The following are the rules to be observed ;-Gentlemen who have been presented and who wish to attend one of these Levées, are requested to make a written application, as detailed below.

No applications can be received from gentlemen wishing to be presented. Their names must be forwarded by the gentleman making the presentation.

All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists of the Royal Navy and the Royal Marines, of whatever rank, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the First Lord of the Admiralty. All Civil

Officers of the Admiralty will follow the same rule.

All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists, of the Army, Special Reserve, Militia, Territorial Force, Yeomanry, or Volunteers, of whatever rank, except those on the Indian and Colonial Establishments, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the Inspector-General at the Horse Guards, Whitehall, but Officers of the Household Cavalry or the Brigade of Guards should communicate with the Lord Chamberlain at St. James's Palace.

All Officers of the Indian Civil Service and of the Indian Army, of whatever rank, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State at the India

Office, Whitehall.
All Officers of the Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, of whatever rank, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Colonial Office, Whitehall, with the exception of Officers of the local Forces of the Colonies possessing responsible Government, who will apply to the Private Secretary to the Inspector-General at the Horse Guards, Whitehall, for their cards for attendance or for presentation by the Inspector-General. The application must in all cases be supported by a credential from the Governor or Officer com-manding the local Forces of the Colony,

Lord Mayors and Mayors, High Sheriffs, Sheriffs, Recorders, Metropolitan Police Magistrates and other Stipendiary Magistrates, and all gentlemen connected with the Home Office, are

requested to make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Home Secretary.

Judges, Law Officers, King's Counsel, and all Legal Officials holding appointments under the Grown, other than those already mentioned, are requested to make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Lord Chancellor.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (City and County of the City of Chester) Order, 1910.

Dated 6th May, 1910.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the City and County of the City of Chester, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (City and County of the City of Chester) Order, 1910."

BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds or any of them, is prohibited by the Act of 1880, shall be extended, throughout the City and County of the City of Chester, so as to be between the 1st day of March and the 13th day of August in any year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order shall apply within the City and County of the City of Chester to the following species of Wild Birds as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Common Bunting, Reed Bunting, Chiffchaff, Spotted Flycatcher, Heron, Kestrel, Meadow Pipit (Titlark), Red-backed Shrike, Missel Thrush, Wagtail (all species), Blackcap Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Golden-crested Wren.

Protection for all Birds in particular places.

IV. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880 (as extended by Clause II of this Order), does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited on such portions of the River Dee as are within the City and County of the City of Chester.

Certain Birds Protected during the whole of the Year.

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880 (as extended by Clause II of this Order), does not apply, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the City and County of the City of Chester:—

Bittern, Shoveller Duck, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Little Grebe or Dabchick, Gull, Heron, Kingfisher, Brown Linuet, Nightjar (Goat Sucker), Owl, Lesser Redpole, Siskie, Tern, Twite, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker.

Eccs.

Certain Eggs protected.

VI. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the City and County of the City of Chester:—

Bittern, Dunlin, Great Crested Grebe, Little Grebe or Dabchick, Black-headed Gull, Hawfinch, Heron, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Nightjar (Goat Sucker), Owl, Oyster Catcher, Redshank, Sandpiper, Sheldrake, Shrike, Common Tern, Twite, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker Lesser Spotted Woodpecker.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 3RD MAY 1910.)

DESTRUCTIVE INSECTS AND PESTS ORDER OF 1910.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 and 1907, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Notification of Discovery of Insect or Pest.

- 1.—(1.) The occupier of any premises on which an insect or pest mentioned in the Schedule to this Order exists, shall forthwith notify the fact, with particulars of the time and place of discovery to the officer appointed by the Local Authority to receive such notices, or, if no such officer has been appointed, to the Board; and, where practicable, a specimen of the insect or pest shall accompany the notice.
- (2.) An officer of a Local Authority who receives a notice under this Article shall forthwith report the fact to the Local Authority.
- (3.) The Local Authority on receiving in any manner notice of the existence or apparent existence of an insect or pest mentioned in the Schedule to this Order shall forthwith transmit the information to the Board and take such steps as may be necessary to determine to what extent, the insect or pest exists.

Powers of Entry.

2. An Inspector or other officer appointed in that behalf by the Local Authority and any Inspector of the Board may, upon production if so required of his appointment or authority, enter any premises on which he has reason to believe that an insect or pest mentioned in the Schedule to this Order exists or has recently existed, and examine any plant, fruit, crop, seeds, tubers, bulbs, layers or cuttings on such premises.

Action to be taken by Local Authority.

- 3.—(1.) An Inspector or other officer of the Local Authority or of the Board, acting ufider their direction, may at any time and from time to time by a notice served on an occupier of premises on which an insect or pest mentioned in the Schedule hereto exists or recently has existed, require him to adopt such measures for prevention of the spread of the insect or pest as are specified in the notice.
- (2.) Where a Local Authority have consented to pay compensation for such destruction, the notice under this Article may require the occupier of premises on which an insect or pest mentioned in the Schedule hereto exists or recently has existed, to destroy by burning or other effective method all or any of the plants, fruit or crops on the premises, and the Local Authority shall pay compensation for such destruction subject and according to the provisions in that behalf of the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 and 1907.
- (3.) A notice under this Article may prescribe the time within which the adoption of any measure thereby prescribed shall be completed.
- (4.) An occupier may appeal to the Board against a notice, served on him under this

Article by an Inspector or other officer of the Local Authority, and the Board may, after consultation with the Local Authority, cancel the notice or modify its requirements in such manner as the Board think fit.

(5.) For the purposes of this Order a notice shall be deemed to be served on a person if it is delivered to him personally or left for him at his last known place of abode or business or sent through the post in a letter addressed to him there, and a notice or other document purporting to be signed by an Inspector or other officer of a Local Authority or of the Board shall be prima facie evidence that it was signed by him acting under the directions of the Local Authority or the Board as the case may be.

Every person who shall knowingly use, or sell for use, for planting any plant, seed, tuber, bulb, layer or cutting attacked by an insect or pest mentioned in the Schedule to this Order, or any seed, tuber, bulb, layer or cutting which has been derived from a plant so attacked and is capable of spreading the insect or pest, shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

Prohibition of Sale of Specimens.
