, who lost his life in endeavouring to save the lives of five men at a fire at the Strathcona Company's Mine, at Strathcona, in the Province of Alberta, Canada,

on the 8th June, 1907.

There were two shafts in the mine, a hoisting shaft and an air shaft. The engineer of the mine woke Lamb at about 11.25 p.m., when the fire was discovered, and told him that there were five men in the mine. Lamb descended three times, once by the air shaft, and having found the men urged them to escape by the ladder, saying he would remain until they had ascended. One man made an attempt, but returned. Lamb himself then succeeded in reaching the surface, but his clothes were in flames, and he died shortly afterwards from the effect of his injuries. The others seem to have endeavoured to follow him, but failed, either because they were overcome by the smoke or because the ladder was burned.

MIDLOTHIAN AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1908 (No. 4).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Modification of former Orders.

1.—(1.) The Midlothian and District (Footand-Mouth Disease) Order of 1908 as modified by the Midlothian and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1908 (No. 3) is hereby further modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

(2.) The Scheduled District for the purposes of this Order shall be the District described in the First Schedule to the Midlothian and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1908 (No. 3).

Movement to Licensed Markets, &c., and thence to Slaughter-house.

2.—(1.) An animal may be moved from any place or premises within or outside the Scheduled District to any market, fairground or saleyard in the Scheduled District which shall be licensed for this purpose by the Local Authority of the District under this Order, provided that the animal is accompanied by a Movement Licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market, fairground or saleyard is

(2.) For the purposes of movement to a licensed market, fairground or saleyard, animals may be moved by railway from outside the Scheduled District to a railway station in the Scheduled District without a Licence, but othe subsequent movement must be authorised by a Licence under this Article.

(3.) An animal exposed at a licensed market, fairground or saleyard may be moved there-from only if accompanied by a Movement Licence authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market, fairground, or saleyard is situate, and only to a slaughterhouse in the Scheduled District specified in the Licence.

(4.) A Movement Licence under this Article shall be in force for not more than four days inclusive of the day of issue.

(5.) A copy of a Licence authorising movement from a market, fairground or saleyard shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which is situate the slaughter-house specified in the Licence.

Movement into Scheduled District for Slaughter.

3.—(1.) For the purpose of movement to a slaughter-house an animal may be moved by railway from outside the Scheduled District to a railway station in the Scheduled District without a Licence, but an animal so moved shall only be moved from the railway station to a slaughter-house in the Scheduled District, and only if accompanied by a Movement Licence authorising such movement granted by the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughter-house is

(2.) An animal may also be moved by railway or otherwise from any place outside the Scheduled District to a slaughter-house in the Scheduled District, if accompanied by a Movement Licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughter-house is situate, which Licence shall be obtained before movement into the Scheduled District.

(3.) This Article shall be substituted for Article 4 of the Midlothian and District (Footand-Mouth Disease) Order of 1908 (No. 3).

Movement of Milch Cows into Scheduled District by Licence.

4. Where the Local Authority consider it necessary or expedient that any milch cow should be permitted to be moved into their District from premises outside the Scheduled District, an Inspector of the Local Authority may authorise such movement by a Movement Licence.

Landing of animals at Leith for movement through Scheduled District.

5. Animals intended to be moved to a place of destination outside the Scheduled District may without a Movement Licence be lauded at Leith, and moved from the landing place forthwith by the most direct route to the nearest available cattle loading docks and thence forthwith by railway out of the Scheduled District.

Exception of Certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.

- 6. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorising—
 - (i.) movement of an animal which is affected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease, or which has during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; or
 - (ii.) movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given of under any Order of the Board; or
 - (iii.) movement out of a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place; or
 - (iv.) movement of an animal along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare in the Area described in the Second Schedule to the Midlothian and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1908 (No. 3), except that an animal may be moved from any place or premises in that Area to a slaughter-house in the city of Edinburgh, under and in accordance with the conditions of Article 5 of such Order.

· Forms.

7. Movement Licences under this Order shall be in the form set forth in the Third Schedule to the Midlothian and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1908 (No. 3) or to the like effect.

Commencement.

8. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-fourth day of February, nineteen hundred and eight.

Short Title, &c.

9. This Order may be cited as the MIDLOTHIAN AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1908 (No. 4), and shall be read with the Orders mentioned in Article 1 of this Order.

THAMES CONSERVANCY.

TOTICE is hereby given, that the Conservators having taken into consideration the objections and representations which have been made to them respecting the proposed Bye-laws for the regulation of the River Thames and the navigation thereof, and for other purposes, which said proposed Bye-laws were published in the London Gazette of the 12th day of July, 1907, and in "The Times" newspaper of the 13th and 20th days of July, 1907, have made the following alterations in the said Bye-laws:—

Interpretation Clause—Bye-law 4.

The following definition has been altered, and will now stand as follows:—

A vessel is "under way" within the meaning of these Bye-laws when she is not at anchor, moored, or made fast to the shore, or aground, and when she is dropping up or down the river with her anchor on the ground.

The following Bye-laws have also been altered:—Numbers 7, 11, 15, 57, 58, 63 and 80. The altered Bye-laws will now stand as

follows:-

Lights, &c., required below Hampton Church. Steamer's Lights.

7. A steam vessel other than a steam launch when under way shall carry:—

(a) On or in front of the foremast, or if a vessel without a foremast, then in the forepart of the vessel at a height above the hull of not less than twenty feet, and if the breadth of the vessel exceeds twenty feet, then at a height above the hull not less than such breadth so however that the light need not be carried at a greater height above the hull than forty-feet, a bright white light so constructed as to show an unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of twenty points of the compass so fixed as to throw the light ten points on each side of the vessel, viz.:right ahead to two points abaft the beam on either side and of such a character as to be visible at a distance of at least two miles. Provided that steam vessels which navigate both above and below London Bridge shall not be required to carry their lights at a greater height than twelve feet above the hull.

Above London Bridge.

Such steam vessels when navigating above London Bridge may carry the white light at any convenient height above and in line with the stern.

(b) On the starboard side a green light so constructed as to show an unbroken light

over an arc of the horizon of ten points of the compass so fixed as to throw the light from right ahead to two points abaft the beam on the starboard side, and of such a character as to be visible at a distance of at least one mile.

(c) On the port side a red light so constructed as to show an unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of ten points of the compass so fixed as to throw the light from right ahead to two points abaft the beam on the port side, and of such a character as to be visible at a distance of at least one mile.

(d) The said green and red side lights shall be fitted with inboard screens projecting at least three feet forward from the light, so as to prevent these lights from being seen across

(e) A steam vessel when under way may carry an additional white light, similar in construction to the light mentioned in sub-section (a). These two lights shall be so placed in line with the keel, that one shall be at least 15 feet higher than the other, and in such a position with reference to each other, that the lower light shall be forward of the upper one. The vertical distance between the lights shall be less than the horizontal distance.

Steamer when Towing to have two White Lights.

(f) A steam vessel when towing another vessel or when attached for the purpose of towing or manœuvring such vessel shall in addition to her side lights carry two bright white lights in a vertical line one over the other not less than four feet apart. Each of these lights shall be of the same construction and character, and shall be carried in the same position as the white light which other steam vessels are required to carry.

Such steam vessel may carry a small white light abaft the funnel or aftermast for the vessel towed to steer by, but such light shall not be visible forward of the beam,

Light for Lighters in Tow.

11.—(a) The master of a steam vessel shall not by night tow any lighter, float, or raft of timber unless a white light of such a character as to be visible at a distance of at least a mile is exhibited on the stern or afterpart of such lighter, float, or raft of timber. Provided that if there be more than one such lighter, float, or raft of timber being towed in line, the white light above referred to shall be exhibited on the stern or afterpart of the sternmost or last of such line.

(b) The master of a steam vessel shall not by night tow any lighter lashed alongside unless a white light is exhibited on the side of such lighter furthest from such steam vessel.

Vessel aground in or near the Fairway.

15. A vessel, other than a lighter of one hundred feet or upwards in length, aground in or near the fairway, shall by night exhibit in the forward part of such vessel three lights placed vertically, of which the centre one is to be red, and the other two white, such lights to be visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least one mile, and by day, shall exhibit two black balls, or shapes not less than two feet in diameter, which shall be placed vertically in the forward part of the vessel not less than six feet apart.

A vessel of one hundred and fifty feet or upwards in length, shall by night, in addition to the above-mentioned lights, exhibit the after light required to be carried by a vessel at

anchor.

The lights, or balls, or shapes mentioned in this Bye-law shall be so placed that the lowermost in the forward part of the vessel shall be at a height of not less than twenty feet, and not more than forty feet above the hull, and the after light not less than fifteen feet lower than the lowermost forward light.

This Bye-law shall not apply to vessels above London Bridge, and to vessels lying at tiers,

jetties, or wharves.

Not more than six to be towed at one time below Albert Bridge, Chelsea.

57. Vessels towed by steam vessels navigating the river below the Albert Bridge at Chelsea shall, if more than two in number, be placed two abreast (except vessels not exceeding fourteen feet nine inches in width which may be placed three abreast), and not more than six of any such vessels shall be towed together at the same time, and no tow of vessels shall exceed in length the following limits, namely:-

Between London Bridge and 7 the landing when the landing place at the end of Trinity - street, Charlton.

Below the said landing place, 400 feet to be calculated from the stern of the vessel towing to the stern of the aftermost vessel towed.

A steam vessel may tow another vessel lashed alongside of her, but shall not at any one time tow more than one vessel in such a manner.

Not more than six to be towed at one time between Albert Bridge and Hampton Church.

58. Vessels towed by steam vessels navigating between the Albert Bridge at Chelsea and Hampton Church may be placed in a single line, but shall not be placed more than two abreast (except vessels not exceeding fourteen feet nine inches in width which may be placed three abreast) and not more than six of any such vessels shall be towed together at the same time, and the distance between any two of the vessels so towed shall not exceed fifty feet.

Vessel not to obstruct dock entrance.

63. No vessel shall be placed or be in such a position as to obstruct or interfere with the access to any dock entrance.

This Bye-law does not apply to vessels in the employment of or belonging to the Conservators.

Ferry boats to be licensed.

80. No boat or punt shall be used as a ferry for the conveyance of persons on the River Thames above Teddington Lock unless previously licensed by the Harbour Master of the district. Every such licence shall state the number of persons which the said boat or punt is licensed to carry at any one time, and the said number shall be kept legibly and clearly inscribed on some prominent position in the said boat or punt. The master of such boat or punt shall not at any one time carry more than the number of persons allowed by the said license.
