





- 1. To pay the rent by equal half-yearly instalments.

- 3. To repay to the Corporation all sums of money expended in the maintenance repair or renewal of the transways and the equipment thereof, and so much of the roads as are required to be maintained and repaired by section 28 of the Tramways Act, 1870.

- 8. Not to use any motive power other than electrical power, except in cases of emergency, and to use such power according to regulations.
