THE MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903. Borough of Bangor.



Kronstadt, South Channel—Leading Lights Established.

Subject.—Leading lights have been established at Kronstadt as undermentioned.

1. At entrance to the Coasting Vessels' Harbour.

(a) Front light.

Position.—On head of western mole; lat.

59° 59' N., long. 29° 45' E. Character.—White and red alternating. Arc of visibility.—All around the horizon. (b) Rear light.

Position.—On head of eastern mole of same

harbour at a distance of about \( \frac{1}{3} \) of a cable N. 89° E. from the front light.

Character.—White and red alternating. Arc of visibility.—From S. 87° E., through

east, to N. 84° E.

Remarks.-These lights in line, bearing N. 89° E., lead through the fairway from the line of Kronslot leading lights to the line of the leading lights, mentioned below.

2. Southward of Middle Harbour.

(a) Front light.
