The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. W HEREAS on the ninth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eightysix, a Convention (hereinafter called the Berne Convention) with respect to the protection to be given by way of copyright to the authors of literary and artistic works was concluded between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and the foreign countries following, that is to say:—Belgium, Hayti, Switzerland, France, Italy, Germany, Spain, and Tunis:

And whereas on the fifth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, the ratifications of the said Convention were duly exchanged between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and the aforesaid countries:

And whereas by an Order in Council, dated the twenty-eighth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and made under the authority committed to Her late Majesty Queen Victoria by the International Copyright Acts, 1844 to 1886, Her Majesty was pleased to make provision for giving rights of copyright throughout Her Majesty's dominions to the authors of literary and artistic works first produced in any of the said foreign countries (therein referred to as the foreign countries of the Copyright Union) and otherwise giving effect throughout Her Majesty's dominions to the terms of the said Berne Convention, and an English translation of the said Convention was set out in the first schedule to the said Order in Council:

And whereas since the date of the said Order in Council the foreign countries following, namely:—Luxemburg, Monaco, Montenegro, namely:—Luxemburg, Monaco, Montenegro, Norway and Sweden have acceded to the said Berne Convention, and by Orders in Council dated respectively the tenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, the

one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, and the twelfth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and four, and made under the authority aforesaid, the provisions of the said Order in Council of the twenty-eighth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, have been extended to the last-mentioned foreign countries respectively:

And whereas an Additional Act to the said Berne Convention was agreed upon between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and the following foreign countries for the purpose of varying the provisions of the said Berne Convention, namely: - Germany, Italy, Switzerland, Belgium, Luxemburg, Spain, Monaco, Tunis, France, and Montenegro, and the ratifications of the said Additional Act were, on the ninth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, exchanged between Her late Majesty seven, exchanged between Her late Majes Queen Victoria and the said foreign countries:

And whereas by an Order in Council, dated the seventh day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, and made under the authority aforesaid, Her late Majesty Queen Victoria was pleased to make provision for varying the hereinbefore recited Order in Council of the twenty-eighth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and otherwise giving effect to the said Additional Act throughout Her Majesty's dominions so far as regards the foreign countries hereinbefore named as parties to the said Additional Act, and an English translation of the said Additional Act is set forth in the schedule to the Order in Council now in recital:

And whereas the Republic of Hayti having duly acceded to the said Additional Act, the said Order in Council of the seventh day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, was, by Order in Council of the nineteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-

eight, extended to the said Republic:

And whereas the Empire of Japan and the Kingdom of Denmark and the Faroe Islands, having duly acceded to the said Berne Convention and the said Additional Act, the said Orders in Council of the twenty-eighth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and the seventh day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, were, by Orders in Council dated respectively the eighth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, and the ninth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and three, extended to the said Empire of Japan and to the said Kingdom of Denmark and the Farce Islands:

And whereas the Principality of Montenegro having duly denounced the said Berne Convention, the said Order in Council of the sixteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three was revoked by an Order in Council of the eighth day of August. one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, and the provisions of the said Orders in Council of the twenty-eighth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and the seventh day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, have ceased to apply to the said Principality of Montenegro:

And whereas the foreign countries following, namely:—Luxemburg, Monaco, Norway, Japan, Denmark, and the Faroe Islands, and Sweden, together with the foreign countries comprised in the said Order in Council of the twenty-eighth day of November, one thousand eight hundred fifteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, now constitute the foreign dred and eighty-nine, the sixteenth day of May, countries of the Copyright Union within the meaning of the said Order in Council of the twenty-eighth day of November, one thousand

eight hundred and eighty-seven:

And whereas it has been intimated to His Majesty's Government that the Government of Liberia have notified the accession of that country to the said Berne Convention, and the said Additional Act, such accession to take effect from the sixteenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and eight;

And whereas His Majesty in Council is satisfied that the said Government of Liberia has made such provisions as it appears to His Majesty expedient to require for the protection of authors' works first produced in His Majesty's dominions:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority committed to His Majesty by the International Copyright Acts, 1844 to 1886, doth order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:

1. From and after the commencement of this Order the hereinbefore recited Orders in Council of the twenty-eighth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and the seventh day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, shall extend to the Republic of Liberia.

2. This Order shall come into operation as from the sixteenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and eight, which date is hereinbefore referred to as the commencement of

this Order.

3. And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Orders herein accordingly.

HEREAS by section five, sub-section two, of the Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1848, it is enacted that the scale and rules set out in the second schedule to that Act shall have effect for the purpose of the levying of light dues in pursuance of that Act, but His Majesty may, by Order in Council, alter, either generally or with respect to particular classes of cases, the scale or rules and the exemptions therefrom:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the tenth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and three, His Majesty was pleased to alter the said scale as from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and three, by reducing each of the dues authorized to be levied by twelve and a half per centum of the amounts specified by the said scale:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and six, His Majesty was pleased to further alter the said scale as from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and seven, by reducing each of the dues authorized to be levied by the said scale for a period of three years from the last mentioned date by seven and a half per centum beyond the reduction of twelve and a half per centum provided for by the said Order in Council of the tenth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and three:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the said scale and rules should be altered in manner hereinafter appearing

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers vested in Him by the above recited

provisions doth, for the purpose of the levying of light dues in pursuance of the said Act, by this Order in Council, alter the scale and rules set out in the said second schedule to the said Act in manner following, that is to say:

1. Each of the dues authorized to be levied by the said scale shall, for a period of three years from the date of coming into operation of this Order, be subject to a reduction of seventeen and a half per centum beyond the reduction of twelve and a half per centum provided for by the said Order in Council of the tenth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and three, and the said dues as so reduced by the said Order in Council of the tenth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and three and by this Order shall be levied and the said rules construed accord-

ingly.

2. This Order in Council shall come into one thousand nine hundred and nine, and as and from the coming into operation of this Order the recited Order in Council dated the first day of December, one thousand nine

hundred and six, shall be repealed.

Pilotage Authority may, by byelaw made under that part of that Act, do all or any of the things specified in that behalf in the said section:

And whereas by the five hundred and eightythird section of the same Act (Part X), it is enacted that a byelaw under that part of that Act shall not take effect until it is submitted to His Majesty in Council and confirmed by Order

And whereas the Trinity House, being the Pilotage Authority under the said Act for the London and English Channel Districts, the limits whereof now are "The waters of the Thames and Medway as high as London Bridge and Rochester Bridge respectively, and also the sea and channels leading thereto or therefrom as far as Orfordness to the North and Dungeness to the South, and the seas between Dungeness and the Isle of Wight," has made and submitted, for the confirmation of His Majesty in Council, the byelaw, a copy whereof is set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed, with respect to the Pilotage of the said London and English Channel Dis-

·And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the said byelaw is proper

and reasonable:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Him by the said recited Act, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to approve, and doth by this Order confirm the said byelaw as a byelaw of the said Trivity Haysen with respect to the the said Trinity House with respect to the Pilotage of the London and English Channel Districts and to direct that the said byelaw shall be in operation from and after the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and nine.

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the proposed bye-laws are proper and reasonable and should be confirmed for a limited period:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Him by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to approve and doth by this Order confirm the said bye-laws as set forth in the schedule hereto annexed and doth declare that they shall be in force until the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and eleven.

#### 2. Payments for detention:-

- (a) Vessels piloted to pay, in addition to the above rates, the sum of five shillings per tide for each tide's detention of any pilot on board the vessel at any place between Hull and Goole, except in cases of detention through fog.
- (b) Vessels bound for Goole in charge of a pilot shall pay the sum of five shillings should they, from any unexpected cause (except fog) have to return to the Hull Roads.
- (c) Vessels in charge of a pilot, moved from their berths in the Goole Docks into the river and returning from any cause (except fog) to their berths, shall pay the sum of five shillings.
- (d) In cases where, in the opinion of the Sub-Commissioners of Pilotage at Goole, a pilot is ordered and attends to take a vessel out, without a reasonable probability of the ship being ready, a payment of five shillings shall be made.

## 3. Exemptions from pilotage :—

- (1) Employed in the regular coasting trade of the Kingdom.
- (2) Wholly laden with stone from Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or Man, and being the production thereof.
- (3) Not exceeding one hundred and fifty tons register.
- (4) Not exceeding ten feet draught of water.
- 4. The commission to be paid to the Humber Conservancy Board by the pilots for the collection of pilotage, keeping the accounts and general management shall be five per cent.
- 5. There shall also be paid to the Humber Conservancy Board the sum of two shillings for every occasion on which a Goole Pilot shall be put on board or taken off a vessel in Hull Roads by the steam launch provided by the Board for that purpose, such sum to be payable by the owners, master, or agents of the vessel taking or discharging such pilot.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, it was enacted that, in case it appeared to His Majesty in Council, upon the representation of the Local Government Board, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial-ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial-grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to

order that no new burial-ground should be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case might require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial-grounds or places of burial, should be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances might require; provided always that notice of such representation, and of the time when it should please His Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, should be published in the London Gazette, and should be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation was so considered; provided also that no such representation should be made in relation to the burial-ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation should have been given to the Incumbent and vestry clerk or churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the church-wardens of the parish of Saint Mary the Virgin, Monmouth, ten days' previous notice of their intention to make such representation, made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial ground should be opened in the borough of Monmouth, without the previous approval of the Local Government Board, and that burials should be discontinued in the said borough as hereinafter directed:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the nineteenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and eight, to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, on the seventh day of December, one thousand nine hundred and eight, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been uffixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that no new burial-ground shall be opened in the said borough without the previous approval of the Local Government Board, and that burials in the said borough shall be discontinued as follows, viz.:—

- Monmourn.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Saint Mary the Virgin, Monmouth; and in the churchyard attached thereto except as follows:—
  - (a.) In the vault now existing in the said churchyard and belonging or reputed to belong to the Powell family, burial of the body of Rosa Powell may be allowed at her decease subject to the condition that the coffin be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:
  - (b) In the earthen grave now existing in the said churchyard in which the remains of the late Edward Shellard are interred, burial of the body of Mrs. Shellard may be allowed at her decease subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Saint John's College, Oxford, on the sixth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and eight (and sealed on the twenty-sixth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and eight), has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

Ex parte the President and Fellows of Saint John's College, in the University of Oxford.

A STATUTE made to amend certain Statutes framed by the Commissioners appointed under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 (40 and 41 Vict. c. 48) in relation to Saint John's College, in the University of Oxford, duly passed at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose on the sixth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and eight, by the votes of the whole number of persons present and voting and submitted to His Majesty the King in Council.

Whereas in Statute III, clause 1, paragraph 1 of the Statutes of the said College it is enacted: "The number of Fellowships, exclusive of the Fellowships held ex-officio by the Professor of Arabic and the Sibthorpian Professor, shall not be less than fourteen nor greater than eighteen. Of these so many, not exceeding nine at any one time, as the College shall from time to time deem necessary, shall be Official Fellowships, and the remainder Ordinary Fellowships." And in clause 1, paragraph 3, of the same Statute: - "Ordinary Fellowships shall be tenable for seven years from the day of election But in the computation of such period of seven years, any time may be excluded, not exceeding two years, during which the Fellow has, since his election, been resident in the University, and employed by the College in its educational work upon the terms of having the tenure of his Fellowship so extended: Provided that there shall not be at any one time employed by the College in its educational work more than two holders of Ordinary Fellowships who shall be entitled to an extension of their Fellowships on those terms." And in clause 13, paragraph 1, of the same Statute:—"The President and Fellows may, if they think fit, from time to time at any stated General Meeting elect, without public notice or examination to an Ordinary Fellowship any Professor or Public Reader in the University, any Sub-Librarian or Assistant Librarian in the Bodleian Library, or any person whose attainments in Literature, Science, or Art shill in their judgment qualify him to be a Fellow, and who shall undertake if required, to perform any definite literary, scientific, or educational work in the College, or in the University, or (under the direction of the College or the University) elsewhere, which work shall be specified in the Resolution by which he is elected Provided that the number of persons so elected shall never exceed three at any one time and that, if the emoluments exclusive of fees of a Professor so elected exceed Seven hundred pounds a year, he shall not receive as the emolument of his Fellowship a greater sum than will amount, together with the emoluments of his Professorship, to Nine hundred pounds a year." And in clause 13, paragraph 4, of the same Statute:—" Fellowships held on this tenure shall be reckoned in the number of

eighteen, but not in the number of fourteen, mentioned in clause 1 of this Statute."

And whereas in Statute XX, clause 2, it is enacted:—"So long as any existing Fellow of the College, whether holding his present Fellowship under the Ordinance of 1861 or under the older Statutes, continues to take part in the educational work of the College as Tutor or Lecturer, he shall in the construction of Statute III, clauses 1 and 12, be reckoned in the number of nine Official Fellows mentioned in clause 1 and (if resident in College) in the number of four Official Fellows mentioned in clause 12 of that Statute."

And whereas it appears to us, the President and Fellows of the said College, that it is desirable that the said Statutes shall be altered and amended in manner hereinafter appearing.

Now we, the President and Fellows of the said College, in exercise of the powers vested in us under and by virtue of the fifty-fourth section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, do by this present instrument under our Seal alter and amend the Statutes of the said College as hereinbefore set out in manner following, that is to say:—

In Statute III, clause 1, paragraph 1, by omitting the words "not exceeding nine at

any one time."

In clause 1, paragraph 3, of the same Statute. by adding at the end of such paragraph the words "This paragraph shall not apply to Ordinary Fellows elected under clause 13."

In clause 13, paragraph 1, of the same Statute, by omitting the words "the number of persons so elected shall never exceed three at any one time and that."

By inserting after paragraph 2 of clause 13, of the same Statute, ending with the words "private income," a new paragraph to the following effect:—

"Fellows elected under this clause may be elected for any period of not less than three years and not more than seven years from the day of election."

In clause 13 of the same Statute, by omitting the last paragraph of such clause, beginning with the words "Fellowships held," and ending with the words "this Statute."

In Statute XX, clause 2, by omitting the word "nine."

Whereas by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:
