

# MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903. County of Middlesex.

Whereas by sub-section 1 of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

OTICE is hereby given that, by an Order of the Local Government Board, dated the 19th day of August, 1909, it is declared. specified. and directed that, on and after the 11th day of October, 1909, the parts and sections of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, hereunder specified, shall be in force within the urban district of Newbiggin-by-the-Sea, but subject as to the sections specified in the schedule thereto to the conditions set forth in such schedule.

Part X, relating to bathing places, provision
of life saving appliances, and power to provision pleasure boats, and extending and amending sections 175 and 176 of the Public Health Act, 1875, as to the purchase of lands for public purposes, and the appropriation and use thereof.

RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL OF MUTFORD AND LOTHINGLAND.

THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.
