or extraordinary exposure or exertion on Service within two years of being first certified to be ill:

"And whereas we deem it expedient to grant a pension to the widow of Jeremiah McCarthy, late a Leading Stoker of His Majesty's Ship 'Isis,' and a pension and allowances to the widow and children of Harry A.
