MORLEY CORPORATION LIGHT RAILWAYS ORDER.

The Light Railway Commissioners have submitted to the Board of Trade for confirmation, under the above-mentioned Act, an Order made by them for the construction of Light Railways in the borough and parish of Morley, and amending the Morley and District Light Railways Order, 1901.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated the 24th June, from His Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Brussels,

transmitting the following copy of a Sanitary Decree as published in the "Moniteur Belge" of the 23rd June, placing restrictions on the importation of manure, etc., into Belgium from Holland, Germany, France, and the Grand Duchy of Luxemburg.

Stomatite aphteuse.—Importation de fumier, etc.

Le Ministre de l'agriculture et des travaux publics,

Vu la loi du 30 décembre 1882 sur la police sanitaire des animaux domestiques;

Vu l'article 46 de l'arrêté royal du 20 septembre 1883, modifié par l'article 1er de l'arrêté royal du 27 mai 1899;

Attendu que la stomatite aphteuse a été constatée en Hollande, en Allemagne, dans le grand-duché de Luxemburg et en France,

Arrête :

Art. 1er. L'importation et le transit par les frontières de terre et de mer, de fumier, de foin, de paille, de boues, ainsi que de peaux, laines, poils, os, ongles, cornes, à l'état frais, de provenance hollandaise, allemande, grand-ducale et française sont subordonnés à la production d'un certificat délivré par le bourgmestre de la localité de provenance attestant que, pendant les vingt et un derniers jours, la stomatite aphteuse n'a pas été constatée dans la ferme d'où sortent ces produits ni dans un rayon de 100 mètres de cette ferme.

Le lait des dites provenances peut être admis à l'importation et au transit à la condition d'être accompagné d'un certificat de l'autorité locale compétente, attestant qu'il sort d'une étable où ne règne pas la stomatite aphteuse ou qu'il a été chauffé à une température suffisante pour détruire tout germe de maladie.

Art. 2. Le transit direct des produits cités à l'article 1er, sans déchargement par la voie ferrée, pourra s'effectuer en wagons plombés, sans production de certificat.

Art. 3. Le présent arrêté sera exécutoire le lendemain de sa publication au *Moniteur*.
