ORDER of the Local Government Board: Motor Car Act, 1903: Regulations under Section 9 (1):—

COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX.

PARISH OF HILLINGDON EAST.

To the County Council of Middlesex;—And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by Sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

And whereas the County Council of Middle-sex, having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the above-mentioned Sub-section putting the provisions of that Sub-section in force within the limits comprising parts of a certain road situate in the parish of Hillingdon East, within the county of Middlesex, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of Sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising so much of the main road from Uxbridge to London, in the said parish, as extends from its junction with Harlington-road to the Smithy at the top of Hillingdon Hill.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the eighteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and eight.
