PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the twenty-fourth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and nine, in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by section three of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Forces to a person being or having been an Officer, seaman or marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we have had under our consideration the present state of the Active Lists of Commanders and Lieutenants, and the Regulations in force governing the retirement of these Officers, as sanctioned by Orders in Council of Her late Majesty bearing date the 22nd February, 1870, and 16th July, 1895, and by Your Majesty's Order in Council of the 8th December, 1903:

"And whereas, owing to the number of Officers promoted to the rank of Commander and Lieutenant in recent years, the vacancies occurring in the Captains' and Commanders' Lists for some years to come will be insufficient to provide a proper flow of promotion for the ranks below:

- "And whereas we consider that it is necessary in the interests of Your Majesty's Naval Service to take steps to remedy this state of affairs, and that the result desired will be best obtained by fixing at a stated minimum the number of advancements to Captain and Commander to be made annually, and by offering exceptional terms of retirement temporarily with a view to inducing Officers to leave the Active Service before attaining the age for compulsory retirement:
- "And whereas we also consider it necessary that the authorised number of Officers on the Lieutenants' List should be increased:
- "We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the following measures:—
- "(1) That the numbers of Officers to be promoted annually to the rank of Captain and Commander in this and the two following years shall be twenty-four and forty-five respectively, notwithstanding the number of vacancies that may occur annually in those ranks; provided that the number of Commanders be not allowed to fall below the establishment authorised by Orders in Council of the 29th November, 1898, and 12th November, 1900.
- "(2) That we may be empowered to offer temporarily to Captains, Commanders and Lieutenants the exceptional terms of retirement set forth in the annexed Schedule.
- "(3) That the authorised establishment of Lieutenants may be fixed at a maximum of one thousand nine hundred.

"We further beg leave to recommend that these proposals may take effect as from the thirtieth June, one thousand nine hundred and nine, and that we may be empowered to continue in force at the end of three years' time from that date all or such part of the exceptional terms of retirement as we may consider advisable in the interests of Your Majesty's Naval Service, with the concurrence of the Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

"SCHEDULE.

"Exceptional Retirement of Captains, Commanders, and Lieutenants.

"Retired Pay.

"1. The scale of Retired Pay, according to age and eservice, to be as follows, for Captains, Commanders, and Lieutenants. An addition to be made, as specified, for each full year of additional service, or its equivalent, but the same not to exceed five years; and a deduction to be made for each full year wanting to complete the period specified, but the same not to exceed ten years;—

"Officers under thirty years of age to receive half-pay.

"A Commander to be entitled to a minimum rate of retired pay of three hundred pounds a year, provided he has served in that rank for a period of three years and has the requisite service in a ship of war at sea to qualify him for promotion.

"Notes.

- "(1) The above scale of retired pay not to be applicable to Officers retired for misconduct, nor te Officers retired for non-service after being placed on half-pay by order of the Admiralty.
- "(2) Commanders and Lieutenants promoted to those ranks after the introduction of these Regulations to be compulsorily retired for two years' non service instead of three as at present,

except in cases of illness, where the Admiralty should have discretion to retain an Officer for three years.

"(3) The limit of twenty Lieutenants allowed to retire at their own request annually under the age of forty to be removed, but no Lieutenant to be allowed to retire voluntarily under eight years' seniority."

His Majesty having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

- "We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the payment as from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and nine, of a uniform salary of £400 a year to the Lieutenants of Your Majesty's Navy employed in any of the departments of the Admiralty with the exception of (a) those employed in the Hydrographic Department, where the conditions are dissimilar; and (b) those promoted from Commissioned Warrant rank, who are serving under different regulations as regards pay and allowances; subject to the proviso that Lieutenants now in receipt of pay and allowances in excess of £400 a year shall continue to receive them until superseded.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"Whereas by section three of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Royal Marine Forces to a person being or having been an Officer, seaman, or marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we have had under our consideration the pension to be awarded to Mr. Richard J. Butler, C.B., on his retirement from the position of Assistant Engineer-in-Chief

of Your Majesty's Navy:

"And whereas it appears that under the existing Regulations he will be awarded a pension under the Civil Superannuation Acts in respect of his service at the Admiralty since 1875, but cannot receive any pension or Retired Pay in respect of his service as an Engineer Officer in the Royal Navy, which immediately preceded his service at the Admiralty:

"And whereas we are of opinion that this Officer's naval service should reckon for increase

of civil pension:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorize the service rendered by this Officer prior to his transfer to the Civil Service reckoning for pension on the

scale of the Civil Superannuation Acts.
"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received a telegram from His Majesty's Minister at Guatemala, stating that the Government of Honduras has denounced the Commercial Treaty between the United Kingdom and Honduras, of January 21st, 1887. The Treaty will accordingly terminate on October 6th, 1910.

The following Regulations have been made by the Secretary for Scotland under the Trawling in Prohibited Areas Prevention Act, 1909:-

In virtue of the powers conferred on me by the Trawling in Prohibited Areas Prevention Act, 1909, I, the Right Honourable John Baron

Pentland, His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, hereby make the following regulations:

- 1. In the discharge of their duties under section 3 of the Trawling in Prohibited Areas Prevention Act, 1909, (hereinafter referred to as the Act) the Fishery Board for Scotland (hereinafter referred to as the Board) shall receive reports from the commander or officer in charge of any of His Majesty's Ships engaged in fishery superintendence or of a fishery cruiser or from any inspector of fisheries or fishery officer in the Board's employ (each of whom is hereinafter referred to as an officer).
- 2. Such a report shall be made by an officer when either by his own observation or as the result of investigation made by him into statements submitted by other persons he is satisfied on substantial evidence that a trawling or other vessel has been employed (a) in fishing by either of the methods known as beam trawling or otter trawling within a prohibited area as defined by subsection (1) of section five of the Act, or (b) in taking on board fish caught by either of the said methods within any such area.
- 3. Every such report shall be signed by the officer reporting and shall specify :-
 - (1) The names, residences and occupations of two or more witnesses (one of whom may be the officer reporting) who themselves observed such a vessel employed in fishing as aforesaid or in taking on board fish as aforesaid.
 - (2) The date and hour at which the observation was made, and the place, date and hour at which the witnesses' statements were
 - (3) The position or positions of the vessel and of the respective witnesses at or during the time when the observation was made (to be indicated where possible by latitude and longitude or by bearings or soundings).

(4) The conditions of sea and weather pre-

- vailing at the time.
 (5) The observations taken as to the name, and where the vessel is lettered or numbered, the letters and number of the vessel or any other distinguishing marks or characteristics which would assist in identifying the vessel, including the means by which the particulars in this paragraph were observed and recorded.
- (6) In the case of a vessel observed employed in fishing as aforesaid, the manner in which it was ascertained
 - (a) that the vessel was fishing by the method of beam or otter trawling;

(b) that while so fishing she was situate

within a prohibited area.

- (7) In the case of a vessel observed employed in taking on board fish caught as aforesaid, the manner in which it was ascertained
 - (a) that the vessel was taking fish on board;
 - (b) that such fish had been caught by the methods aforesaid and within a prohibited
- (8) The nature of any communication passing at the time of observation between any of the witnesses and the persons on board the vessel implicated.
 - (9) Any other relevant particulars.
- 4. Before making a report an officer shall examine each witness separately with regard to each of the matters mentioned in Regulation 3.

If he is satisfied that a report to the Board is warranted, the officer, after preparing the same,

shall read it aloud or otherwise submit it to each witness, and shall request him to attach his signature as an indication that the report correctly represents the effect of his statements.

5. On receipt of a report from an officer, the Board shall scrutinise the same and may make such further inquiry or take such further steps as they deem necessary for the purpose of examining into the accuracy of the particulars contained therein, and in the event of the Board's being satisfied that the case is one for a notification under section three of the Act the notification shall be made by the Board in the form contained in the schedule annexed hereto or in a similar form, and shall be signed by the Chairman, or by the Secretary or other officer of the Board duly authorised for the purpose.

Provided that where notification by telegram is deemed necessary by the Board, nothing herein contained shall make it illegal to accept such notification embracing the particulars specified in the schedule annexed hereto as a valid notification under the Act; but it shall be the duty of the Board to confirm such notification in writing forthwith.

A copy of every such notification, and a list of the persons to whom it was sent, shall be entered by the Board in a register to be kept for the purpose.

means the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Keighley acting by the Town Council, the expression "omnibus" means any carriage moved by mechanical power (including in that expression steam, electrical, and every other motive power not being animal power), and provided by the Council under the provisions of any Act of Parliament, and the expression "conductor" means any officer or servant in the employment of the Council and having charge of an omnibus.

- 2. No passenger shall smoke in the saloon or lower compartment of any closed omnibus.
- 3. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any omnibus, play or perform upon any musical instrument.
- 4. A person in a state of intoxication shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any omnibus, and if found in or upon any omnibus shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.
- 5. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any omnibus or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any omnibus, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.
- 6. No person shall spit in or upon or against any omnibus.
- 7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any bye-laws, number plate, printed or other notice, in or on the omnibus, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any omnibus. Any person acting in contravention of this Bye-law shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.
- 8. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of an omnibus, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the omnibus, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in cr upon any omnibus, and may be pre vented from mounting any omnibus, and shall not mount any omnibus after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and, if found upon any omnibus, shall, on request of the conductor, leave the omnibus upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned. Provided that, on omnibuses specially run for artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers, no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on an omnibus, under the provisions of this Bye-law, on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

9. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Council the fare legally demandable for the journey.

10. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the conductor or any duly authorized servant of the Council, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

11. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Council, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics or daily labourers.

12. Personal or other luggage to an amount not exceeding 28lbs. in weight (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers)

shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not in the interior or on the roof of

any omnibus.

13. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Council shall be permitted to travel on the steps or platforms of any omnibus, or stand either on the roof or in the interior, or sit on the outside rail on the roof of any omnibus, and shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

14. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or mount any omnibus, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any omnibus or travel therein otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.

15. When any omnibus contains the full number of passengers which it is authorized to contain (such number being indicated in legible characters in a conspicuous place on or within each such omnibus), no additional person, not being an official of the Council, shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such omnibus when warned by the conductor not to do so.

16. The conductor shall not permit any passenger beyond the authorized number to enter or mount or remain in or upon any part of an

17. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave any omnibus whilst in motion.

18. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any omnibus. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any omnibus in breach of this Bye-law shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the omnibus immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

19. No person shall travel in or on any omnibus

of the Council with loaded fire-arms.

20. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Council in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any omnibus.

21. The conductor of each omnibus shall enforce or prevent the breach of these Bye laws

to the best of his ability.

22. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

23. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each omnibus iu use a printed copy of these Byc-laws.

24. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the first day of January, 1910.
