Whereas His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh, by Warrant under the Royal Sign

Manual bearing date the eighteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and seven, was pleased to appoint Commissioners to inquire into and report on certain questions relating to the health and safety of Miners and the administration of the Mines Acts, and the prevention of Accidents in Quarries, namely:—

Whether it is desirable to make compulsory the watering of the roads in dry and dusty mines.

Whether it is desirable to prescribe the forms of safety lamp which may be used in mines, or to prohibit any of those now in use.

What steps could be taken for the better prevention of accidents, particularly those from the use and firing of explosives, from falls of roof and side, from underground haulage, and from winding; whether any special provision should be made to facilitate the work of rescue in the event of an accident; and whether any improvement can be made in the present system of investigation and inquiry into accidents.

Whether any steps should be taken to lay down a standard of ventilation in mines.

What steps should be taken to guard against the disease known as Ankylostomiasis.

Whether the present system of special rules is adequate, and whether the method of establishing such rules could not be made simpler and more effective.

Whether any and if so what, steps should be taken to improve the administration of the Mines Acts and the discipline in Mines.

Whether any change is desirable in the present system of examination for Managers' and Under Managers' Certificates of Competency, whether the Managers of Metalliferous Mines should be compelled to hold such certificates, and whether certificates granted by Colonial Governments should not be accepted in this country; and

What steps could be taken for the better prevention of Accidents in Quarries.

And whereas We have deemed it expedient that a further Commission should issue to inquire into and report on the health and safety of persons employed in Metalliferous Mines and Quarries, and also to deal with any matter in relation to Metalliferous Mines and Quarries which was referred to the Commissioners appointed by the aforesaid Royal Warrant of the eighteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and seven:

Now know ye that We do by these Presents determine the powers of the Commissioners appointed as aforesaid so far as they relate to Metalliferous Mines and Quarries, and do further by these Presents nominate, constitute, and appoint you the said Sir Henry Hardinge Samuel Cunynghame (Chairman); Richard Augustine Studdert Redmayne; John Scott Haldane; John Stirling Ainsworth; Richard Methuen Greaves; Richard Arthur Thomas; Robert Thomas Jones; William Lewney and Uriah Lovett to exercise the said powers, and also to inquire into and report on questions relating to the health and safety of persons employed in Metalliferous Mines and Quarries.

And for the better effecting the purposes of this Our Commission, We do by these Presents give and grant unto you, or any three or more of you, full power te call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission; and also to call for, have access to and examine all such books, documents, registers and records as may afford you the fullest information on the subject, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever:

And We do by these Presents authorize and empower you, or any three or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid:

And We do by these Presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment:

And We do further ordain that you, or any three or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time if you shall judge it expedient so to do:

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us, under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any three or more of you. your opinion upon the matters herein submitted for your consideration:

Given at Our Court at Saint James's, the thirtieth day of Moy, one thousand nine hundred and ten, in the first year of Our Reign.

"And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the first day of June, one thousand nine hundred and seven, sanction was given for the payment of special allowances to Junior Captains and other Officers selected for the Staff of the Royal Naval War College:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the special allowance therein laid down for Junior Captains should be applicable to all Captains of Your Majesty's Navy while serving on the Staff of the Royal Naval War College:

"And whereas we further consider that the qualifications required of the Royal Marine Officer selected for the Staff of the War College merit a higher rate of extra remuneration than the allowance of four shillings a day sanctioned by the above-mentioned Order in Council.

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the following

"The special allowance of six shillings a day to be payable, as from the first January

Captains Royal Navy serving on the Staff of the Royal Naval War College whatever may be their seniority.

"In the event of a Major or Captain of the Royal Marines of five years' seniority, who has assed the Staff College, being selected for the Staff of the Royal Naval War College, the special allowance to be increased, at the discretion of the Admiralty, to six shillings a day, to take effect on the relief of the Officer now holding the appointment.

"Power to be reserved to the Admiralty to grant the temporary rank of Major to a Captain of five years' seniority when selected for the Staff of the War College.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed; and the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
