At St. James's Palace on the 22nd instant The King received on the Throne Deputations with Addresses from the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, the Corporation of the City of Edinburgh, and the University of Edinburgh, as follows:—

Church of Scotland.

To the King's Most Excellent Majesty.

We, Your Majesty's most loyal and dutiful subjects, Ministers and Elders of the Church of Scotland met in General Assembly, desire to be permitted, with all loyal respect, to tender to Your Majesty, to our gracious Queen, and to Your Royal Family, an expression of our deep sympathy with You in the great and unlookedfor loss by death of one so near and precious to You as our late beloved Sovereign of glorious memory, in intercourse with whom Your Majesty enjoyed, as we have learned from Your Majesty's own words, not only a father's love, but also the affectionate intimacy of a dear friend and adviser,—and whose reign, though short, had gained for Him, in unsurpassed degree, the affectionate trust of His people and the honour of the whole world.

The greatness of the two successive reigns of Your Royal Grandmother and Father, and the blessings which the nation owes to Their thoughtful care and Their devotion to the public good, make the begining of a new reign momentous to the whole people, and we desire to assure Your Majesty that our eyes are turned toward You, with concern indeed, that a time of sore bereavement should also be one of greatly

increased responsibilities, but with thankful expectancy and hope for the future, because of the confidence we have in Your Majesty's high purpose, faith in God, trust in Your people, wide knowledge of them, and strong desire for the progress in all good of those over whom in the providence of God You have been called to reign.

Never before have the people of this country been so conscious of the blessing to them of a constitutional Sovereign, uniting in one loyalty and trust men of many conflicting opinions and interests,—men even of different races and regions of the world. Nor ever have our people been more aware of the delicacy, the difficulty, and the toilsomeness of the tasks to which Your Majesty is called as their Sovereign. We ask leave to assure Your Majesty of the loyal and devoted support which the ministers, elders, and members of the Church of Scotland will unanimously give You, and of the earnest prayers which we shall continually offer that Your Majesty may be sustained by an unfailing assurance that the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, Who has called You to a place than which there is none greater for its influence on the happiness of men and the history of the world, will constantly supply You with His own grace and guidance, that He will make You equal in body, mind, and spirit, to the successive duties which He lays upon You, that He will uplold You by the increasing trust and affection of Your people, and that He will bless You in the comfort of Your family life, especially in the presence by Your side of Her whom, in His great goodness, He has given to be Your helpmate. We are assured that in thus addressing Your

Majesty we express not only our own earnest wishes, but also the general mind and feeling of the people of Your Majesty's ancient kingdom of

We are greatly encouraged in our work for the spiritual good of our beloved country by knowing that Your Majesty, on the first day of your accession to the Throne, signed the Declaration provided for in the Act of Union of the Kingdoms, that You will maintain and preserve inviolably the settlement of the true Protestant religion, with the government, worship, discipline, rights and privileges of the Church of Scotland as established by law. We are equally encouraged by Your Majesty's expressed deter-mination that the countenance and favour which the Church of Scotland received from Your Illustrious Father it shall ever receive un-diminished from Your Majesty. It is also very welcome to our hearts that Your Majesty, our gracious Queen, and Your Royal Family, are familiar with Scotland and with the worship of the Scottish Church.

That Your Majesty's reign may be long, that its years may be years of peace, that it may be another reign in succession of increasing honour, stability, power for good in the world, loyal allegiance to the Sovereign from the whole people, and rich blessing from God upon Yourself and Your Royal Consort, is the heart's desire and prayer of,

**THEREAS by section sixteen of the

Pluralities Act, 1838, as amended by section eight of the Pluralities Act, 1850, it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That "with an abstract of the title to any advowson."

"whenever it shall appear to the Archbishop" " of the Province, with respect to his own diocese, "and whenever it shall be represented to him by "the Bishop of any diocese, or by the Bishops of "any two dioceses, that two or more benefices, or "that one or more benefice or benefices, and one " or more spiritual sinecure rectory or rectories, " vicarage or vicarages, in his or their diocese or "dioceses, being either in the same parish or contiguous to each other, and of which the "aggregate population shall not exceed one "thousand five hundred persons, may, with "advantage to the interests of religion, be united "into one benefice, the said Archbishop of the "Province shall inquire into the circumstances of "the case; and if on such inquiry it shall appear "to him that such union may be usefully made, "and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that "the patron or patrons of the said benefices, "sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicar-"ages respectively, is or are consenting thereto, "such consent being signified in writing under "the hands of such patron or patrons, the said "Archbishop shall, six weeks before certifying "such inquiry and consent to His Majesty as "hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own diocese, a statement in writing of the " facts, and in other cases a copy in writing of "the aforesaid representation to be affixed on or 'near the principal outer door of the church, or "in some public and conspicuous place in each of " such benefices, sinecure rectories or vicarages, "with notice to any person or persons interested, that he, she, or they, may, within such six "weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or "their hand or hands, to the said Archbishop, "against such union; and if no sufficient cause" be shown within such time, the said Archbishop "shall certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid "to His Majesty in Council, and thereupon it "shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to "make and issue an Order or Orders for uniting "such benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, "vicarage or vicarages, into one benefice, with "cure of souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only;"

And whereas by section twenty-three of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners Act, 1841, it is enacted, "that whenever it shall be made to "appear to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for "England that it would be expedient to make an "exchange of an advowson or of any right of "patronage, for any other advowson or right of patronage, with a view to proceedings being "taken for the union of two or more benefices, "under the provisions of the Pluralities Act, "1838, it shall be lawful for the said Com-"nissioners, with the consent of the patron or "patrons of every such advowson or right of "patronage, and also in case any such advowson or right of patronage shall be vested in or belong to any Ecclesiastical Corporation, "aggregate or sole, with the consent of the "Bishop of the diocese, or in the case of benefices lying in more than one diocese then "with the consent of the Bishop of each diocese, "and where a Bishop shall be himself one of the "patrons with the consent of the Archbishop of the Province, to certify the same to such "Archbishop; and that thereupon, if the said "Archbishop shall think fit, proceedings may be "taken, under and in pursuance of the pro-"visions of the said last-mentioned Act, for "effecting the union of such benefices; and the "said Archbishop, at the same time that he shall "certify to His Majesty in Council the inquiry "and consent referred to in the same Act, shall "transmit such certificate of the said Com-"missioners to His Majesty in Council, together

"or right of patronage mentioned in the certi-"ficate of the said Commissioners other than "advowsons or rights of patronage belonging to "any such Ecclesiastical Corporation as afore-"said, and the opinion of counsel on such title; "and that thereupon it shall be lawful for His "Majesty in Council, in any Order for such "licence made and issued under the provisions "of the same Act, to order that such exchange as aforesaid shall take effect; and upon such "Order being made and registered pursuant to "the said Act, the said exchange shall be valid "and effectual, without any other assurance in "the law, and notwithstanding that the advow-"sons or rights of patronage, or any or either of them, exchanged by virtue of the said Order, "were, or was previously thereto, vested in or "belonged to any such Ecclessiastical Cor-"poration as aforesaid; and the respective "exchangees, their heirs, appointees, successors "and assigns, shall thenceforth stand seized of "the advowsons or rights of patronage so taken "in exchange, in the same manner to all intents "and purposes and subject to the same trusts, "powers, limitations, charges and incumbrances "(if any), as the advowsons or rights of "patronage by them given in exchange were "respectively held and were subject."

And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Acts, hath duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a certificate in writing, bearing date the twenty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and ten, in the words following, that is to say:

"We the undersigned Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, Primate of All England and Metropolitan, do hereby certify

to Your Majesty in Council-

"That the Right Reverend John, Lord Bishop of Salisbury, as Bishop of the diocese within which are situate the vicarage of Toller Porcorum, otherwise Great Toller, and the vicarage of Toller Fratrum, otherwise Little Toller, with the chapelry of Wynford Eagle annexed, both in the county of Dorset, having represented unto us that the said benefices being contiguous to each other and of which the aggregate popula-tion does not exceed fifteen hundred persons might with advantage to the interests of religion be united into one benefice, we enquired into the circumstances of the case:

"That on such enquiry it appeared to us that such union might be usefully made and would not be of inconvenient extent and that Robert Williams, of Bridehead, in the said county of Dorset, Member of Parliament, being the Patron or person entitled to present to the said vicarage of Great Toller (if the same were now vacant) and the Right Honourable Philip George, sixth Baron Wynford, being the Patron or person entitled to present to the said vicarage of Little Toller with the chapelry of Wynford Eagle annexed (the same being now vacant), have consented to the proposed union and to the exchange of entropage hereinefter referred to exchange of patronage hereinafter referred to:

"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such enquiry and consent to Your Majesty in Council, we caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed to the principal outer door of the parish church of each of the said benefices with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to us the said Archbishop against such union and no such cause has been shown:

"The representation of the said Lord Bishop of Salisbury, our enquiry into the circumstances of the case, the statement of circumstances in reply thereto, the consents in writing of the said Robert Williams and the said Baron Wynford as Patrons of the said benefices of Great Toller and Little Toller, with the chapelry of Wynford Eagle respectively and the copies of the representation and notices before mentioned are hereunto annexed:

"And we do hereby certify the enquiry and consents aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for uniting the said benefices into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes, and further that in pursuance of a certificate by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, dated the fifteenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and nine, we recommend that the advowson or right of patronage of the said benefice of Little Toner with Wynford Eagle should be exchanged for the advowson or right of patronage of West Compton alias Compton Abbas West, in the said county of Dorset and diocese of Salisbury, and we therefore transmit herewith to Your Majesty in Council such certificate together with abstracts of the title to the said advowsons respectively, and Counsel's opinion thereon.

And whereas the certificate of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners and the consents of the Patrons referred to in the Archbishop's said certificate are as follows:-

"To the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Can-

terbury:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the Right Honourable Philip George, Baron Wynford, Patron of the benefice of Little Toller, in the county of Dorset and in the diocese of Salisbury, and with the consent also of Colonel Robert Williams, a Member of the Commons House of Parliament and Patron of the benefice of West Compton (alias Compton Abbas West), in the same county and diocese, do hereby certify to your Grace, in pursuance of an Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, that it has been made to appear to us that with a view to proceedings being taken under the provisions of the Pluralities Act, 1838, and the Acts amending the same for the union of the said benefice of Little Toller with the benefice of Great Toller in the same county and diccese, it would be expedient to make an exchange of the advowson or right of patrouage of the said benefice of Little Toller for the advowson or right of patronage of the said benefice of West Compton."

"To the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury:-

"We, Robert Williams, of Bridehead, in the county of Dorset, Member of Parliament, being the Patron or person entitled to present to the vicarage of Toller Porcorum otherwise Great Toller, if the same were now vacant, and to the rectory of Compton Abbas West, otherwise West Compton, the same being now vacant, and the Right Honourable Philip George, sixth Baron Wynford, being the Patron or person now entitled to present to the vicarage of Toller Fratrum, otherwise Little Toller, with the chapelry of Wynford Eagle annexed, the same being now vacant, do, by this writing

under our hands, signify to your Grace our consents (1) to the exchange of the patronage of the benefice of Little Toller with Wynford Eagle annexed, for the patronage of the benefice of West Compton, and (2) to the union of the said vicarage of Toller Porcorum, otherwise Great Toller, with the said vicarage of Toller Fratrum, otherwise Little Toller, with the chapelry of Wynford Eagle annexed, into one benefice with the cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes only, and that the patronage of such united benefice shall become vested in and be exercised by me, the said Robert Williams, Patron of the present benefice of the vicarage of Toller Porcorum, otherwise Great Toller, my heirs and assigns.



(a) In the following Bye-Laws the expression "range area" shall be understood to apply to the area enclosed between lines starting at the discharging station which is situated at a point on the west shore of the Loch, about midway between Ardgatan Point and the head of the Loch; these lines starting 100 yards east and 100 yards west of the line of targets which extends 7,000 yards therefrom in a southerly direction through the middle of the area, and ending at its extreme limit, 200 yards east and 200 yards west of such centre line.

(b) The range area actually in use at any time will be limited as regards its length by the most southerly target in use at that time, and such target and the intervening targets will be indicated by flags, as described in Bye-Law No. 3.

(c) The limits of the total range area will be indicated by white obelisks. These will be erected at or near highwater mark at each end of the range, and on both sides of the Loch.

2. The torpedo range will be in use for running uncharged torpedoes for several hours daily with the exception of Sundays, and, as a general rule, Saturday afternoons. But on Saturday afternoons, from the 15th June to the 15th September, both dates inclusive, the range area shall not be closed to the public.

There will be intervals between consecutive

3. (a) When the range is in use, flags (as described below) will be hoisted at the dis charging station, at the furthest target in use at

the time, and at the intervening targets.
(b) When red flags are hoisted halfway up, it will be a warning signal that preparations are being made for a torpedo to be run, and that the

range must be cleared. (c) When this warning signal is exhibited any vessel within the range area must move out of it

with all reasonable speed.

(d) The red flags will be hoisted "close up" immediately before the torpedo is discharged, and kept flying in that position until the torpedo has completed its run, which occupies from two to six minutes.

(e) When white flags are hoisted it will be a sign that running torpedoes is temporarily suspended.

Vessels or boats having occasion, in the course of their passage, to cross the line of range, or to enter any portion of the range area, as defined by Bye-law No. 1 (b), may do so at any time when white flags are displayed.
