CEREMONIALS OBSERVED AT THE FUNERAL AND LYING IN
STATE OF HIS LATE MAJESTY KING EDWARD THE
SEVENTH OF BLESSED MEMORY.

FROM BUCKINGHAM PALACE TO WESTMINSTER HALL, MAY 17TH, 1910.

Guards of Honour from the Royal Navy and Brigade of Guards were mounted at Buckingham Palace, and from the Brigade of Guards and Royal Marine Light Infantry at Westminster Hall.

At 11.30 precisely in the morning the Royal Coffin was removed from Buckingham Palace by a party of Warrant Officers and Sergeants of the Brigade of Guards under the command of an Officer, and placed upon a gun carriage, and the Crown and Cushion, the Regalia and the Insignia of the Garter laid thereon.

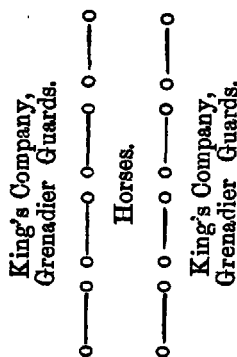

On arriving at Westminster Hall, where Members of both Houses of Parliament were present, that portion of the Procession which preceded the Coffin was received by the Heralds and Pursuivants of Arms and conducted up to the steps at the end of the Hall, where the Officers of the Navy and Army, and the Officers of Arms composing it, remained during the service.

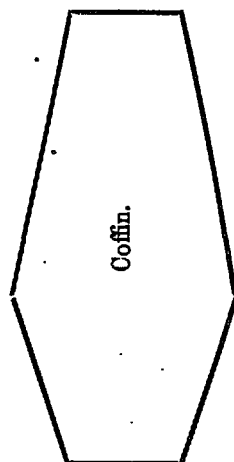
On the arrival of the Coffin at Westminster Hall, it was taken from the Gun Carriage by the Bearer Party of the Brigade of Guards, and was received by The Archbishop of Canterbury, The

The Archbishop of Canterbury, The Lord Great Chamberlain and The Earl Marshal took their stand with the Equerries near the Foot of the Coffin.

The members of the Royal Households and Suites followed the Royal Procession into Westminster Hall, on entering which they were shown by Officers of the Guards on special duty to places reserved for them immediately on the right and left.

The Service having been concluded, His Majesty The King and the other Royal mourners were conducted by The Archbishop of Canterbury, The Earl Marshal and the Officers of Arms to the entrance of Westminster Hall.

A Guard of eight Gentlemen at Arms were on duty over the Royal Coffin throughout the Service.

The Remains of His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh, of Blessed Memory, lay in State in Westminster Hall from Tuesday, the Seventeenth of May, to Friday, the Twentieth of the same month.

During the Lying in State, Four Gentlemen at Arms stood at the head of the Coffin, and four Yeomen of the Guard stood at the four corners of the Catafalque. Two Officers of the Household Cavalry and Brigade of Guards were also stationed on either side, and a native Orderly Officer of the Ghurka Rifles at the foot of the Coffin.

The Public was admitted to Westminster Hall on Tuesday, the Seventeenth of May, from four o'clock in the afternoon to ten o'clock in the evening; on Wednesday, the Eighteenth, and Thursday, the Nineteenth of May, from six o'clock in the morning to ten o'clock in the evening.

ON FRIDAY, THE TWENTIETH DAY OF MAY, Guards of Honour from the Royal Navy and the Brigade of Guards were mounted at Westminster Hall and Paddington Railway Station.

At 9.45 o'clock precisely in the morning the Royal Coffin was removed from Westminster Hall by the Bearer Party of the Brigade of Guards, and placed upon a Gun Carriage, and the Crown and Cushion, the Regalia, and the Insignia of the Garter laid thereon.

Minute Guns were fired while the Procession moved from Westminster Hall to Paddington Station.

The King, the Members of the Royal Family, the Royal Representatives (with the exception of those whose names appear in the carriage procession), the Earl Marshal, and the Master of the Horse, rode on horseback.

The Coffin was taken from the Gun Carriage, on the arrival at Paddington Station, by a Bearer Party of the Brigade of Guards, and was placed in the Royal Train, which also conveyed The King and the other Royal personages who took part in the procession.

On arriving at Windsor the Coffin, preceded by the Earl Marshal, was removed from the train by the Bearer Party of the Brigade of Guards, and placed upon a Gun Carriage drawn by the Royal Navy. The Coffin was covered by a Pall of Purple Velvet and the Royal Standard, on which rested the Crown, with the Regalia, also the Insignia of the Order of the Garter.

Guards of Honour from the Royal Navy and the Brigade of Guards were mounted at the Great Western Railway Station, and from the Brigade of Guards at St. George's Chapel.

Fourth Division Escort, Royal Horse Guards, dismounted.

A Guard of Honour of the Scots Guards was mounted in the Horse Shoe Cloister.

On arrival at the Chapel, the Officer commanding the London District and his Staff, the Aides-de-Camp, the Deputations of Officers from Foreign Navies and Armies, and the Head Quarter Staff of the Army, arranged themselves on either side of the steps leading to the West Door and followed the Suites of the Foreign Royal Guests into the Chapel.

The Pursuivants, Heralds, and Lyon, Ulster and Norry Kings of Arms, moved up the Nave of the Chapel, ranging themselves on either side of the entrance to the Choir, and Garter King of Arms, accompanied by Black Rod, passed into the Choir to be in readiness to pronounce the Styles of His late Majesty.

At the West Door of the Chapel the Royal Remains were received by—

The Archbishop of Canterbury,
 The Archbishop of York;
 The Bishop of Winchester, Prelate of the Order of the Garter,
 The Bishop of Oxford, Chancellor of the Order of the Garter,
 The Dean of Windsor, Registrar of the Order of the Garter,

with the Canons, Minor Canons, Lay Clerks and Choristers of St. George's Chapel.

The Procession moved up the Nave headed by the Choir and Clergy, and the Opening Sentences of the Burial Service and the Psalm "Lord, Thou hast been our Refuge," were chanted.

The Gold Sticks and White Staves proceeded on either side of this Procession into the Choir.

Behind the Coffin, which was immediately preceded by The Earl Marshal, The Lord Steward, and the Lord Chamberlain, walked The King, the other members of the Royal Family, the Royal Representatives and the remainder of the Procession; those who had ranged themselves outside the West Door fell in after the suites of the Special Envoys.

His Majesty The King, Chief Mourner, with Queen Alexandra, stood at the Head of the Coffin, followed by The German Emperor with The Empress Marie Féodorovna and the other Sovereigns present, the Royal Princes and the Foreign Representatives.

The Lord Chamberlain of His Majesty's Household took his place at the Foot of the Coffin.

The Lesson was read by The Dean of Windsor, followed by the Anthem, "His body is buried in peace: but His name liveth for evermore."

The Prayers were read by The Archbishop of Canterbury, and the Sentence, "I heard a voice from Heaven" was sung.

The Prayer, "Almighty God, with Whom do live the spirits of them that depart hence in the Lord," was said by The Bishop of Winchester, which was followed by the Hymn, "My God, my Father, while I stray."

The Collect was said by The Archbishop of York.

Sir Alfred Scott Scott-Gatty, Garter Principal King of Arms, pronounced the Styles of His late Most Sacred Majesty of Blessed Memory :—

"Thus it hath pleased Almighty God to take out of this transitory life unto His Divine Mercy, the late Most High, Most Mighty, and Most Excellent Monarch, Edward VII., by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, and Sovereign of the Most Noble Order of the Garter.

"Let us humbly beseech Almighty God to bless with long life, health and honour, and all worldly happiness, the Most High, Most Mighty, and Most Excellent Monarch, Our Sovereign Lord George, now, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, and Sovereign of the Most Noble Order of the Garter."

"GOD SAVE THE KING."

The Hymn, "Now the labourer's task is o'er," was sung, and The Archbishop of Canterbury pronounced the Benediction.

The Company Colour of the King's Company of the Grenadier Guards was handed to The King by Field-Marshal His Royal Highness The Duke of Connaught, and placed on the Coffin by His Majesty.

As the sentence of committal to the Grave was read by The Archbishop of Canterbury, earth was cast upon the Coffin by Lieut.-Colonel Sir Charles Frederick, Master of the Household to His late Majesty.

Knights of the Most Noble Order of the Garter were present in St. George's Chapel.

The Ambassadors and the other Chefs de Mission of the Corps Diplomatique were accompanied and shown into seats reserved for them in the Chapel by the Hon. Arthur Walsh, C.V.O., Master of the Ceremonies, the Hon. R. Moreton, M.V.O., Marshal of the Ceremonies, and R. F. Synge, Esq., C.M.G., Deputy-Marshal of the Ceremonies.

His Majesty's Body Guard of the Honourable Corps of Gentlemen at Arms, under the Command of the Lieutenant, Colonel Sir Henry Hugh Oldham, C.V.O., Standard Bearer, Colonel Sir Aubone Fife, C.V.O., Clerk of the Cheque and Adjutant, Lieut.-Colonel Henry A. Fletcher, C.V.O., and Officiating Sub-Officer, Captain J. H. Waller, M.V.O., were on duty in the Choir of the Chapel, and The King's Body Guard of Yeomen of the Guard, under the Command of the Lieutenant, Colonel Sir Reginald Hennell, D.S.O., Ensign, Major E. H. Elliot, M.V.O., and Clerk of the Cheque and Adjutant, Captain Houston French, were on duty in the Nave.

Minute guns were fired in the Long Walk at Windsor while the Procession moved from Windsor Station to St. George's Chapel.

Full Dress was worn, with a Band of Crape on the left arm.
