FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

LIGHT RAILWAYS ACT, 1896.

The Board of Trade have recently confirmed the undermentioned Orders made by the Light Railway Commissioners:—(1) Portmadoc, Beddgelert and South Snowdon Railway (Light Railway) Order, 1908, authorising the Portmadoc, Beddgelert and South Snowdon Railway Company to reconstruct, construct and work the railways authorised by the Portmadoc, Beddgelert and South Snowdon Railway Acts, 1901 and 1904, as a Light Railway under the Light Railways Act, 1896, and authorising the construction of a Light Railway in the county of Carnarvon, from the termination of the railway authorised by the said Act of 1901 near Beddgelert, to Bettws-y-Coed, and amending and consolidating the capital and borrowing powers of the Company, and for other purposes. (2) Portmadoc, Beddgelert and South Snowdon Railway (Light Railway Extension at Carnarvon) Order, 1908, authorising the construction of Light Railways in the borough and county of Carnarvon, being a deviation and extension of the authorised undertaking of the Portmadoc, Beddgelert and South Snowdon Railway Company, from Dinas to Carnarvon, and the abandonment of a part of the said undertaking.
