The following Address was presented to Their Majesties on Thursday, the 29th ultimo, on Their arrival at St. Paul's Churchyard to attend in the Cathedral a Service of Thanksgiving for Their Majesties' Coronation:—

CHRIST'S HOSPITAL.

To the King's Most Excellent Majesty.

May it please Your Majesty,

By the gracious permission of Your Majesty's royal predecessors it has been the privilege of the children of the Religious, Royal, and Ancient Foundation of Christ's Hospital, at some spot within the City of London, and usually within St. Paul's Churchyard, to offer, either in Latin or in the mother tongue, their humble greetings to the Sovereign on His first visit to the Lord Mayor and the Corporation.

Founded in 1553 as the result of a "fine supplication" addressed by Dr. Nicholas Ridley, Bishop of London, to King Edward VI of blessed memory, Christ's Hospital has ever enjoyed the favour and the interest of the Sovereigns of this realm, and Your Majesty, as a sailor, is well aware that in the reign of King Charles II there was established within our walls a Mathematical School for the special

training of boys to serve as officers in the Royal Navy.

But, Sire, in approaching Your Majesty by gracious permission to-day, we are for the first time addressing a Sovereign who has honoured our House before His Accession to the Throne by holding the ancient office of President of Christ's Hospital, Your Majesty having been installed as such and received your charge on May 10, 1904, in succession to Your Majesty's beloved cousin and our ever gratefully remembered friend his late Royal Highness the Duke of Cambridge. We recall how, soon after that of Cambridge. We recall how, soon after that installation, Your Majesty paid a visit to the Boys' School at Horsham and made yourself familiar with the many advantages of our new surroundings; how Your Majesty, with Her Majesty the Queen,—to whom also to-day we offer our most humble and hearty homage,made an equally thorough inspection of the Girls' School at Hertford; and, finally, how on July 23rd, 1906, Your Majesties inaugurated the new Chapel and other buildings at Hert-

Your Majesty has now been pleased to become our Patron, and, as we pray the Almighty to grant Your Majesty and Queen Mary a long, peaceful, and prosperous reign, we, the sons and daughters of this ancient House of piety and learning, rejoice to hope that Christ's Hospital will still prove the truth

of the Prophet's promise that "Kings shall be thy nursing fathers and their Queens thy nursing mothers."

We are greatly touched by these loyal greetings from the children of the pious and venerable Foundation of Christ's Hospital, which has been so closely connected by ties of loyalty and favour with Our Throne and Family.

The words of your Address recall the occasion on which My beloved Father, on behalf of Queen Victoria, laid the foundation stone of the new schools at Horsham, and expressed the hope that the tradition of the old School would be continued and would flourish in its new surroundings. As President of your Foundation I have watched over your interests, and I know that the name of Christ's Hospital never stood higher than to-day, or better sustained the honour of its Royal Founder and the long line of its Royal Benefactors.

You will remain an object of Our special care, and it is Our earnest prayer that the blessing of God may attend the future of the School.

We, Your Majesties' most dutiful and loyal subjects, the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Commons of the City of London in Common Council assembled, approach your presence with the liveliest sentiments of devoted loyalty and attachment to welcome Your Majesties to this your ancient and loyal City of London, and to express the sense we entertain of Your Majesties' most gracious condescension in visiting to-day the Guildhall, whose history, for more than five hundred years, is associated with so many historic scenes.

We would also offer to Your Majesties our loyal and dutiful congratulations on the solemn occasion of the Coronation of Your Majesties the King and Queen, so recently celebrated in Westminster Abbey in accordance with the ancient custom of these Realms, confirming and consecrating Your Majesties' accession to the Throne of your Ancestors.

We rejoice to have this opportunity of expressing to Your Majesties the deep and devoted patriotism and loyalty of the citizens of London, a devotion which they share with all Your Majesties' subjects, both in the United Kingdom and in your Dominions beyond the Seas.

In conclusion, we humbly pray that Your Majesties and all Your Royal House may be abundantly blessed by Almighty God, that His guidance and protection may be ever vouchsafed to you, and that Your Majesties may long be spared to reign over a happy, prosperous and contented people.

To Their Most Excellent Majesties the King and Queen.

The humble Address of the Treasurer and Masters of the Bench of the Honourable Society of Gray's Inn.

May it please Your Majesties,

The training of those who devote their lives to the study and practice of the law is a function of primary importance in a civilized State. But no system of jurisprudence, however modern, however elaborate, can secure justice unless it is conducted by men of simple integrity and honour. WHEREAS the Territories of Africa situate within the limits of this Order are under the protection of His Majesty the King and are known as the Uganda Protectorate.

And whereas by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means His Majesty has power and jurisdiction within the said territories.

And whereas by an Order of His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh in Council bearing date the 11th day of August, 1902, and entitled "The Uganda Order in Council, 1902," provision was made for the exercise of His Majesty's jurisdiction within the said Protectorate.

And whereas by Article 15 of the said Uganda Order in Council, 1902, it was ordered that there should be a Court of Record in the Protectorate with full jurisdiction, civil and criminal, over all persons and over all matters in the Protectorate, and that such civil and criminal jurisdiction should, so far as circum-

stances admitted, be exercised in conformity with the Civil Procedure, Criminal Procedure, and Penal Codes of India, except so far as might be otherwise provided by law.

And whereas before the commencement of the said Uganda Order in Council, 1902, the territories or some part or parts of the territories thereunder constituting the Uganda Protectorate were constituted a local jurisdiction under the Africa Order in Council, 1889.

And whereas by Article 13 of the said Africa Order in Council, 1889, it was ordered that, subject to the other provisions of that Order, all His Majesty's civil and criminal jurisdiction exercisable in any local jurisdiction constituted under that Order should, so far as circumstances admitted, be exercised upon the principles of and in conformity with the substance of the law for the time being in force in and for England and with the powers vested in and according to the course of procedure and practice observed by and before Courts of Justice and Justices of the Peace in England according to their respective jurisdictions and authorities.

And whereas by Article 110 of the said Africa Order in Council, 1889, it was ordered that where by virtue of any Imperial Act or of that Order or otherwise any provisions of any Imperial Acts or of any law or of any Orders in Council other than that Order were applicable within any local jurisdiction or district constituted under that Order, or any form, regulation, or procedure prescribed or established under any such Act or law were or was so applicable, the same should be deemed applicable so far only as the constitution and jurisdiction of the Courts acting under that Order and the local circumstances permitted and for the purpose of facilitating application might be construed or used with such alterations and adaptations as might be necessary, subject to the further provisions contained in the said Article.

And whereas by Article 28 of the said Uganda Order in Council, 1902, it was ordered that on the commencement of that Order the said Africa Order in Council, 1889, should cease to apply to Uganda, provided that, where other provision was not made by Ordinance, any law, practice or procedure established by or under the said Africa Order in Council, 1889, and not superseded by the said Uganda Order in Council, 1902, should remain in force until such other provision was made.

And whereas doubts have arisen respecting the extent to which the law of England is in force in the Uganda Protectorate under the above-recited provisions, and it is expedient to remove such doubts and to amend Article 15 of the said Uganda Order in Council, 1902, in such a manner as to supersede Articles 13 and 110 of the said Africa Order in Council, 1889:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers on that behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise, in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Uganda Order in Council, 1911.
- 2. Sub-Article (2) of Article 15 of the Uganda Order in Council, 1902, is hereby revoked without prejudice to anything lawfully

done thereunder, and in place of the said subarticle the following shall be substituted:—

"(2) Subject to the other provisions of this Order, such civil and criminal jurisdiction shall, so far as circumstances admit, be exercised in conformity with the Civil Procedure, Criminal Procedure, and Penal Codes of India in force at the date of the commencement of this Order, and subject thereto and so far as the same shall not extend or apply shall be exercised in conformity with the substance of the common law, the doctrines of equity, and the statutes of general application in force in England on the 11th day of August, 1902, and with the powers vested in and according to the procedure and practice observed by and before Courts of Justice and Justices of the Peace in England according to their respective jurisdictions and authorities at that date, save in so far as the said Civil Procedure, Criminal Procedure, and Penal Codes of India, and the said common law doctrines of equity and statutes of general application, and the said powers, procedure, and practice may at any time before the commencement of this Order have been, or hereafter may be, modified, amended, or replaced by other provision in lieu thereof, by or under the authority of any Order of His Majesty in Council, or by any Ordinance or Ordinances passed in and for the Protectorate. Provided always that the said common law doctrines of equity and statutes of general application shall be in force in the Protectorate so far only as the circumstances of the Protectorate and its ininhabitants, and the limits of His Majesty's jurisdiction permit and subject to such qualifications as local circumstances render necessary.

3. This Order shall be published in the Uganda Government Gazette, and shall thereupon commence and come into operation.

And the Right Honourable Lewis Harcourt, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein.

And whereas before the commencement of the said East Africa Order in Council, 1902, it was (amongst other things) provided by Article 11 of the East Africa Order in Council, 1897, that, subject to the other provisions of that Order, so far as the enactments, procedure, and practice of India therein specified were inapplicable, Her Majesty Queen Victoria's criminal and civil jurisdiction in the Protectorate should be exercised under and in accordance with the common and statute law of England in force at the commencement of that Order:

And whereas the said Order commenced and had effect on the 12th day of August, 1897:

And whereas by Article 28 of the said East Africa Order in Council, 1902, it was ordered that on the commencement of that Order the said East Africa Order in Council, 1897, should be repealed, provided that, where other provision was not made by Ordinance, any law, practice, or procedure established by or under the said repealed Order should remain in force until such other provision was made:

And whereas doubts have arisen respecting the extent to which the law of England is in force in the East Africa Protectorate under the above-recited provisions, and it is expedient to remove such doubts and to amend Article 15 of the said East Africa Order in Council, 1902:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers on that behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise, in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the East Africa Order in Council, 1911.
- 2. Sub-Article (2) of Article 15 of the East Africa Order in Council, 1902, is hereby revoked without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder and in place of the said Sub-Article the following shall be substituted:—
 - "(2) Subject to the other provisions of this Order, such civil and criminal jurisdiction shall, so far as circumstances admit, be exercised in conformity with the Civil Procedure, Criminal Procedure and Penal Codes of India and the other Indian Acts which are in force in East Africa at the date of the commencement of this Order and subject thereto and so far as the same shall not extend or apply shall be exercised in con-

formity with the substance of the common law the doctrines of equity and the statutes of general application in force in England on the 12th day of August, 1897, and with the powers vested in and according to the procedure and practice observed by and before Courts of Justice and Justices of the Peace in England according to their respective jurisdictions and authorities at that date, save in so far as the said Civil Procedure, Criminal Procedure, and Penal Codes of India and the other Indian Acts in force as aforesaid and the said common law doctrines of equity and statutes of general application and the said powers procedure and practice may at any time before the commencement of this Order have been, or hereafter may be, modified, amended or replaced by other provision in lieu thereof by or under the authority of any Order of His Majesty in Council, or by any Ordinance or Ordinances passed in and for the Protectorate. Provided always that the said common law doctrines of equity and statutes of general application shall be in force in the Protectorate so far only as the circumstances of the Protectorate and its inhabitants and the limits of His Majesty's jurisdiction permit, and subject to such qualifications as local circumstances render necessary."

3. This Order shall be published in the Official Gazette of the East Africa Protectorate, and shall thereupon commence and come into operation.

And the Right Honourable Lewis Harcourt, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein.
