Declaring His Majesty's Pleasure touching His Royal Coronation and the Solemnity thereof.

GEORGE R. I.

Whereas We have resolved, by the Favour and Blessing of Almighty God, to celebrate the Solemnity of Our Royal Coronation, and of the Coronation of Our dearly beloved Consort the Queen, upon a day in June next to be hereafter determined, at Our Palace at Westminster; and forasmuch as by ancient Customs and Usages of this Realm, as also in regard of divers Tenures of sundry Manors, Lands, and other Hereditaments many of Our loving Subjects do claim and are bound to do and perform divers Services on the said Day, and at the Time of the Coronation, as in Times precedent their Ancestors and those from whom they claim have done and performed at the Coronations of Our famous Progenitors and Predecessors, Kings and Queens of this Realm; We, therefore, out of Our Princely Care for the Preservation of the lawful Rights and Inheritances of Our loving subjects whom it may concern, have thought fit to give Notice of and publish Our Resolution therein; and do hereby give notice of and publish the same accordingly: And We do hereby further signify, That, by Our Commission under Our Great Seal of the United Kingdom, We have appointed and authorized The Most Reverend Father in God Our right trusty and right entirely beloved Counsellor Randall Thomas Archbishop of Canterbury, Primate of All England and Metropolitan; Our right trusty and well

And We do further by this Our Royal Proclamation signify and declare that We do for Ourself, and for Our dearly beloved Consort the Queen, dispense, upon the occasion of this Our Coronation, with the services and attendance of all persons who declaim and are attendance of all persons who do claim and are bound to do and perform any services which, according to ancient custom or usage, are to be performed in Westminster Hall or in the Procession. And We do hereby further graciously declare that the same shall not interfere with the rights and privileges of any of Our loving Subjects to claim the performances of such several services or any of them at any future Coronation. And We do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, declare and make known to all such of Our loving Subjects as it may concern, that it seems good to Us that the Committee of Claims shall, upon the occasion of this Our Coronation, exclude from their consideration such claims as may be submitted to them in respect of rights or services connected with the parts of the ceremonial in times past performed in Westminster Hall and with the Procession.

Given at Our Court at Saint James's, this nineteenth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and ten, and in the first year of Our Reign.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirtyhereunto annexed, should be assigned as a lihird and thirty-lourth years of Her late Majesty

Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of paironage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Hanley William with Hanley Child, in the county of Worcester and in the diocese of Hereford.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Hanley William with Hanley Child is vested for an estate in fee simple in possession free from incumbrances in the Reverend Ernest Edward Lea, of the Rectory, Eastham, Tenbury, in the county of Worcester, Clerk in Holy

"And whereas the said Ernest Edward Lea is desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Hanley William with Hunley Child, now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Right Reverend John, now Bishop of Hereford, in right of

"And whereas the said John, now Bishop of Hereford, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness, and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which, by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited, or by some or one of them is made necessary, he, the said John, Bishop of Hereford, has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Hanley William with Hanley Child, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed, will, in our opinion, tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the parish of Hanley William with Hanley Child.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Ernest Edward Lea (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme), and with the consent of the said John, Bishop of Hereford (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Hanley William with Hanley Child now vested in him, the said Ernest Edward Lea as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said John, Bishop of Hereford, and his successors in the same bishoprick, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said John, Bishop of Hereford, and his successors in the same bishoprick for ever.

HEREAS by an Order made by the late King's Most Excellent Mujesty in Council, on the nineteenth March, one thousand nine hundred and eight, His Majesty was pleased to order that, where any property belonging to or held for the benefit of a unit of Volunteers or Yeomanry mentioned in the first column of the schedule to that Order was vested in or held by any trustees other than the commanding officer of such unit, those trustees should, until otherwise directed by Order in Council under section twenty-nine of the Territorial and Reserve Forces Act, 1907, be appointed in regard to the property so vested in or held by them to be special trustees, to the exclusion of the Associations, and should continue to hold such property in trust for the corresponding unit of the Territorial Force in like manner in all respects as they previously held it for the unit of the Volunteers or Yeomanry, and the corresponding unit should notwithstanding any trust, limitation, or condition affecting any such property, continue entitled to the benefit thereof in like manner as the unit was entitled thereto before it became a unit of the Territorial Force.

And whereas by virtue of the above-recited provisions of the said Order the trustees named in the first column of the schedules A and B to this Order hold the respective properties men-tioned in the second columns of these schedules in trust for the respective units of the Territorial Force mentioned in the third columns of these schedules under and in virtue of the deeds the dates and parties whereto are respectively specified in the fourth columns of these schedules, and it is expedient that such properties should be transferred from those trustees to the respective County Associations mentioned in the fifth columns of these schedules.

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the parish of Yatton Keynell, in the county of Wilts, ten days' previous notice of their intention in that behalf have made a representation to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial-ground in the civil parish of Yatton Keynell aforesaid, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued in the said parish as hereinafter directed:

#### Whitehall, July 22, 1010.

The KING has been pleased to award the Edward Medal of the First Class to Mr. William Henry Pickering, one of His Majesty's Inspectors of Mines, and to Mr. George Handle Silkstone, an Enginewright, also the Edward Medal of the Second Class to Mr. Isaac Hodges, Mining Agent, Mr. Albert Moore, Chargeman Sinker, Mr. James Hosey, Sinking Contractor, and Mr. Alfred Jones, Surface Foreman, under the following circumstances.

A serious shaft accident occurred on the 7th May last, at the Water Haigh Mine, by which six men lost their lives. The mine, which is situated at Oulton, about five miles east of Leeds, consists of four pits in course of sinking to develop a new mining area. Shaft No. 1 where the accident happened had been sunk to a depth of 109 yards, and the work of lining it with brickwork was being proceeded with. Skeleton iron rings are used to support the shaft during the process and it is necessary to remove these as the work of the bricking progresses.

At about 8 A.M. on the day mentioned, seven workmen, including a chargeman, were standing on a heavy scaffold, secured by bolts into the side of the shaft, engaged in the work of removing one of the iron rings. The chargeman, evidently having noticed some indication of danger, sent one of the men to the surface to call the master sinker, and, shortly after he had left, the scaffold gave way. Five of the men were hurled to the bottom of the shaft, and killed on the spot; but one of them, Patrick McCarthy, met with a less merciful death, being trapped by the legs between the heavy scaffold and the side of the shaft and partly buried by shale falling from the side, where he lingered in agony for over seven hours. Persistent efforts were made to rescue McCarthy from his perilous position.

Silkstone, Moore, Hosey and Jones were among the first to descend the pit when it was known that an accident had happened. In response to McCarthy's cries for help, they tried

to release him in spite of imminent danger from falling stones and bricks, but they were obliged to return to the surface for tools. Mr. Hodges, who had by this time reached the mine, immediately went down the pit and decided to build a temporary scaffold. Moore was given charge of this work and carried it out with admirable coolness and resource.

Mr. Pickering, His Majesty's Inspector of Mines, arrived on the scene just when this was completed, and accompanied by Mr. Hodges and Silkstone, Moore and Hosey, he entered the pit and reached the place where poor McCarthy was held a prisoner. In this descent Silkstone's head was severely injured by a falling stone, and Mr. Hodges and Hosey were also slightly injured. They found McCarthy still alive but the water was rising fast in the shaft and had reached his shoulders. It was evident that he would soon be drowned and that nothing could be done further to rescue him unless the water were lowered. Mr. Pickering at once sent all his fellow rescuers to the surface to enable a larger "bowk" to be put on and more men to be sent down to bale the water. In the meantime Mr. Pickering resolutely stayed by McCarthy-now almost delirious with his sufferings-and supporting his head on his arms and breast, he administered such comfort as he could to the dying man. Realising that McCarthy could not live until the water was baled out, Mr. Pickering decided that the only hope was immediate amputation of the legs, and at his request Mr. Hodges brought down two doctors and a Roman Catholic Priest, but McCarthy's terrible sufferings came to an end just as they reached him.

Mr. Pickering ran imminent risk of losing his life during the time that he stayed with McCarthy. Silkstone descended the pit no less than four times and did not desist until he had been severely injured. Mr. Hodges went down with three separate parties and displayed great bravery and skill in directing the work of the attempted rescue. Moore and Hosey also made three descents and showed great courage and presence of mind in face of danger, while Jones who organized the first rescue party was only prevented from continuing his brave endeavours by being injured so seriously that he could not

return to work for six weeks.

YORKSHIRE (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1910.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1909, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Movement into out of or within Scheduled District.

1. No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved into or out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along over or across a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the Scheduled

District where they are moved through such I District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such District.

#### Local Authority to enforce Order.

2. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

#### Offences.

3.—(1) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2) If any person with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows a head of cattle or a sheep or goat or pig to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4. This Order may be cited as the Yorkshire (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1910.


To all to whom these presents shall come the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England send Greeting:

WHEREAS a new church has lately been built within the parish of East Cowton, in the county of York and in the diocese of Ripon, and has been consecrated and is known as the church of All Saints.

And whereas the Right Reverend William Boyd, Bishop of the said diocese of Ripon, as such Bishop, the Reverend Walter Illingworth, of the Grammar School, Kirkby Ravensworth, in the said county of York, Clerk in Holy Orders, George Galilee, of Kirkby Ravensworth aforesaid, Farmer, and John Bousfield, of Dowsgill, Kirkby Hill, in the said county of York, Farmer, on behalf of the Wardens, Master of the Scholars and the Poor of the Almshouse or Hospital of Saint John the Baptist, of Kirkby Ravensworth, the patrons of the vicarage of the said parish of East Cowton, and the Reverend Robert Gifford Wood, Clerk in Holy Orders, as the Vicar or Incumbent of the said vicarage, have by an Instrument under their hands, bearing date on or about the nineteenth day of March, in the year one thousand nine hundred and ten, certified to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, that it would be for the convenience of the said parish of East Cowton that the said new church of All Saints, situate within such parish, should be substituted for the old parish church (known as the church of Saint Mary) of the same parish.

"Car" means any carriage or car run by the Corporation upon the transways for the con-

veyance of passengers.

"Conductor" means any servant of the Corporation having the charge of or helping in the charge of a car.

2. No person shall bring on to any car any parcel which exceeds 28 lbs. in weight, or which he is not able to carry in his hand, without causing annoyance or inconvenience to passengers. Provided that a passenger may carry

upon a car a parcel which does not fulfil the conditions before mentioned if such parcel does not exceed 28 lbs. in weight, and does not exceed 4 ft. in length, or 1 ft. 6 ins. in its other dimensions, and which does not cause hindrance or annoyance to passengers or damage to the car on his placing the same in such position on the car as shall be directed by the conductor, and on his paying to the conductor the charge which may from time to time be fixed by the Corporation and exhibited in such car.

3. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

4. These Bye-laws shall come into force on

4. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the 19th day of September, one thousand nine hundred and ten.

5. From and after the 19th day of September, one thousand nine hundred and ten, No. 14 of the Bye-laws made by the Corporation on the third day of April, 1907, under section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, shall be repealed.

And notice is also given, that a true copy of such Bye-laws has this day been laid before the Board of Trade, and unless such Bye-laws, or any of them, shall be disallowed by the said Board within two calendar months from the date hereof, the same will come into force on the 19th day of September, 1910.
