PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by the Sugar Convention Act, 1903, after reciting that by Article VII of the Conventiou, signed on the fifth day of March, nineteen hundred and two, in relation to sugar, provision was made for the establishment of a Permanent Commission charged with watching the execution of the provisions of the Convention, it is enacted that where it is reported by the Permanent Commission that any direct or indirect bounty is granted in any foreign country on the production or export of sugars, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, make a prohibition Order, that is to say, an Order prohibiting sugar from that foreign country to be imported or brought into the United Kingdom, subject to any provision which might be made by Parliament in view of such prohibition to impose a special duty on such sugar in accordance with the Convention; and it was also enacted that His Majesty might, similarly, revoke, alter, and add to any such Order.

And whereas it was provided by Article X of the said Convention that the Convention should come into force from the first day of September, one thousand nine hundred and three, and should remain in force for five years from that date.

And whereas upon reports made by the said Permanent Commission His Majesty, by an Order in Council dated the eleventh day of August, one thousand nine hundred and three, prohibited the importation into the United Kingdom of sugar from Denmark, Russia, and the Argentine Republic, and by another Order in Council dated the twenty-seventh day of March, one thousand nine hundred and five, prohibited the importation into the United Kingdom of sugar from Spain,

And whereas by an additional Act to the said Convention, signed on the twenty-eighth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and seven, and duly ratified, it has been agreed to maintain the said Convention in force for a fresh period of five years, commencing on the first day of September, one thousand nine hundred and eight, and it is provided that Great Britain shall be relieved after the said first day of September, one thousand nine hundred and eight, from the obligation under the said Convention to impose a special duty on sugar imported from any foreign country or to prohibit the importation of bounty-fed sugar.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers vested in Him by the said recited Act, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that as from the first day of September, one thousand nine hundred and eight, the two recited Orders in Council, dated respectively the eleventh day of August, one thousand nine hundred and three, and the twenty-seventh day of March, one thousand nine hundred and five, shall be no longer in force, and the said Orders are as from that day hereby revoked.

Subject.—The German Government has given notice that under certain circumstances, such as manœuvres, ordinary exercises, or for other causes it may be necessary to prohibit free entrance into German harbours and river mouths by night.

Signals.—To indicate that entrance to a harbour is closed, or that obstructions exist therein, three red balls by day and three red lights by night, placed vertically one above the other, will be shown in a conspicuous position near the approach to the harbour.

Caution.—Vessels must then approach the harbour with the greatest caution. At night it is advisable, when possible, to anchor until daybreak outside the prohibited area. The same course should be pursued if search lights are at work, or signals given, the meaning of which is not recognisable from the Sailing Directions or Light Lists.

Examination Service.—All merchant vessels desirous then to enter or leave these privileged harbours, must not enter or leave without a pilot, and must submit to examination if required. The establishment of an Examination Service will not be notified publicly, but, so far as possible, the requisite reports and directions will be given to appreaching vessels by patrol ships, which will also carry the above mentioned

signals, viz., three red balls by day and three red lights by night, and also, under certain circumstances, the pilot flag. The Examination Commission (and pilots) are on board the patrol ships; it is in the real interest of masters of vessels to comply with all directions received from them. Under all circumstances vessels are prohibited from passing the line of patrol ships without communicating with them. On a gun being fired or signal made from a patrol ship, all merchant vessels must stop immediately.
