The KING has been pleased to grant unto William Prinsep White, of Mere Hall, in the County Palatine of Chester, Gentleman, His Royal licence and authority that he may take and henceforth use the surnames of Langford-Brooke in lieu of and in substitution for his own surname of White, and that he may bear the Arms of Langford and Brooke quarterly, and that the said surnames and Arms may in like manner be taken, borne, and used by his issue; the said Arms to be first duly exemplified according to the laws of Arms, and recorded in His Majesty's College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect.

And to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in the said College of Arms.
