The following Address was presented to The King on the occasion of Their Majesties' visit to the Franco-British Exhibition, on Tuesday, the Handle May, in company with the President of the French Republic:-

To Their Most Gracious Majesties King Edward VII and Queen Alexandra.

May it please Your Majesties,

We, Your Majesties' most loyal and dutiful subjects, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Councillors of the Metropolitan Borough of Hammersmith, desire on behalf of the inhabitants of the Borough to express the very great pleasure with which we welcome Your Majesties, and to tender our hearty thanks to You for the honour You have been pleased to afford us in allowing us to greet Your Majesties personally on this occasion.

We are well aware of the warm welcome always given to Your Majesties by the French Nation, and we assure Your Majesties that we shall do all that lies in our power to make our neighbours from across the Channel as comfort-

able and as happy as possible during their visit. We sincerely hope that the effect of the meeting of the representatives of the two Nations at the Exhibition will gratify Your Majesties, and we devoutly trust that, by the Grace of God, Your Majesties may long be spared to reign over us.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to

return the following gracious Answer:—
"I thank you in behalf of the Queen and Myself for the loyal Address of welcome which you have handed to Me.

"It is a great pleasure to Us to visit your Borough in company with Our distinguished guest, the French President.

"The enthusiastic reception which We have to-day met with conveys to Me an even deeper

have received on other occasions, and which I ever regard as a public demonstration of the place I am very proud to hold in the affections of My people. It is to Me an expression of your satisfaction at the cordial relations which exist between Great Britain and France. Happily these two great Nations are each day drawing nearer to one another. At no time in history have the ties which unite us been more closely drawn; at no time has the friendship of one Nation for the other been more warmly fostered. This friendship will, I pray, endure. It has every element of endurance, for it is based on mutual esteem and a better understanding of national characteristics.

"Such Exhibitions as that now being held in our midst cannot fail to increase the mutual good feeling of the Itwo Nations, and I am convinced that the honour paid to us by the visit to this country of the President of the French Republic thoroughly appreciated throughout My

Dominions.

The following Address was presented to Their Majesties on the occasion of the opening by Her Majesty, on Saturday, the 4th July, of the new building of the Royal National Pension Fund for Nurses in Buckingham-street, Strand:-

On behalf of all the Nurses of Your Majesty's dominions I venture to thank Her Majesty Queen Alexandra for the honour she has done them in coming to open the Home of the Royal National Pension Fund for Nurses, and You, Sir, for the honour You have done them by accompanying

the Queen.
I hope this Home may not only prove a convenient one for the Nurses but a good source of

revenue for the Fund.

The Pension Fund was established 21 years meaning than the many loyal welcomes which I I ago under Your Majesties' auspices, and owes much of its present position to the kindly interest

You have taken in it.

I think Your Majesties will be pleased to hear that the Nurses so appreciated Your kindness that they, principally by their own endeavours, have enabled me to-day to tell Your Majesties that the Fund amounts now to £1,265,000, although the Fund has been able to pay back to Nurses who have retired from the Fund no less a sum than £300,000.

The Fund is now paying annuitants £21,000 a year, thus proving that those who work and save on small incomes can lay by for themselves

for their old age.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:-

"In behalf of the Queen and Myself I thank you sincerely for your loyal and dutiful Address. We have always taken the warmest interest in the Royal National Pension Fund for Nurses, and it has given the Queen great pleasure to open the new building which will contain the offices of the Fund.

"It has now happily long been recognised that in the alleviation of pain and sickness good nursing is of supreme importance, and that it is in the interest of the community that measures should be taken to obtain skilled and efficient nurses in increased numbers and to procure for them such advantages and prospects as will

retain them in their profession.

"In no career has more unselfish devotion been shown than in that of nursing, and it would indeed be hard if those who spend the best years of life in acts of self-denial, in attending the sick bed and ministering to the wants of those unable to help themselves, should be condemned, when age has diminished their capacity for work, to

poverty, if not to actual want.

"We are much gratified to learn how largely nurses have availed themselves of the facilities for saving afforded by the Royal National Pension Fund, and how liberal has been the support which has been accorded by the public. earnestly hope that such support may be continued, that the Fund may find in the future, as it has in the past, many generous contributors, and that its usefulness may be extended and its prosperity increased."

We, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City of Hereford in Council assembled, desire to take the opportunity afforded us by Your Majesties passage through this city, to present to Your Majesties an address expressive on the part of the Citizens of their loyalty and attachment to His Majesty's Throne and Person; and in doing so we wish further to express our hope for long life and happiness to Her Majesty Queen Alexandra to carry on the works of charity and mercy which have enshrined Her Majesty in the hearts of all His Majesty's subjects.
