ARTICLE I.—The said Boards of Guardians, Joint Committees, and Boards of Management may, with respect to the twenty-second day of June next, or with respect to such other day or days not exceeding two in number as may in any particular case be determined by the Board of Guardians, Joint Committee, or Board of Management, make such reasonable modifications in the regulations in force with regard to the discipline and diet of the poor persons in the said workhouses and other establishments and

incur such reasonable expense in the celebration therein of the occasion of the solemnity of His Majesty's Royal Coronation as the said Boards of Guardians, Joint Committees, and Boards of Management may deem suitable.

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

COUNTY OF SURREY.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 20TH APRIL 1911.)

(PRESCELLY PEMBROKESHIRE DISTRICT) MOUNTAIN (SHEEP-DIPPING) ORDER OF 1911.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1910, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Declaration of Sheep-Scab Compulsory Dipping Area.

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Dipping Area") is hereby declared to be a Compulsory Dipping Area for the purposes of the Sheep-Scab (Compulsory Dipping Areas) Order of 1906 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), and that Order shall apply to the Area accordingly, subject to the modifications contained in this Order.

Period for Compulsory Annual Dipping.

2. The dates between which all sheep in the Dipping Area are to be treated by the owner for sheep-scab by effective dipping under Article 2 of the principal Order as modified by this Order, are hereby fixed to be the twentieth day of August and the first day of October in every year.

Double Dipping on Separate Dates required for Compulsory Annual Dipping.

3. The annual dipping required by the principal Order as modified by this Order shall be a double dipping on separate dates specified in Notices under the principal Order with an interval of not less than ten days between the two dates.

Double Dipping on Separate Dates required for Movement Licences.

4. Article 5 (2) (i) of the principal Order shall in its application to the Dipping Area be read and have effect as if the certificate thereby required for a Movement Licence authorising movement of sheep out of the Dipping Area were a certificate showing that the sheep have been dipped twice on separate dates within twenty-eight days before the granting of the Licence with an interval of not less than ten days between the two dates, and in the manner prescribed by that Article.

Provisions as to Farms on Borders of Dipping Area.

5. Where any farm or holding is situate partly within and partly without the Dipping Area, the provisions of this Order shall, notwithstanding anything contained in any other Order of the Board, apply to the farm or holding and the sheep thereon as if the whole farm or holding were in the Area.

Area not subject to Sheep-Dipping (South Wales and Monmouth) Order of 1908.

6. The Sheep-Dipping (South Wales and Monmouth) Order of 1908 will not apply to the Area to which this Order applies so long as it continues to be a Compulsory Dipping Area.

Commencement.

7. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of May, nineteen hundred and eleven...

8. This Order may be cited as the PEM-

BROKESHIRE (PRESCELLY MOUNTAIN DISTRICT) (SHEEP-DIPPING) ORDER OF 1911.
